# The Amen Corner

A freshman at Philips, I was just turning 18, away from family and friends and in as unlikely a place as I knew: Enid. A girl I don't recall asked me to a formal. Three of us considered the cost of tuxedo rentals, did the math on likely formals to come and went to S & Q Clothiers and bought our own. Stupid. Still, in a time of powder blue and apricot, with lapels from Memphis to Chattanooga, of ruffled shirts, I'm proud to report I went with black wool with a shawl color and an understated formal shirt. Very James Bond.

In my senior year I'd wait tables at Oakwood Country Club in similar evening wear. Not the same one as it turned out. At years end I flew back to Sunny Tennessee, but had to take a bus to the City, then a cab to the airport. The bus station was on Reno and there's your clue to coming excitement. Hauling all my clothes, including the tux for nonexistent formal events in Clarksville, I parked them on the sidewalk, hailed a cab, turned around and found I was going home with no baggage to check. I was robbed and wouldn't have another tuxedo until George Sherrill gave me the lame excuse I wanted.

That same semester I took U.S. History to 1870 from Dr. William Snodgrass. I did well in the class, taking post 1870 the next semester just for the fun of it. However, the standout memory was Dr. Snodgrass himself. He was brilliant and informed, opinionated and, to my surprise, a wrongheaded voter. In my waning childhood I'd never had many encounters with people who voted wrong. I presumed they had horns. He didn't. Of course, he sadly shook his head when he found out my politics were all wrong but he didn't take it out on me with a red pencil. Instead he'd talk with me about Tennessee politicians, comparing Frank Clement to Alfalfa Bill Murray.

Years later I'd discover Dr. Snodgrass was an elder at First Christian in Waukomis. On a drive to Enid a couple of years ago I stopped and found his grave; looks like he's resting in peace. These 2 memories might seem to have nothing to do with each other but they've very much in common. One was profoundly unimportant, the other profoundly important. They were events of the same person at the same time in his life, in a place he'd not known the year before.

I'm reminded everything that's ever happened is happening in every moment. "There will always be wars and rumors of wars." Birth and death and growth in between. People doing foolish things, while missing occasion to make great changes. Some are losing hope as others are finding it. Every day Christ is born to someone. Good Friday happens every day. Some experience the resurrection for the first time. Glad to share this adventure with you.

#### **SPOKES FOR HOPE 2019**

Spokes for Hope 2019 will be operating Monday through Thursday, June 3 – July 25. <u>FIRST CHRISTIAN</u> CHURCH YOUTH AND ADULTS WILL COVER JULY 22-25. Please be at the Well by 10:00 AM each morning. We'll have some driving routes, as well as bike routes.

There'll be 3 feeding sites supported by the Oklahoma Regional Food Bank. They are True Gospel Tabernacle near Elm Terrace, the pavilion near the Duncan Public Swimming Pool, and the pavilion near the old Douglas School. The pavilion near Douglass has a splash pad and there'll be a meal for the kids, 4:30–5:30 on Tuesdays only, followed by games.

Thanks in part to a grant from Sarkeys Foundation, Spokes for Hope will be offering door-to-door meals for children who aren't able to reach one of the feeding sites. Food for door-to-door delivery, made possible by private funding, costs about \$100 per child for the entire 8-week program. Financial donations are always welcome and can be made to First Christian Church, with Spokes for Hope on the memo line.
