The Amen Corner Yom Kippur

Over the weekend, a large part of the world kept a sacred holy day. It's Yom Kippur, 2 days of fasting and prayer sacred to Judaism. It's so steeped in meaning and tradition that it's the one time of the year nonobservant Jews find their way to a temple or synagogue. For all the festive times of their faith, this isn't one. Yom Kippur is an occasion for atonement. That's not a very attractive idea for most of us. After all, atonement has to do with making things right with family, neighbors, and God, and to do so we first have to admit some kind of wrongdoing.

Admitting to doing wrong, being wrong, gets in many of our craws. It's hard for some us to ever say we make mistakes, and we can get defensive. Still, it would be the exceptional one of us to have no need of it. The Apostle Paul knew the issue. It dates all the way back to Moses coming down from the mountain only to find the newly-freed ungrateful. Faithless slaves worshipping a golden calf. Atoning such sins was well in order? Paul knew it when he admitted to the Romans, "For the good that I would I do not: but the evil that I would not, that I do." That's how it's done: owning up to sins of commission and omission.

Around the world, Jews of all stripes and degrees of devotion gather as a people to fast and pray. It's interesting that the rule of the day is to pray in first person plural. They pray "We" prayers and for 2 good reasons. First, so no one to "out themselves" has making confession. Second, because they're all part of the same people and the sins of one are the problem of the whole. This is a pretty good example of the sense of an appropriate Yom Kippur prayer: "To those we may have wronged, we ask for your forgiveness. For those we may have helped, we wish we could have done more. For the many we neglected to help, we are truly sorry. To those who have helped us, we are deeply grateful."

I don't think being a Jew is required of any of us to offer up such sentiments to our neighbor or our Lord. The only one who may not have needed to offer such an admission of failure was our Lord Jesus; still yet, he prayed it.

Typical workdays are Sunday mornings during Worship and Wednesday evenings during Wednesday UNite.


