NCMA JAX Membership - Not Just for Locals

This month's honoree is Ross Thomas, who has been an NCMA member since 2018. He is Chief Operating Officer of ANAMAR Environmental Consulting and lives in Gainesville, FL. He spent ten years as a Naval Aviator flying maritime strike helicopters (MH-60R) with duty stations in Hawaii and Jacksonville before leaving active duty in 2017. He continues to fly with a Navy Reserve squadron based out of NAS Jacksonville, but will relocate to the Pacific Northwest later in the year with his wife and daughter. As he was unable to find an active NCMA chapter near his new home, he will keep his JAX Chapter membership. He is currently pursuing a Master's degree in Environmental Science.

Ross is a strong supporter of NCMA who values the excellent network of contracting professionals that provided resources and guidance as he developed his personal skillset and expertise in the field. He credits NCMA as a great resource for training and government perspectives not readily available to industry professionals (and vice versa). He serves as liaison between the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA) and NCMA, which entails cross-promotion of events and encouragement of joint activities between local NCMA, NDIA, and SAME chapters such as the February 2020 two-day seminar.

Ross offers the following career and professional advice to newer employees: Pursue formal training in contract management and be proactive in understanding contract vehicle specifics. This career field is ripe for innovation in how contracts are solicited, managed, and awarded, and is constantly evolving; organizations that under-resource procurement and contract management do so at their own peril. Individuals should look for ways to innovate and champion improvements within their own organization and professional
