



INCIDENTS HISTORICAL (CY22 numbers are extrapolated from YTD data)



Statistically, this is counted as one incident. Monthly/ annual responses are determined by adding # of incidents plus number of dual paramedic responses.


INCIDENTS BY MUNICIPALITY-YTD 2022




INCIDENTS BY DISPATCH NATURE- YTD 2022




INCIDENT OUTCOME-YTD 2022

OPERATIONAL TIMES-JUNE 2022

Average Mobilization Time (Time call is received until responding): **1.4 minutes**Average Response Time: (Time from responding to arrival on scene): **8.6 minutes**

Engagement Time: (responding until patient contact) 11.5 minutes

Average Scene Time: (Time from arrival on scene until depart scene): **15 minutes**Average Total Call Time: (Average from dispatch to available-all calls): **74.9 minutes**

Average Call Time when patient transported: 111.2 minutes

CORPORATE NEWS

- The SCCEMS Board of Directors will hold its next meeting 21 August. That meeting will include a presentation by Christiana Care on their plans for the former Jennersville Hospital
- SCCEMS along with other EMS agencies held a meeting moderated by the Chester County EMS Council
 regarding the loss of advanced life support services in the Coatesville Rt 30 corridor with the announcement by
 Tower Health that they are moving all MEDIC 93 units to the Elverson area. That decision will have an impact on
 the surrounding services as there will be increased use of surrounding ALS units or existing basic life support
 services upgrading to the ALS level. SCCEMS has a Board subcommittee looking at the impact on existing
 MEDIC 94 services.

FUTURE CHRISTIANA CARE-WEST GROVE

Southern Chester County EMS-MEDIC 94 continues to communicate with Christiana Care as they develop and announce their plans for the former Jennersville Hospital. The sale of the hospital closed the week of 7/4. We have met multiple times with representatives of Christian Care. They are very interested in learning how the hospital can best meet the needs of the community.

At this time, we have a verbal agreement that we can remain at our hospital facilities. The timeframe and specific lease agreement will be worked out in the future.

We fully expect a strong partnership between Christiana Care and SCCEMS as well as the entire southern Chester County EMS community.

We look forward to the announcement of their plans and timetable for the hospital Our Board will be receiving a briefing from representatives of Christiana Care at our August meeting.

CHESTER COUNTY ARP GRANT REQUEST

We are awaiting the review and decision by Chester County regarding the Penn Township Grant request to fund a new building for MEDIC 94. That decision is expected in mid-August.

OPERATIONS NEWS

180 days in, we have been able to summarize the operational impact of the hospital's closing.

16% increase in call volume

15% of dispatches handled by 3rd staffed unit staffing

10% increase in patients transported

20% increase in average call time

32% increase call time/ transport

39% increase vehicle mileage

63 vs 76 minutes

85 vs 112 minutes

NEW MEDIC 94 UNIT IN SERVICE

SCCEMS-MEDIC 94 is placing into service a 2022 Ford Explorer Paramedic Squad unit. The Pennsylvania Department of Health licensed unit was purchased under state contract from New Holland Ford and upfitted by 10-8 Upfitters in New Holland. Graphics are by Fitch Graphics.



This unit will be based at our Jennersville station running as MEDIC 941 and should serve the community for the next 8 years. It replaces a 2014 paramedic squad with over 150,000 miles. Special thanks to Paramedic John Ryan for his graphics design and vehicle specs.

Total cost of the vehicle was \$60,000.
