While serving with the Military some members may have been exposed to a variety of airborne hazards to include: smoke and fumes from open burn pits, sand, dust, and particulate matter; general air pollution in certain countries; fuel, aircraft exhaust, and other mechanical fumes; smoke from burning oil well fires. You may have or currently are experiencing health effects related to these potential exposures. Waste products commonly disposed of in open burn pits include: chemicals, paint, medical and human waste, metal aluminum cans, munitions' and unexploded ordnance, petroleum and lubricant products, plastic, rubber, wood and food waste. Exposure to the smoke created by these materials may cause irritation and burning of the eyes or throat, coughing, breathing difficulties, skin itching or rashes. Many of these conditions are temporary and resolve on their own when the exposure ends. The closer you were to the burn pit and exposure time periods may have put you at greater risk for long term health conditions. Veterans who may be eligible may consider registering with (AHOBRP) Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry.







November is busy and significant month for the American Legion family. The **Marine Corps birthday**, **Veterans Day** and of course, **Thanksgiving**.

On November 10, 1775, the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution stating that "two Battalions of Marines be raised" for service as landing forces with the fleet. This resolution established the Continental Marines and thus marked the birth date of the United States Marine Corps. If you happen upon a Marine on 10 November 2022, say "Happy Birthday, Marine!"

Veterans Day for Legionnaires is a day of special significance. Each of us is a Veteran, and we are part of an **organization that supports Veterans**. Living in and around Charlottesville, we are all familiar with local historical figures, but we might not be so aware that those founding fathers were Veterans as well. **George Washington** was a **General and Commander-in-Chief** for the U.S. Continental Army. **Thomas Jefferson** and **James Madison** were both **Colonels** in the Virginia Militia and **James Monroe** was a **Major** in the Continental Army. From our earliest days as a nation, we were built on the efforts of Veterans and their service to a cause beyond themselves. From the beginning of the republic to present day, service to a cause beyond oneself is a cornerstone of the American military experience, and that carries forward into our lives as Veterans.

Ah, **Thanksgiving!** The word thanksgiving, with the **lower case "t"**, means the act of expressing or feeling thankfulness. In other words, it is the act of giving thanks for what we are grateful for. The **Thanksgiving Day holiday** is a time for us to **express our gratitude for all the blessings we have**, as Americans, as Veterans and as members of our families and communities. Life comes at us, that's for sure, and there will always be struggles in front of us, but we have more blessings than we can count. **For that, we can all be thankful.**

As you celebrate Thanksgiving, **if it calls to you, include in your prayers of gratitude all the military men and women who are currently serving in our Armed Forces, both at home and abroad.** Without their service, our lives would be very different.
