BUDGET MEETING MINUTES
Wednesday, February 16, 2022

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brandley.

The flag salute was led by Mayor Brandley.

Council Persons present: Cairns, Lehman, Valianti, Angelucci, MacGregor and Walters.

Councilperson MacGregor made a motion to open the meeting to the public to discuss the 2022 Municipal Budget, seconded by Councilman Angelucci. All in favor-motion carried.

Jody Reese- 89 Kendall Blvd.-Spoke about the need for the Oaklyn Memorial Library in addition to it being a memorial.

Deniise Buczko-507 Kendall Blvd.-Was born and raised in Collingswood but moved to Oaklyn a couple years ago. Was glad there was a library.

Janet Larson, 44 W. Collingswood Ave.-Has worked at the library and the library is more then just a library. Many Seniors use it.

Karen Mueller-111 E. Beechwood Ave.-Would like to see the library stary open. After school programs have also used the library.

Christine Garvey-316 Newton Ave.-Moved to Oaklyn three years ago and was glad to see that the town had a library.

Liane Hasner-16 Newton Ave.-The library is more then just a library. It is a social space in town.

Michelle Santos-52 E Bettlewood Ave.-Asked what would the library be used for. It was explained that the library building would be used for records storage.

Joe Kovalevich-420 Goff Ave.-The Friends of the Oaklyn Memorial Library was started years ago to help raise funds for the library. Would not like to see it be used for records storage.

Bety Lieber-201 W. Holly Ave.-Am a member of the Friends of the Oaklyn Library and do not want to see the library close.

Bill Stauts-5 E. Haddon Ave.-Appreciate the hard decision that the members of council have to make.

Would not be in favor of closing the library.

Andrea Cline-101 Yale Ave. Stratford-Currently the Librarian at the library. The library is a part of the community. The Borough can leave the Camden County Library System.
