

The Amen Corner

This morning I wanted to kick myself. I blame Fred Rogers. For the first time in awhile, I was at coffee at R & S and one of the guys said something inane. This is not unusual. Truth is, he says unnecessary nonsense often enough, it's just so much low hanging fruit. I could have/should have ignored it but in a nanosecond I said something smart at his expense. Everyone laughed, him included but me. Instead, I immediately thought of Fred Rogers and I was ashamed of myself.

This weekend I went to see Tom Hanks portray his 6th cousin in Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood. What I witnessed was a person better than I. Rogers' low key, nonstop, Christian witness was sincere and gentle. He was kind and it wasn't just for show. Watching the film, I wept as I involuntarily compared myself to him.

Time was I specialized in self-deprecating humor, the kind of joke one tells on oneself, "How were the restaurants you visited in New Orleans? I'm fat and I care," or "Oh, he's 6'7" and that's why he has such a fast swing weight. That must be my problem!" Stuff like that, get it? A comment like these doesn't make anyone else look foolish, doesn't hurt their feelings, and doesn't make them feel any blush of shame. Yet, somewhere along the line I started hearing cutting jabs in my head when people said whatever they're saying, and out like a shot comes some unnecessary stinging remark. An hour and 49 minutes in Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood awakened me to this change that's come over me. I don't like it. Rogers was an ordained Presbyterian preacher and a better educated crop of preachers is not to be found. Still, it's a sobering moment to encounter one as a better person, a better Christian. I won't count equality with this modest saint a thing to be grasped, but I'd prefer the chasm not be as wide as what I must confess to have discovered.

Upon further painful reflection it occurred to me that when Jesus was enduring the passion of the Cross, it included the temple guards making fun of him, ridiculing him. That was part of the package of evil done to him. I don't want to be like those guys. I'm acutely aware that our lives regularly are arguments for Jesus to go to the Cross for us, but I hadn't placed myself in Jerusalem making fun of my Savior. Still, to do it to anyone is to do it to him.

So, if I've ever made a joke at your expense, I apologize from my heart. Regardless, if I've done so to you, you deserve better from your pastor as Christ deserves better from anyone of us who wears his name.

At lunch today a friend did something and I could have ignored it, but the chance to be a smart aleck reared its ugly head and I shot off my mouth. Everyone laughed. This is going to be tough. Go see the movie; I promise you'll be glad!
