

Consolidated Post Report (CPR) shows the many ways Legionnaires are making a difference in the lives of veterans, families, communities, and beyond. Here is the flow on how the "numbers" are gathered and reported: Legion Posts send reports to their respective Legion Department (States, territories and overseas Departments), who consolidate the information and submit a report to National Legion Headquarters. They then consolidate all received reports into one big report and submit their findings to Congress to justify what we do is vital in servicing our/their veterans. For the **2021-2022** schedule, National Legion office reported the overall numbers were conservative due to 35% of Legion Posts did not file reports and some Legion Posts underestimated their numbers. Congress then transcribes the numbers into "if we were provided payment/reimbursement" what our value/net worth would look like. Although The American Legion receives no money or grants from the federal government, the numbers provide a tool in Legislative consideration and decision making for American Legion programs to **pick up and fill the void** left by government agencies. By **providing us** with your volunteer hours, miles driven, money (item purchase cost) donated, assistance provided, veteran events/programs attended, cards/letters sent, and veterans visited, our numbers will have a better representation of what we voluntarily do. Individual reports can be emailed, mailed, or call and leave a message. If coming to Post 74 and we are closed put it in an envelope, drop it in our **mailbox 3025**. Our delivery person doesn't take mail out, only delivers. Your personal information, if provided, will not be included in the reports, we just need the numbers/data. For more information of past reports go to https://www.legion.org/bythenumbers. Please respond by 15 May as our CPR is due to Department by 18 May.
