In its 6th month, 2020 is down for a picture of dystopia; so much that could go wrong has gone right ahead and done it. The COVID-19 Coronavirus came in January before we knew it was here, and now, well over 100,000 have died, in pain and distress without loved ones on hand to say their goodbyes. For most of us, it's been a lot of inconvenience staying at home, working from home and getting sick of being at home. Others can't work from home, and now so many have no work to go to. The obvious hassles and frustrations occupy many minds, until the prospect of being exposed rears its head and then we think of loved ones who are vulnerable and going home asystematically contagious scares us to the core.

Now, this week we've seen a case of police brutality in the extreme played out on tv. We know a very few bad cops do such things to the shame of the many good ones, but we don't often see a guy with his hands in his pocket snuffing life out of a guy for a suspected bad Jackson. Every time I go to Homeland, they run a pen across a larger bill, and I doubt if one turned out counterfeit anything bad would happen. Then again, I'm not a black man in America. All hell has broken loose and we shouldn't be surprised. What is ugliest among us is rearing its head. These are prime times for people to say, "It's never been worse." Watch out for the code words and phrases of codgers: "Anymore," "It's gotten so," "In my day,"; this last one really gets to me.

This is your day, and mine. Out of all human history, this is the time God called us into being. We're alive now and we're to witness now. Unless we decide God isn't up to the job, God put us here for now because we're the right people for it. And besides that, I reject the very notion the world has never been worse. The Great Depression was more than a decade, with a Dust Bowl too. In a world without penicillin. Followed by a world war! Most of the first arrivals at Jamestown and Plymouth died the first year. In the 14th Century, the population of Europe went from 80 to 30 million due to Bubonic Plague. And that's not even the worst. People who study these things claim the 6th Century takes the prize, with a series of volcanic eruptions from Egypt to Iceland that darkened the Sun for about 12 years, leading to an ice age, crop failure and starvation. Then, they had Bubonic Plague too! My mother used to say, "From the day you're born till you ride in a hearse/Things are never so bad they can't get worse." Funny, but not true. 
We Need You!!
