### **<u>Chaplain's Corner</u>** 14 June 2023, we celebrate Flag Day and United States Army's Birthday!

**Flag Day** has been celebrated in one way or another since the late 1800's. On **3 August 1949**, Congress approved the bill for **Flag Day to be a National Holiday** and signed into law by **President Harry Truman**. American Legion Post 74, as tradition demonstrates, will be conducting a Flag Retirement ceremony on 14 June at 5:00 PM, in the grassy area, east side of the Post Home. We have around **100 flags** to retire and with help of air blower the process is done in a shortened amount of time. This is the same evening as our **monthly dinner and general membership meeting**. So, come early and help us honorably retire American Flags that have served us well but can serve no more. Then stay for dinner, I hear we are having **steak!** 

The **U.S. Army is the longest standing** of the now five branches of our military. On **14 June 1775**, Congress "<u>Resolved, that six companies of expert riflemen, be immediately raised in Pennsylvania, two in Maryland, and two in Virginia... [and] as soon as completed, shall march and join the army near Boston, to be there employed as light infantry, under the command of the chief Officer in that army." This was the official start of the U.S. Army.</u>
