



Statistically, this is counted as one incident. Monthly/ annual responses are determined by adding # of incidents plus number of dual paramedic responses.


INCIDENTS HISTORICAL (CY22 numbers are extrapolated from YTD data)




INCIDENTS BY MUNICIPALITY-YTD 2022

Average Response Time: (Time from responding to arrival on scene): **8.5 minutes**


Engagement Time: (responding until patient contact) **11.6 minutes**

SCCEMS TO CO-APPLY WITH PENN TOWNSHIP FOR COUNTY ARP FUNDING

At last week's SCCEMS Board of Directors meeting, the SCCEMS Board voted to support and become a co-applicant with a Penn Township grant request to the **County of Chester for American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds** towards the construction of a new station for SCCEMS and MEDIC 94. The closing of the hospital has been significant on SCCEMS. We only have a commitment from Tower Health to stay in the building through 30 June. If the hospital is purchased, we do not know if we will be able to remain or if we do, what rent will be charged and how much space we would be allowed to retain. In addition, we have outgrown our space at the hospital. Essential space such as locker rooms, bathrooms and sleeping faculties do not exist in our current space.

Given these needs, a once in a lifetime opportunity has presented itself. Penn Township owns a piece of property at the intersection of Jenner's Pond Road and Old Baltimore Pike that was designated as a future home for our station. The vision would be to raise the funding for the construction of a township owned building on the township property with a long-term lease with SCCEMS. The facility would serve as our administrative headquarters as well as MEDIC 94-1 station. The location is in the center of our district with good access to RT 896 and Rt 1 and Old Baltimore Pike. The opportunity is to obtain ARP grant funding for the project from **Chester County's ARP funds**. Penn Township would make the grant application with SCCEMS-MEDIC 94 being the co-applicant.

Here is our ask of our municipal partners. As part of the grant request, there is the ability to provide letters of support of the grant. For municipalities and boroughs, that would come in the form of a resolution. The resolution supports the joint application and the need for the facility. Resolutions from each of the 17 municipalities that we serve we feel would increase the likelihood of the grant. We also will be requesting letters of support from local organizations, schools, corporations and businesses. After all, we are a regional advanced life support service and this new facility will support our services to the entire community for years to come.

The timetable that the County has established for this grant is very short. We will need to submit the grant for the **County of Chester ARP Funds** no later than 12 May. In the coming weeks, I will be available to attend your Board of Supervisors meetings if needed to answer questions about the request as well as the financial and operational challenges we have faced as a result of the hospitals closing. Approved resolutions should be sent to Karen Versuk (kversuk@penntownship.us) at Penn Township NLT 12 May to be included in our application.
