FORCE OF BLUE DOCUMENTARY SIGNS DISTRIBUTION AGREEMENT WITH INDIE RIGHTS MOVIES NOW STREAMING ON AMAZON PRIME VIDEO.



Force of Blue, the award-winning documentary feature film directed by first-time helmer **Jeffrey S. Williams**, has signed a distribution agreement with **Indie Rights Movies** and is currently streaming on **Tubi** and **Amazon Prime Video**.

Force of Blue is an enthralling ninety-minute documentary that follows the Minneapolis North Community High School football team through the 2020 season; A season on the brink, with schools closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, in a city on the edge after the death of George Floyd at the hands of Minneapolis police officers and the ensuing riots that set the city ablaze a couple of months before the start of the season. The Polars relied on their coaches, a group of dedicated police officers, who guided them through the turbulent times despite cops being persona non grata in a city with many political forces pushing for the defunding of the Minneapolis Police Department. Force of Blue giftedly navigates through the intersection of sports and social justice issues to present an intriguing documentary about a unique period in American history.

Force of Blue premiered at the 2024 Pan African Film Festival in Los Angeles. It has since screened in several film festivals worldwide, winning Best Feature Film at the Hamilton, New York International Film Festival, Best Sports Film at the Bangkok Movie Awards, and Best Director at the Dreamanila International Film Festival. Force of Blue was produced by Williams and Jon Cermin of Cine Cermin Productions.

FORCE OF BLUE INTERESTING NOTES:

- Although Force of Blue is the same subject matter as the Showtime docuseries Boys in Blue, produced and directed by Peter Berg, there is no connection between the two documentaries. Force of Blue had started filming a year before Boys in Blue and chronicles the 2020 football season that was directly after the death of George Floyd and cut short by the COVID pandemic.
- Recent New York Jets signee, wide receiver **Tyler Johnson**, is one of the subjects in the documentary.
