-Below are a few most common ordinance:

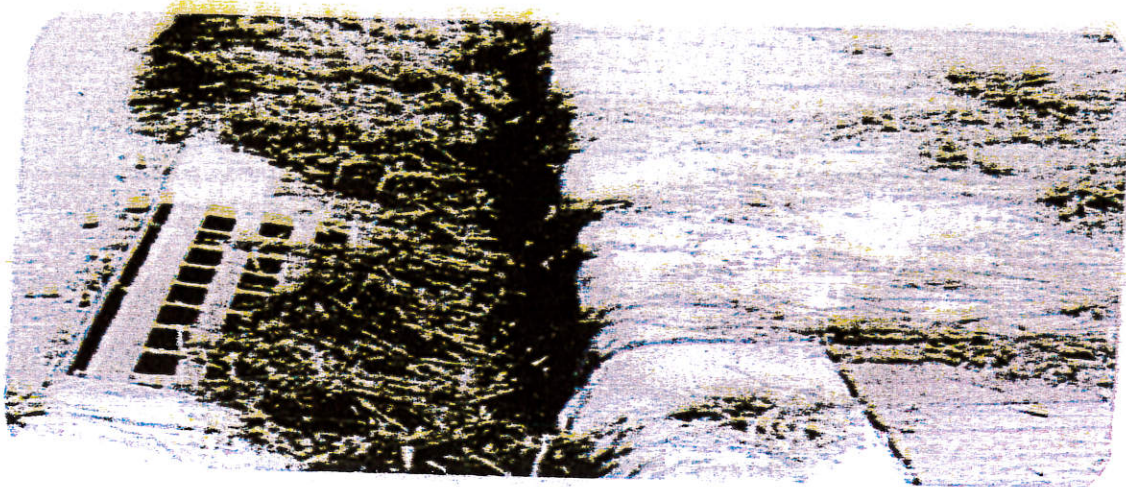
- BO 120-4 Parking Prohibited on any of the streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- BO 69-1A and 55-5 All Dogs and cats must be registered in the Borough of Oaklyn. (see enclosed notice)
- BO 119-13.1 All trash receptacles shall be placed at the curb line no earlier than 3:00 p.m. on the day before the designated day of collection and shall be removed by 11:59 p.m. on the date of designated collection.
- BO 111-23 It shall be a violation of this article to sweep, rake, blow or otherwise place yard waste that is not containerized at the curb or along the street. (see enclosed)
- BO 124--1 A permit must be obtained from the Borough to conduct a yard sale.
- BO 98-3 Door to Door Solicitation is prohibited in the Borough without a permit. A list of current solicitors permits is available on the Borough website. Always ask to see any solicitors permit. It will have the Borough of Oaklyn's seal on it if it was issued by the Borough.

Grass Clippings Left In The Road

- **Look bad**
- **Are bad for the environment**
- **Clog storm drains which can cause flooding and increased maintenance costs for tax payers**
- **Are hazardous to motorists and cyclists**
- **Can lead to fines**

The Borough of Oaklyn prohibits washing, sweeping and/or blowing vegetative debris into storm drains, ditches, waterways, sidewalks and roads. (FINES CAN BE ISSUED TO THOSE THAT ARE CAUGHT VIOLATING THIS ORDINANCE.)

When it rains grass clippings and other vegetative debris is washed down our storm drains and into our stormwater basins, creeks and lakes where they start to decay. This process consumes oxygen while releasing nutrients and can lead to algae blooms and kills fish.



Borough of Oaklyn Ordinance

Article VII. Yard Waste Collection Program

111-22. Definitions

- **Containerized** - The placement of yard waste in a trash can, bucket, bag or vessel, such as to prevent the yard waste from spilling or blowing out into the street and coming into contact with stormwater.
- **Person** - any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association or political subdivision of this state subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- **Street** - any street, avenue, boulevard, road, parkway, viaduct and drive or other way which is an existing state, county or municipal roadway and included the land between the street lines, whether improved or unimproved and may comprise pavement, shoulders, gutters, curbs, sidewalks, parking areas and other areas within the street lines
- **Yard Waste**- leaves and grass clippings

111-23. Yard Waste Collection

It shall be a violation of this article to sweep, rake, blow or otherwise place yard waste that is not containerized at the curb or along the street. Placement of such yard waste at the curb or along the street at any other time or in any other manner is a violation of this article. If such placement of yard waste occurs, the party responsible for placement of the yard waste must remove the yard waste from the street or said party shall be deemed in violation of this article.

Borough of Oaklyn Resident,

As per Borough of Oaklyn Ordinance Chapter 69-1A, every person owning, keeping, or harboring a dog or dogs within the limits of the Borough of Oaklyn shall on or before January 1st of each year apply to the Borough Clerk for a license for each and every dog so owned, kept, or harbored. All licenses issued expire December 31st of each year.

Also according to the Office of Animal Welfare 4:19-15.2a, of the State of New Jersey, No municipal clerk or other official designated by the governing body of any municipality to license dogs therein shall grant any such license and official metal registration tag for any dog unless the owner thereof provides evidence that the dog to be licensed and registered has been inoculated with a rabies vaccine of a type approved by and administered in accordance with the recommendations of the United States Department of Agriculture and the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, or has been certified exempt as provided by regulations of the State Department of Health.

Animal Registration Fees

- Spayed/Neutered Cat or Dog = \$15
- Unspayed/Unneutered Cat or Dog = \$20

Late Fees

- License purchased after March 31st = \$10
- License purchased after June 30th = \$15
- License purchased after September 30th = \$20
