### **Shoveling Snow Safely**

Did you know that blizzards, and even minor snowstorms, come with a **risk of death** by shoveling? It's true! Nationwide, snow shoveling is responsible for thousands of injuries and as many as **100 death each year**. So, why do people die shoveling snow? Shoveling snow seems like just another simple household chore, or so we thought.

The American Heart Association states that while most people won't have a problem, shoveling snow can put some people at risk of heart attack. Sudden exertion, like moving hundreds of pounds of snow after being sedentary for several months, can put a big strain on the heart. Pushing a heavy snow blower also can cause injury. And there's the cold temperatures. Cold weather can increase heart rate and blood pressure. It can make blood clot more easily and constrict arteries, which decreases blood supply. This is true even in the healthiest people. Individuals over the age of 40 or who are relatively inactive should be particularly careful.

National Safety Council recommends the following tips to shovel safely:

Do not shovel after eating or while smoking

Take it slow and stretch out before you begin

Shovel only fresh, powdery snow; it's lighter

Push the snow rather than lifting it

• If you do lift it, use a small shovel, or only partially fill the shovel

Lift with your legs, not your back

• Do not work to the point of exhaustion

Know the signs of a heart attack, and stop immediately and call 911 if you're experiencing any of them, every minute counts Don't pick up that shovel without a doctor's permission if you have a history of heart disease. A clear driveway is not worth your life.

### **HELP WANTED & NEEDED**

One of the goals Commander Bill Napier would like to establish is Legion members and our affiliates volunteering in maintaining the Post Home and Activities. Some things have to be contracted, i.e. electrical, sewer, and IT security. No one currently working at the Post is on our payroll, we are all volunteering our time and skills. Listed below are things we currently need help with:

- Basic building maintenance—light bulbs, sweep of porches, clean hand rails, windows, shovel the walkways and deck when it snows.
- 2. Help with our food service in the kitchen– monthly dinner meals, taking out the trash after meetings ended.
- 3. Cleaning the post home monthly/twice a month– bathrooms, sweep/mop/ toilets/sinks, vacuum rugs, dust sweep upstairs floor, sanitize tables and chairs.
- 4. Assist the Ceremonial Guard, flag folding/rifle squad, for local veteran funerals.
- 5. BINGO- Manager, needs to be present for all games, callers, at least 2 in order to have a back up. This is a paid position.

### Proposed changes in By Laws (1st reading)

1. Currently read: Section 6 – Duties of Finance officer, last sentence: "The Post will have an external audit of the financial records each year." Recommend this sentence be removed.

**Reason:** superseded by the American Legion Department of Virginia Constitution.

2. Judge Advocate: Currently reads: Last sentence: "The judge advocate commonly has the duty, with other, of auditing post financial accounts. This is done annually, usually before the election of officers, or more frequently at their discretion."

Recommend this sentence be removed.

Reason: superseded by the American Legion Department of Virginia Constitution.

Recommend the following new paragraph be added from the Department of Virginia Constitution:

Post Audit

"The post commander shall appoint a 3 person audit team comprised of general members of the post to conduct an annual post finance audit to be completed before June 30th of each year and before new officers take office."

"A report of the audit will be made at the general membership meeting and recorded in the meeting minutes."

A letter went out to all members who were in good standing but did not pay their 2021 membership dues. 

New law makes free national parks access for veterans permanent. In 2020, the National Parks Service granted veterans and Gold Star Families free access to parks and sites across the country. Over the holidays, the policy became law with the signing of the NDAA, which included the Alexander Lofgren Veterans in Parks (VIP) Act. Planning a national park visit? Another tip: Check the website for your state parks service—some offer free or reduced access for veterans. How to access this benefit: Free Entrance to National Parks for **Veterans and Gold Star Families (U.S. National Park Service) (nps.gov)**
