## The Amen Corner

When I was new to Charleston, I was introduced to a dish Charleston had only recently introduced to the world: Shrimp and Grits. Large fresh Shrimp, Stone ground Grits with a rich Tasso (seasoned pork) Gravy. Oh my. Not changing the subject, but the world is being swept up in news of the Coronavirus Disease. 
