Egg frying lessons were suspended. Later in the day, she asked me why I was in such a bad mood. I replied, "You'd be in a bad mood too if you broke your yolks!" It doesn't take much to ruin someone's day I guess.

I knew someone in Arkansas whose entire week hung in the balance of a Razorback football or basketball game. That made for a lot of spoiled weeks. Sounds funny when its someone else's team, doesn't it? A man was once annoyed I invariably said 'A-men' at the end of prayers with a long 'a'. He much preferred the short 'a' version and I wanted to oblige him, but in the heat of prayer, I'd forget. He got mad enough at my countrified ways, he quit coming. I sought rabbinical consultation and asked my friend, Gene Levy, "Which is correct, "A-men or Ah-men?" He replied, "Ahmunee."

This morning I read, "You can love the snow or hate it, and live through a day still having snow." There's something to that. Days come to us as they do and our accepting them as they come makes a difference. Snow comes, but so do days of 100 degrees. Some things are a matter of personal taste and our teams win and lose. When cracking eggs, yolks will sometimes be broken. Are any of these reason enough to ruin an irreplaceable day of life? No, they're not, yet we let it happen. Clyde Carmack wrote, "Nothing matters if it doesn't matter forever." Some things do matter forever. Family members matter, even when they drive us mad. Staying on speaking terms with God matters, even when it includes a lot of "I'm sorry." Knowing the sun is shining, even when dark skies block its light, matters. I vote for making these things the important things in our lives. I still despise a broken yolk. Amen?
