





Chaplain's Corner: On 16 March 1987, President Ronald Reagan signed a proclamation dedicating March as Women's History Month. "From earliest times, women have helped shape our Nation. Historians today stress all that women have meant to our national life, but the rest of us too should remember, with pride and gratitude, the achievements of women throughout American history...Women have served our Nation with valor and distinction during wartime, nursing the wounded, piloting airplanes, performing vital jobs in defense plants. Women have forged a place for themselves in public life, serving on the Supreme Court, in the Congress, and in Cabinet posts; becoming Ambassadors; and holding Federal Executive posts that affect the lives of every citizen..."

Women played key **support roles in early U.S. warfare**, including the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. Not until **17 March 1917**, right before the start of World War I, they could **enlist**, **legally**. During World War I, about **35,000 women** officially served, in the **Army and the Navy**, primarily as nurses and support staff. World War II saw **140,000 women** serving in the **Army and the Women's Army Corps** (WAC) performing critical jobs such as military intelligence, cryptography and parachute rigging.

President Harry S. Truman signed the Women's Armed Services Integration Act on 12 June 1948. For the first time, women were recognized as full members of the Armed Forces. This meant they could finally claim the same benefits as their male counterparts, and for women to make a career in the Army, Navy, Air Force and Marines.

In **1976**, women **integrated into America's service academies** – the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, NY, the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, and the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO.

Women not only shape our armed services but the country as well. They continue to use the skills and experiences from their military service to make achievements in their careers, contributions to their communities, and to become public service leaders.

Last month, over **113 million people** around the world watched **Super Bowl LVII**. In honoring **50 years of women in Naval Aviation**, an **all-female team** flew in formation **over the stadium**; a F-35C Lightning II, two FA -18F Super Hornets and an EA-18G Growler. Thank you to all our Military Women for a Job Well Done!
