

Ahu Program Application - Stone Ahu

Application for the construction and maintenance of a stone ahu within State HDOT Right-of-Way. This application may be submitted alone or with the appropriate Ahu Sign Application.

Stone Ahu Requirements:

- Stone ahu must be located within 100 linear feet of ahu sign.
- Ahu shall not be placed in clear zone. Clear zone is generally 30' beyond the edge of travel lane, subject to HDOT approval. Community is free to install stone ahu outside HDOT right-of-way with landowner's permission.
- Ahu shall be oriented lengthwise perpendicular to roadway. Place as close to roadway and ahu sign as possible, following setback guidelines.
- Provide 150' minimum distance from centerline of crossroads at intersections.
- Ahu shall not be located in areas with slopes greater than 25%.
- Do not locate stone ahu in swales or areas where water collects.
- Top of ahu shall be at least 3'6" above roadway surface.
- Bottom of ahu shall be no more than 2'6" below roadway surface.
- Maximum ahu height not to exceed 6'.

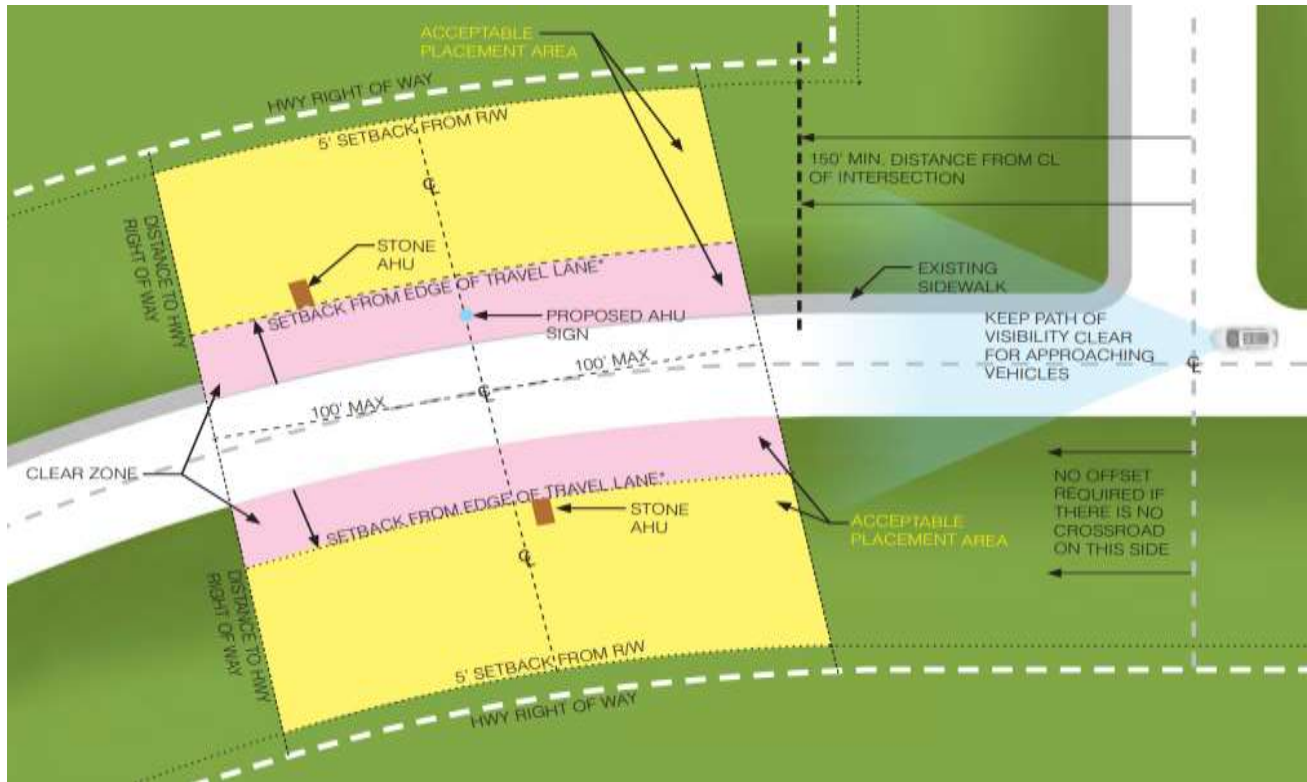


Figure 1: Overhead Sample 'Ahu and Sign Placement

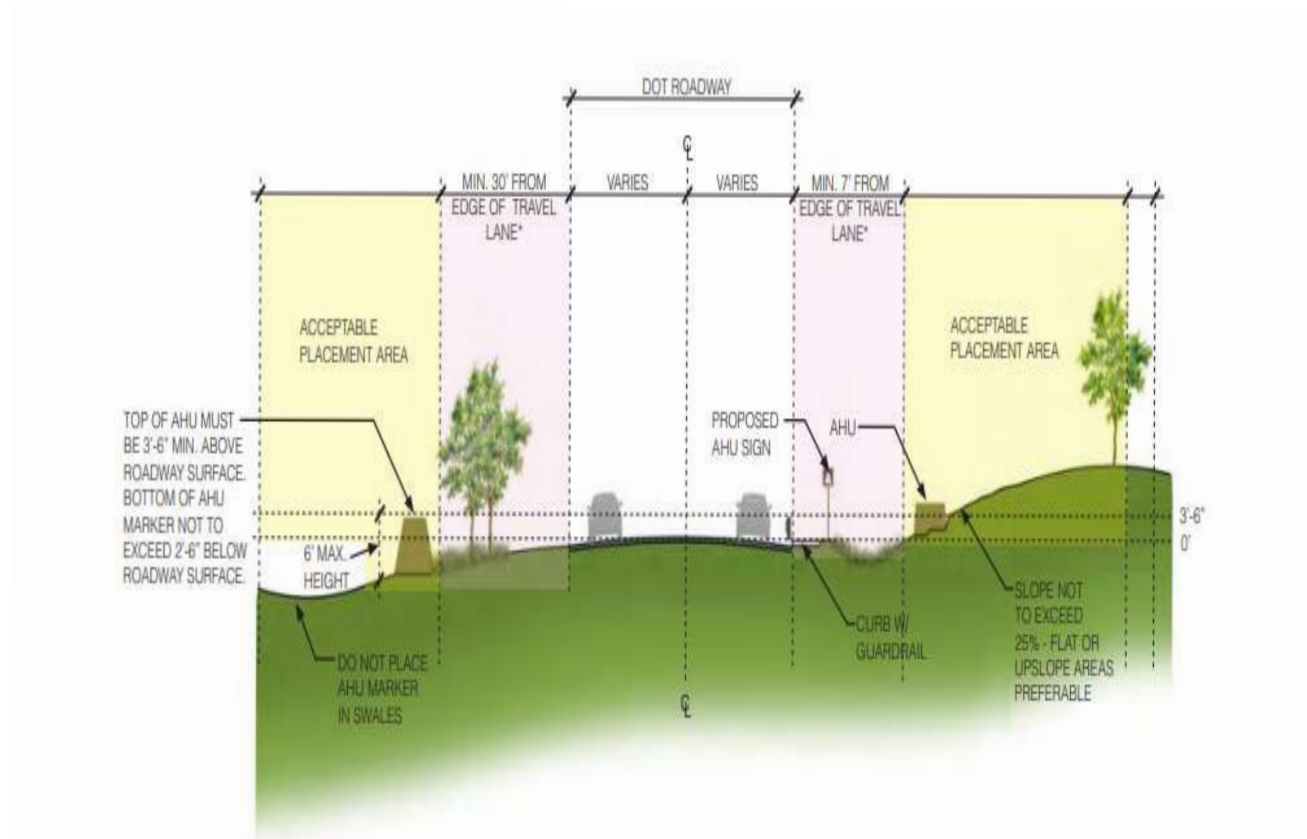


Figure 2: Ground Sample 'Ahu and Sign Placement

- See Figure 1 and 2 for sample stone ahu placement and roadway section diagrams.

Include a short description of exact stone ahu location and the reason why this locations was selected.

Include distance from edge of paved roadway, distance from ahu sign, nearby utilities or obstacles, posted speed limit, major constraints, etc. If text box is not sufficient, attach description in an additional file.

Required Attachments:

Attach supporting documents when sending in application. When submitting with an application to install an Ahupua'a sign that protests the State GIS border locations, items 2-4 do not need to be duplicated so long as they cover the sign and the ahu.

1. 6"x6" Google Maps Image with a red square indicating stone ahu location. Be sure to INCLUDE the MAP SCALE in lower left.
2. Attach Hawaiian Civic Club and Neighborhood meeting minutes; both must mention your project.
3.
Attach a summary of your community involvement process (i.e. community meetings with public notice, meetings with neighborhood boards, Native Hawaiian civic clubs, ahupua'a or homestead organizations).
4. Attach Community Sign In documents.
5. Attach proof of funding documents.
6. Attach Stone Ahu Maintenance Plan documents.
