DHS CISA Issues a 'Shields Up' Advisory

Due to increasing geopolitical tensions, the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) issued a "Shields Up" advisory. The full advisory can be found at http://www.cisa.gov/shields-up.

The Defense Industrial Base (DIB) is one of 16 official United States critical infrastructure sectors. Like the other critical infrastructure sectors' leaders, we're reaching out to encourage you to do three things:

1. **Heed the advisory.** CISA's guidance provides tips on reducing the likelihood of a damaging cyber intrusion, detecting potential intrusions, prepping organizations to respond to intrusions, and maximizing resilience for organizations to a destructive cyber incident. Following CISA's guidance can harden infrastructures potentially targeted by adversaries

and significantly mitigate the impact of operations targeting the DIB.

- 2. **Report Cyber Incidents.** DFARS 252.204-7012 specifies a contractor's requirement to rapidly report cyber incidents impacting Covered Defense Information (CDI) and/or the ability to perform operationally critical support within 72 hours of discovery to DCISE (https://dibnet.dod.mil).
- 3. **Get Assistance and Partner.** These three organizations can assist you:
