Proposed changes in By Laws (1st reading)

1. Currently read: Section 6 – Duties of Finance officer, last sentence: "The Post will have an external audit of the financial records each year."

Recommend this sentence be removed.

Reason: superseded by the American Legion Department of Virginia Constitution.

2. Judge Advocate: Currently reads: Last sentence: "The judge advocate commonly has the duty, with other, of auditing post financial accounts. This is done annually, usually before the election of officers, or more frequently at their discretion."

Recommend this sentence be removed.

Reason: superseded by the American Legion Department of Virginia Constitution.

Recommend the following new paragraph be added from the Department of Virginia Constitution:

Post Audit

"The post commander shall appoint a 3 person audit team comprised of general members of the post to conduct an annual post finance audit to be completed before June 30th of each year and before new officers take office."

"A report of the audit will be made at the general membership meeting and recorded in the meeting minutes."



It is time to recognize, honor and celebrate the accomplishments, contributions, and sacrifices, of women in the United States Military.

From the Revolutionary War to present day conflicts, women have proudly served in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, and now the Airspace Command, as doctors, pilots, engineers, linguists, and other specialties.

Women in the WASP, WAC, Coast Guard Women's Reserve (or SPARs), Marine Corps Women's Reserve and the Navy's WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service), embodied the "We Can Do It" attitude. Over 1,000 women flew aircraft for the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP).

President Truman's determination to make changes within the military led to the **Women's Armed Services Integration Act** signed into law **12 June 1948**. By recognizing women as full members of the armed forces, they could finally claim the same benefits as their male counterparts and allowing women to make a career in the Armed Forces.

World War I- about 35,000 women officially served as nurses and support staff.

World War II- 140,000 women served in the U.S. Army and the Women's Army Corps (WAC) performing critical jobs; military intelligence, cryptography, and parachute rigging.

Vietnam War- over 7,000 American military women served.

1976- women integrated into America's service academies – the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y., the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD., and the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO.

Persian Gulf War in 1991- over 41,000 women deployed to combat zones.

Post-9/11, including Operation Enduring Freedom/Operation Iraqi Freedom- over 700,000 women served.

Women not only shape our armed services but the country as well. They continue to use the skills and experiences from their military service to make achievements in their careers, contributions to their communities, and to become public service leaders.
