COUNCIL MEETING

November 9, 2021

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brandley.

The flag salute was led by Mayor Brandley.

Mayor Brandley announced that the meeting was in compliance with the Sunshine Law.

The minutes of the 10/12/21 Council Meeting and the 11/1/21 Caucus Meeting were approved by motion of Council President Cairns, seconded by Councilman Lehman. All in favor-motion carried.

Treasurer's Report was read and approved by motion of Councilman Angelucci, seconded by Councilperson MacGregor. Unanimous roll call vote.

PUBLIC SAFETY- The Fire Departments Fund Drive is underway. Members just completed a CO class which is great timing as everyone is turning their heat on.
