I would like to thank all who helped and attended our **9-11 Patriot Day Memorial** here at the Post Home. Much coordination and many hands went into the making of this event. Some recommendations for improvement were brought to our attention during an after-action review of which we will take under advisement for future events.

I would like thank Robin Riddle as the Charlottesville/Central Virginia, Project Linus Chapter Coordinator, for her efforts in making Project Linus a much sought-after event where volunteers assist nonprofits through **Laurence E. Richardson Day of Caring**, sponsored by the United Way of Greater Charlottesville. Throughout the year, "blanketeers" sew, crotchet and knit blankets or blanket toppers. On a designated day in September, volunteers come and help with piecing, sewing, labeling, tack-stitch and make no-sew fleece blankets. They were able to complete 253 blankets, ready for washing and distribution.

A thank you also goes out to our food committee as they continue to plan, coordinate, and prepare a variety of meals for the monthly general membership meeting; Roberta and Bob Humphry Connie Critzer, Dawn and Lowell Badgley, Ana Hickory and Randy Wood.

October 26 marks the National Day of the Deployed.

Each day, thousands of U.S. troops are deployed across the globe, and thanks to Shelle Michaels Aberle and former North Dakota Governor John Hoeven, this day has been set aside to honor our deployed troops and their families. In 2006, Aberle contacted Governor Hoeven looking for support of a Proclamation Day to honor the deployed troops, and by 2011, Congress had transformed North Dakota's Day of the Deployed into a national day of proclamation to honor deployed troops. October 26 was chosen as the date because it is the birthday of LTC David Hosna, Abrele's cousin.

On the National Day of the Deployed, we honor our deployed troops and their families for the bravery and sacrifice they are making for our country. Each deployed troop leaves behind a family whether it is a spouse, children, parents, siblings, grandparents, and friends who are also considered family. Even though military families are not deployed they are making a sacrifice and deserve to be recognized as well. By recognizing a deployed troop's family, you are honoring the deployed military person.

Often, we feel the need to express our gratitude in an elaborate way, and we worry a small act of kindness will look as if we do not care. However, each small act of kindness matters and makes a difference. Baking a plate of cookies for a military family or taking the time to write a handwritten letter to a deployed military member have just as much of an impact as a grand gesture. The thought and care you put into your act of support is what matters most not how much money you spend. On the National Day of the Deployed, the important aspect is to honor our deployed troops and their families. No matter what type of gesture you choose, all that matters is that your gesture is heartfelt. Large or small, inexpensive or expensive, every act of kindness makes a difference in the lives of these deployed troops and their families and shows your support for them. By supporting our troops, we are also supporting our country and ultimately supporting our freedom.

Day of Caring 22 Sept 2021– Project Linus Make A Blanket Day (MABD)

Central Virginia has organizations that work hard to preserve and improve our unique quality of life. Project Linus is a non-profit organization that provides security for children, who are seriously ill or had a traumatic experience, with the love and comfort of a hand made blanket. Our chapter covers the areas of Albemarle, Green, Nelson and some of Fluvanna Counties. A majority of the blankets are provided to children's organizations within the surrounding area; Ronald McDonald House, Ready Kids, UVA Children's wing... The exception includes children of military parents/caregivers attending TAPS and Snow Ball Express (children whose parents/guardians were killed in combat), children of deployed service members, and Camp Corral (children of disabled veterans). Post 74 has offered the use of their facilities, once again, to conduct the making and sorting of blankets. This event is when most of the quilts are put together

and blanket labeling is done for the year. Today we completed **253 blankets**, **delivered over 7300** since the Chapters inception in 2006. Together, we ensure that our wonderful Charlottesville area will continue to grow and thrive. Thank you for your support. Robin Riddle




