Workshop Values

Purpose

This event is an opportunity for TIP Delegates to network, collaborate, learn, and share resources and research about Pollinator Relatives in a culturally-appropriate, safe space.

Through the integration of Indigenous and Western knowledges, TIP Delegates will develop an action plan to support their own Pollinator Relatives upon return to their community.



Pollinator Relatives

Pollinator Relatives include bees, birds, bats, butterflies, beetles, other insects, and small mammals - all vital species TIP share kinship with since time immemorial. This event honors and supports these unique socio-cultural and ecological relationships.

TIP Delegates

This event supports, benefits, and encourages the important Pollinator conservation work being done by TIP. Applicants will be admitted in small group Delegations of 2-4 individuals per TIP entity, building a cohort of trust and fostering growth of TIP capacity.


