

But instead of fame, she finds addiction, heartbreak, and eventually, herself.

What follows is a rollercoaster of recovery, comedy, and redemption —leading to a billion views, and a legacy of helping others through humor. This story is about surviving survival — turning inherited pain into laughter and proving that Trauma + Time = Traumedy. And it's proof that laughter isn't betrayal... it's survival.

The script has a tall order. Not to make the Holocaust funny. Not once does the material even remotely suggest this. No, instead, the material looks at how we can cope with trauma through time and perspective. And a bit of humor.

The film's tackling of a second-generation survivor of the Holocaust whose parents carried the weight of the experience through their daily lives is poignant and hilarious in equal measure. We all at once relate to all of the characters as we understand Hanala's parents' inability to let go of such a devastating tragedy and also to Hanala's impatience with not being the one responsible for their suffering and lack of acknowledgment of her own issues.

The bite and self-deprecating humor Hanala carries with her into adulthood clearly stemmed from her upbringing.

There are numerous laugh-out-loud jokes that will be memorable quotes.

The dialogue and humor are whip-sharp and captures the zest that made the original book the piece is based on so popular.

Hanala is a hilarious and original character.

The arc she goes on over the course of the film is both hilarious and poignant.

It would be great for a unique perspective like Hanala's to find viewers and show them a different side of a culture that is largely misunderstood.

The moments I enjoyed the most were the strong character relationships.



#### **Traumaland – A True Story with Issues**

Meet Hanala, a brilliant, hyper kid growing up in 1960s Montreal with Holocaust-survivor parents who love TV more than her. Her bedtime stories? Less Cat in the Hat, more Aunt in the Camp. She vows to become famous – because famous people get attention.

Originally named after an aunt murdered in a Nazi death camp, (no pressure), she changes her name to Suzan, loads up on codependency and eyeliner, battles booze, bad men, and breakdowns, and crashes headfirst into showbiz—and then into a Christmas tree, while drunk, at an A.A. gala.


But Hanala claws her way back. After surviving addiction, narcissists, and the '80s, Hanala reinvents herself as a one-woman wellness revolution. She creates Comedy Wellness, a life-saving blend of humor and healing, helping others rewrite their trauma stories. In the '80s, she becomes a fitness icon with "Shape Up LA!" and the original *viral vlogger* decades before the word "vlog" existed. Marlon Brando even taped her shows—on VHS.

Hanala produces 200 episodes for cable and satellite, wins awards for her work, while teaching aerobics classes at L.A. health clubs. Her nightmares subside as her dreams begin coming true. There's even a big wedding. She appears in movies and TV shows, sometimes playing herself – shaping up Bette Midler in "Ruthless People" (1986). Her parents visit her beautiful house in L.A. Hanala interviews her mom on her show. Hanala finally has her parent's attention and respect.

Traumedy = *Trauma + Time = Comedy.* It's "The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel" meets "The Diary of Anne Frank"—with abs.

Hanala Sagal, the daughter of Holocaust survivors, is a Canadian-born, L.A. based writer, actress, comedian, sober since December 28th, 1982. She co-wrote and Executive Produced Elvis & Nixon, the 2016 Tribeca Film Festival winner.

Writing and hosting cable TV's hit *Shape Up LA!* in the 80s and 90s, Hanala created Comedy Wellness, fitness for mind and body. The popular TV guru helped shape the aerobics movement through videos and teaching packed classes at The Sports Connection.

In 2006, she launched her YouTube channel—bringing laughter and life skills to millions. She's now clocked a billion minutes watched, proving people really do want to feel better—they just prefer to laugh while doing it.

Nominated for the Hedy Lamarr Awards for Women in Entertainment & Technology, Hanala was runner-up to Geena Davis. She's now 42 years sober, a respected speaker, a trauma coach, and a singer in a successful band! Her story is raw, ridiculous, and healing AF.

Hanala continues to work in the field of substance abuse leading workshops, yoaga and Zoom classes for people in recovery.

**Don Most** is best known for his co-starring role as Ralph in the long running television series **Happy Days**. During this time, he worked with talents like Jerry Paris, Henry Winkler, Ron Howard and Garry Marshall. Following in the footsteps of some of his peers, Don began directing feature films.




