Navajo Code Talkers Day observed on Sunday, Aug. 14, 2022

This holiday honors the contributions of indigenous people who contributed to the **United States war effort during World War II**. It also recognizes the evolution of U.S. code related to indigenous languages and the participation of First Nations tribe members in U.S. military efforts from many conflicts. The story of the **Navajo Code Talkers** is very complex. The name of the holiday refers not to the Navajo tribe itself but is a broader term which refers to the "Navajo code" used to fool Axis powers

including the Nazis and Japanese Imperial forces.

The Navajo code depended on the complexity of the Navajo language as well as further encoding the messages. These combined factors rendered it impossible to break as a code, and some sources report it is one of the few, possibly the only "code" used by the U.S. military, that was never broken during the conflicts when it was used. Why wasn't the code ever broken? The Navajo language has no definite rules and a tone that is guttural. According to Carl Gorman, one of the 29 original Navajo code talkers, "You had to base it solely on the sounds you were hearing".

Philip Johnston, a son of missionaries who grew up on the Navajo Nation, came up with the idea for the Navajo Code Talker program after reading a news article about Native American soldiers delivering messages during Army training exercises in their native language. The US Army was the first branch of the military that began recruiting code talkers from places like Oklahoma in 1940. Recruiting for the US Marines and Navy soon followed. The first class of 29 Navajo code talkers graduated were US Marine recruits who completed their training in 1942.

President Ronald Reagan established Navajo Code Talkers Day in 1982, honoring all the tribes associated with the war effort including: Cherokee, Choctaw, Comanche, Hopi, and Navajo.

On December 21, 2000, President Bill Clinton signed Public Law 106-554, 114 Statute 2763, which awarded the Congressional Gold Medal to the original 29 World War II Navajo Code Talkers and Silver Medals to each person who qualified as a Navajo code talker (approximately 300 people). In July 2001, President George W. Bush honored the code talkers by presenting the medals to four out of the five surviving original code talkers at a ceremony held in the Capitol Rotunda in Washington, DC. Gold medals were also presented to the families of the deceased 24 original code talkers.
