<u>Chaplain's Corner:</u> I've struggled, prayerfully, in trying to write this article for the December issue. For me personally, December is dominated by our Christmas celebration. Christmas, in the American tradition, commemorates the birth of Jesus. For the Christians among us, this is a time of spiritual reflection on the foundations of our faith. Christmas brings out our Christian spirit of giving and renews our relationships with our friends, loved ones, and our God.

I am mindful, though, that not everyone in our lives, in our Post, in the American Legion and in our Nation is a Christian. The American Legion as an organization is nondenominational, nonsectarian, and we embrace all religions, faiths and denominations. The Post Chaplain is charged to "...help Legionaries and others grow in their relationships with God, and to minister to people wherever there is a need."

As your Post Chaplain, I have to confess that I don't feel up to the task. I have comparatively little knowledge of faith traditions outside of the ones I have lived in (born Catholic, married Lutheran, most recently Methodist). So, I struggle to write something for the December newsletter that reaches out to everyone who reads it, across all faith traditions.

Perhaps there is hope for this issue of the Chaplain's Corner. As I said, I don't feel up to the task of being the Post Chaplain. There is so much that I don't know about being a Post Chaplain. Also, over the last months I've met some previous Post 74 Chaplains. I am amazed at their abilities and humbled by the size of the shoes to be filled. I suspect that we all have felt that same way, not up to the task.

From our time in the military, we were thrust into challenges that we were unprepared for, but we were committed and we stepped up. For me, after the military, in civilian life, I especially remember when becoming a new parent, I faced challenges that I was ridiculously unprepared for. Definitely, not up to the task, or so I thought. I am sure that we have all had that feeling. The feeling of not being up to the important task ahead, so that is something that I think we all share, across all faiths.

So, somehow, in our times when we felt not up to the task, it was our commitment to ourselves, our commitment to those things bigger than ourselves, and our faith in God that carried us through. Our sense of commitment and our faith in God are gifts that we all share.
