

VA Benefit for Surviving Spouses that Many Are Missing Out On.

A Survivor's Pension also referred to as Widows Pension, is a monthly monetary benefit paid to the low-income spouses of a deceased veteran. A veteran's unmarried dependent children may also be eligible for this benefit.

The spouse must have been married to the veteran for at least a year, and never remarried (some exceptions). There are also various income and net worth criteria established by Congress.

The **new net worth cap set by the VA for 2022 is \$138,489.** The house and car are exempt.

The **2022 maximum monthly** pension with Aid and Attendance for a **veteran's widow is \$1,310 per month** (\$15,816 per year). Once the benefit is approved it will be paid on a monthly basis just like Social Security.



Purple Up! For Military Kids Day

Defense Secretary, Caspar Weinberger, was responsible for establishing April as the month of **The Military Child in 1986**, Department of Defense has honored his initiative ever since.

Wearing **PURPLE** shows support/thanks to military children for their strength and sacrifices. Combine all colors of the military branches; Air Force **blue**, Army **green**, Navy **blue**, Marine **red**, and Coast Guard **blue**, blends as a single color, **PURPLE**.

The U.S. Department of Defense Education Activity, operates **166 schools** for military children worldwide, to "plan special events to honor military children and have administrators/principals incorporate the themes of this month into their everyday duties and responsibilities" according to the DoDEA official site.

- Department of Defense: **700 military child development** program facilities around the world, running approximately **155,000 child-care spaces**, with another **3,000 Family Child Care homes**.
- Military child development centers welcome around 200,000 children daily. There are 300 youth/ teen centers worldwide serving more than 645,000 youth through a variety of educational and recreational programs.
- Approximately **2 million** military children have experienced a **parental deployment since 9/11**.
- Nearly 80% children of active duty members attend public schools throughout the United States.
- There are **nearly two million "total-force dependent children**"; over 900,000 Army dependents, 400,000 Air Force dependents, 300,000 Navy and approximately 118,000 Marine dependents.
- The average military family moves three times more often than their civilian counterpart.

Let's not forget to honor these children during the month of April! Mike James, Chaplin
