The Amen Corner

Over the past few days, I've discovered staying home due to this pandemic, and thinking of nothing but it, grows weary. So I found myself thinking of the nature of leadership in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). I'm pretty certain that doesn't set your collective hearts aflutter but I find it intriguing, and have considered ways of making it so for you. I start with this story.

As a child, my home church was pastored by Brother William Hadden, whom my father dearly loved. He wasn't native to Tennessee, but Connecticut, or the Disciples, but time spent at Vanderbilt landed him at First Christian, Clarksville where he could serve a church and rear 4 kids. My dad thought him great, but it wasn't universal. He wore a black robe, and burned candles, and for some at that church, and most Christian Churches of that time, such things were "too Catholic" to be borne. I didn't care. At an All Church Picnic, he entered a Blueberry Pie Eating Contest and I thought that swell. When I was 8, he came to my party. I remember him pulling up and wishing me a Happy Birthday. He patted my shoulder. I was delighted by his presence. I would be an adult in ministry before it ever really dawned on me he'd only come to my party to pick up his son, Whitney. Brother Hadden was a gifted minister and a fine man and he served my church at a time churches had a hard time not growing. Ours grew, and added on and all that. But, it was a church given to fault finding, and running off preachers. Bro. Haden set a record lasting 9 years. Eventually he wound up in North Carolina at a prestigious congregation, but not prestigious enough. Bro. Hadden jumped ship and joined the Episcopal Church, transforming himself into Father Hadden. It was a good move for him. Remember the part where he wore a robe and burned candles? That was at odds with the times in our wider church family. He insisted on such things as this, even when actively in opposition with the leadership of the congregation.

There are religious communities where this doesn't present a problem. Ours is not one of them. Leadership is shared among Disciples and it's imbedded in our theological DNA. You can take it to the bank: Ministers don't run the show; not for long. Disciples don't like to be told what to think, what to believe or how to feel. Ask yourself, do you? More on this next week.

10 Ways to Celebrate Earth Day at Home

by Leah D. Schade The 50th anniversary of Earth Day is on April 22, and there are many ways to commemorate it right in your living space and neighborhood!

- 1. Observe & Wonder. Set into a circle of nature for a few minutes of observation, contemplation, and appreciation. Maybe your yard, or even just a crack in the sidewalk where weeds and grass have pushed through. Learn the names of the trees and plants they are your neighbors in God's Creation! Let this time center you in prayer, wonder, and gratitude.
- 2. Plant & Grow. Make a plan for your garden. Think about what vegetables or flowers you'd like to grow this season and where you will plant them. If you pick up seeds or plants from your local garden center, be sure to wear a mask and maintain social distancing.
- 3. Share your Green Space on Social Media. When you post your pictures, share that caring for God's Creation is part of your faith and encourage others to post theirs.
- 4. Play Earth Day Bingo. Make up a card with things in nature you might find in a walk around your neighborhood or backyard (dogs, birds, trees, grass, flowers, insects, etc.). As you find each one, say a prayer of thanks to God for creating this beautiful discovery.
- 5. Advocate Online. Find out what environmental legislation is currently under consideration in Congress. Call your local government to encourage them to support the strongest protections for our planet. Ask how you can help.
- 6. **Read & Educate**. Download a copy of Pope Francis's Encyclical Laudato Si' from your local library or listen to it as an audio book.
- 7. Plan/Watch a Worship Service Celebrating God's Creation.
- 8. Pray for Earth & Vulnerable Communities. Write a prayer regarding Creation. Share it on social media along with a favorite nature picture.
- 9. Honor Native Legacy. Visit Native Land Digital, type in your address, and see what indigenous peoples lived in the land before European conquest. Do some research about the history of indigenous peoples in the place where you live.
- 10.Thank those who Nurtured your Love of Nature. Think about eh person who taught you the most about environmental concerns and cultivated your love of nature. Write a letter thanking them for what they've taught you. If they're no longer living, read the letter to someone close to you to honor their memory.
