The Amen Corner

On Saturdays, Aunt Sam would drop off Cousin David and me at the picture show, usually the Capital. We walked straight in without reference to starting times and stayed until it started over and came to where we'd come in. A favorite was Steve Reeves, a former Mr. Universe, who starred in cheap Italian productions of Hercules, Goliath and Morgan the Pirate. David and I didn't know cheap from expensive but we thought he was cool, a real hero! However, early on I rid myself of the requirement my heroes must be larger than life and models of any kind of perfection.

Flawed heroes are easier to emulate. Take golfing legend, Ben Hogan, as a sterling example. I thought of him last week while working on a sermon based on Romans 5. Hogan was born to a poor family in a small Texas town during hard times. He was undersized always. His dad was a blacksmith, as that trade was going the way of the horse and buggy. He worked in the first Dr. Pepper bottling company. Desperation and untreated depressions proved singularly depressing for the elder Hogan; enough so that one evening in a small room of their rented frame house, he took a high caliber pistol and shot himself. His son was his soul witness. Stuff like that will mess up a kid. Scar him for life.

The fatherless family moved to Ft. Worth where Ben tried to sell Star-Telegrams until older boys bullied him off his corner. Thus, he fell into the less lucrative job as a caddy. Alongside him was Byron Nelson who was loved by the members for he was charming. Hogan wasn't. Ways were found to help Byron get ahead; Ben was on his own. Nevertheless he persevered, barely made it on the PGA Tour, took off time for World War II and returned to golf and was Player of the Year in 1949. The next year, he suffered a horrible accident that should have been the end of him, at least his playing days. He worked his way back. In constant pain he only played a few times per year but went on to become one of the greatest of his sport. (The old riddle: Why did Ben Hogan win only one British Open? He only entered once). Near the end of his playing career, he adopted his dad's trade and began making superlative forged golf clubs. They were the best of their day; so much prettier than those ugly Pings that took over. Ben Hogan died in 1997 and his funeral was where he worshipped regularly, University Christian Church, Ft. Worth.

The lesson of the day was Romans 5: 3-5, and perfect for an imperfect hero who surmounted so much to do so much. "And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us."

SPOKES FOR HOPE 2019

Spokes for Hope 2019 will be operating Monday through Thursday, June 3 – July 25. <u>FIRST CHRISTIAN</u> CHURCH YOUTH AND ADULTS WILL COVER <u>JULY 22-25</u>. Please be at the Well by 10:00 AM each morning. We'll have some driving routes, as well as bike routes.

There'll be 3 feeding sites supported by the Oklahoma Regional Food Bank. They are True Gospel Tabernacle near Elm Terrace, the pavilion near the Duncan Public Swimming Pool, and the pavilion near the old Douglas School. The pavilion near Douglass has a splash pad and there'll be a meal for the kids, 4:30—5:30 on Tuesdays only, followed by games.

Thanks in part to a grant from Sarkeys Foundation, Spokes for Hope will be offering door-to-door meals for children who aren't able to reach one of the feeding sites. Food for door-to-door delivery, made possible by private funding, costs about \$100 per child for the entire 8-week program. Financial donations are always welcome and can be made to First Christian Church, with Spokes for Hope on the memo line.
