Preparing for the Transition to 10-Digit Dialing to Enable 988 to Reach the Suicide Prevention Lifeline

On July 16, 2020, the FCC adopted rules to establish 988 as the new, nationwide, 3-digit phone number for Americans in crisis to connect with suicide prevention and mental health crisis **counselors.** The rules require phone service providers to direct all 988 calls to the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline by July 16, 2022.

During the transition to 988, Americans who need help should continue to contact the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline by calling 1-800-273-8255 (1-800-273-TALK) and through online chats. Veterans and Service members may reach the Veterans Crisis Line by pressing 1 after dialing, chatting online at www.veteranscrisisline.net, or texting 838255 For more online information:

Good weather has arrived, hopefully many opportunities to enjoy memorable rides. <u>Before you start logging in miles please consider, all that apply to your ride, the following</u> <u>maintenance protocols, in addition to manufactures maintenance recommendation: Inspect, change</u> <u>and/or replace brake, rotors, gas, oil, differential, battery, fuel/transmission fluids and fuel lines, air/</u> <u>gas filter, battery terminals/case, cables, all lights in addition to headlight and controls. Take into</u> <u>account things that cause vibration; tires, depth of tread, pressure, potential bent rim.</u> Keep in mind, cages do not always see or are not looking for you on a motorcycle. Remember, a well-maintained ride helps to ensure your safe driving/handling. <u>Never drive beyond your comfort level.</u> Thank you for your time and support.


