<u>Chaplain's Corner:</u> We, at the Post are well-pleased and privileged to be a part of you and your family "ringing in the New Year." We are blessed to have a community here at Post 74, in the broader American Legion and with veterans and current service members all across the world.

**A New Year is filled with hope!** On New Year's Eve, at 11:59 PM, it is estimated that **over one million people** will be watching the ball drop in New York City's Times Square, live and in person. Over 1 billion people all across the world will be watching on some sort of broadcast. That is a moment of incredible connection. All of us seeing the same thing, as we bid farewell to the year 2022. With **hope in our hearts** and a healthy dose of **good intentions, we begin the year 2023**. I love the hopefulness of that moment, hope for myself, for my family and friends, and for the world around us.

On Monday, **16 January 2023, we celebrate the birth and life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.,** the Honorable American Civil Rights leader. Another milepost of hopefulness. Dr. King led efforts that moved us toward equal opportunity and treatment for all Americans. I was nine years old when Dr. King's life was cut short in 1968. From what I read about him and the recorded speeches I heard, he seemed to me to be a hopeful man. Hopeful for us to be our better selves and for us to become a better nation. There will always be more to do, but hope for a better future has us moving in the right direction.

As veterans, we can be proud of our participation in the move to equal opportunity and treatment for all Americans. **On 26 July 1948, President Harry Truman issued an Executive Order 9981** stated that "there shall be equality of treatment and opportunity for all persons in the Armed Forces without regard to race, color, religion, or national origin." The Executive Order was issued nearly two decades before the time we refer to as the Civil Rights Movement. A quick look back shows that the spirit of the Executive Order was not immediately adopted in the military, but it was another hopeful step forward, and it set us in motion to where we are today.

I'll end with this quotation *"I say to you today, my friends, that in spite of the difficulties and frustrations of the moment, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream. I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident; that all men are created equal."*
