The Amen Corner

Monday was the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz, the notorious Nazi concentration camp in Poland. There were actually many hundred camps across Europe, with names like Treblinka, Dachau, Buchenwald. In these places, Jews, but also gypsies, homosexuals, political and religious dissidents, and the mentally and physically challenged, were worked to death, used for medical experimentation, exploited sexually, or exterminated outright by the many millions. The last time I was in Washington, I was asked if I wanted to go to the National Holocaust Museum. "No!", I answered, because I don't want to. Who would? "No!", because I don't need to. Who does? Turns out quite a few of

As a child, my parents often found it easier to drag me with them instead of leaving me with my big sisters. I went to quite a few movies and I liked the great theatres and the big screens and the air conditioning. I didn't understand a lot of it. The horror film Rodan horrified me. Elizabeth Taylor in Butterfield 8 made me want to survive to manhood. (So much for parental guidance.) The most memorable was Judgement at Nuremburg, about the Allied trials of Nazi war criminals after World War II. The movie incorporated a lot of actual footage of stuff an 11-year-old didn't need to see. Heaps of corpses and the gas ovens and evil men in high boots and high hats. I saw this and accepted it as historical truth. I believe one of the most civilized people to ever exist were lured into a madness they couldn't control or stop. At wars end, many were forced to tour the camps lest they come to deny the depth of the evil. I take special interest in one: Dachau.

At the end of his life, my dad shared big news to my late brother, Mark, and I. He'd participated in the liberation of Dachau four months after Auschwitz. A medic in the 3rd Army, he told us many of the stories we asked for, but that one he kept secret. His account of great piles of bodies, of the pitiful condition of the survivors, the rushed process to save those left living was gruesome, so I'll stop. My brother asked Dad if he thought of it often. He replied, "I smell it in my dreams." I believed my father, and I still do. Inexplicably, there's a growing number of "Holocaust Deniers," people willing to write it all off as one great big hoax, an organized plot to make Hitler look bad, welcomed by those who find him glamorous, and welcome the hatred that was his mother's milk.

Not surprising, with the rise of this nonsense has come a rise on hate crimes. These include Jews, Muslims, Blacks, homosexuals and anyone different, and in a minority. It's a matter of people giving excuses for the inexcusable. We're not welcome to participate. Whatever anyone says, we're not allowed to play in an infested sandbox. By our baptisms, we have a Lord who won't have it. I celebrate that. I hope you do too.
