

The Amen Corner

As a very young boy my parents would take me to visit Mrs. Hart, a wonderful lady in a big house on College Street. It must have been when the Russians started sending dogs in space because I recall her, my dad and me on her veranda staring at the moon, wondering about the miracle of space travel.

Just 10 years later I was a bigger boy when Neil Armstrong took "one small step for man, one giant step for mankind." I had a summer job going with the Tennessee Highway Dept., an assistant Weed Whacker and Litter Picker Upper. I gave particular assistance to a senior member of the team, declared too old to drive a mower, even as I was deemed too young. I don't know if I ever knew his name because everyone called him "Preacher," on account of his weekend vocation. Ordinarily, what he lacked in formal education was made up for with the wisdom of a lifetime's experience. Wisdom failed Preacher that hot week in July. Word was they were going to land men on the moon that week. At the state shop the gathered collection of highway workers turned to Preacher for pastoral care. He assured them it was all a fake; it couldn't be done, and if it were done, it would mark the end of time and, "the moon will turn to blood." I watched it at the home of friends, Denise and Marilyn Williams. It was amazing. I went out later with Mary Margaret Buckner and marveled at the wonder of it all.

The next day the weed and litter removers had to make sense of what they'd seen in black and white, and the observation all else seemed normal. It was generally concluded to be a fake. Said one, "They weren't at no moon; that was Lookout Mountain (Near Chattanooga and home of the Moon Pie.) Said another, "#&@ @*&&\$%, Burness, #&@ @*%& &\$@ fool, couldn't you see that wasn't Lookout Mountain? It was flat; they was in New Mexico." That was a summer of vast learning, including my first encounter with the war on science and technology.

These years later I still find there's much in the world to instill marvel. I also think about those real men of Apollo 13: Armstrong, Aldrin and Collins, heroes who took a 3-day trip to the moon armed with less computer technology than a Jitterbug phone and slide rules. They landed and walked and got home safe. Miraculous!

SPOKES FOR HOPE 2019

Spokes for Hope 2019 will be operating Monday through Thursday, June 3 – July 25. FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH YOUTH AND ADULTS WILL COVER JULY 22-25. Please be at the Well by 10:00 AM each morning. We'll have some driving routes, as well as bike routes.

There'll be 3 feeding sites supported by the Oklahoma Regional Food Bank. They are True Gospel Tabernacle near Elm Terrace, the pavilion near the Duncan Public Swimming Pool, and the pavilion near the old Douglas School. The pavilion near Douglass has a splash pad and there'll be a meal for the kids, 4:30–5:30 on Tuesdays only, followed by games.

Thanks in part to a grant from Sarkeys Foundation, Spokes for Hope will be offering door-to-door meals for children who aren't able to reach one of the feeding sites. Food for door-to-door delivery, made possible by private funding, costs about \$100 per child for the entire 8-week program. Financial donations are always welcome and can be made to First Christian Church, with Spokes for Hope on the memo line.
