Hey Y'all,

I had a wonderful time walking around the neighborhood this morning with the Taryns! Jim, It was a pleasure chatting with you as well. I have planned out a rough draft for a multi project plan and included a species list for each. Again, nothing is set in stone, and In addition to Jasen Johns' approval, I will include the community feedback in any adjustments moving forward.

I have divided up the plantings into four different projects:

- 1. Englewood and Mailing Ave: 56 trees- Sweetbay Magnolia, Rising sun Redbud, White fringe tree, Chickasaw plum, and Serviceberry
- 2. Hill, Dalton, Nolan St, Milton Ave, and Chosewood Park: 103 trees- Hophornbeam, American hornbeam, Serviceberry, Nuttall oak, Rising sun Redbud, and Winged or Jefferson elm (depending on availability) ALSO, we can plant some Fringe trees in your front yard if you'd like, Jim! Chosewood Park: Serviceberry, Pawpaw, White fringe
- 3. Grant, Elvira, Eric St, and Miller Reed Ave: 103 trees- Hophornbeam, Serviceberry, Rising sun Redbud, and Winged or Jefferson elm (depending on availability)
- 4. Gault and Cassanova St: 80 trees- Serviceberry, Pawpaw, Redbud, Dogwood, White fringe, Persimmon, Sweetbay Magnolia, and White & Nuttall oak
