(Proceedings continued from Volume I.)

THE COURT REPORTER: This is the court reporter, Your Honor. I'm back.

THE COURT: Thanks, Jessica.

THE COURT REPORTER: You're welcome.

MR. MORRIS: Dr. Treese just said I'll be there in two minutes.

THE COURT: Hi, everybody. Court reporter's checked in with us. You ready to call your next witness?

MR. MORRIS: (Indiscernible) --

THE COURT REPORTER: Mr. Morris, your microphone's doing something funny.

THE COURT: Try again.

MR. MORRIS: Can you hear me now?

THE COURT REPORTER: Yes.

THE COURT: Sometimes it just kind of squeaks out for some reason.

MR. MORRIS: Maybe the room I'm in. Sorry.

THE COURT: Who knows?

Dr. Treese, would you raise your right hand do be sworn.

Do you swear or affirm the testimony you'll give in this proceeding will be the truth, the

1 whole truth and nothing but the truth?

2 THE WITNESS: I do.

3 THE COURT: Please state your name for the
4 record.

5 THE WITNESS: Theodore Treese.

6 THE COURT: You may inquire, Counsel.

7 DIRECT EXAMINATION

8 BY MR. MORRIS:

9 Q. Can you state your business address, sir?

10 A. Yes. 1900 Glades Road, Suite 500, Boca
11 Raton, Florida, 33431.

12 Q. And you're licensed as a medical doctor in
13 Florida, correct?

14 A. Correct.

15 Q. And you're board certified in psychiatry and
16 neurology, correct?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And you're board certified in addiction
19 medicine; is that correct?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And what is your current position?

22 A. My current position is Assistant Chief of
23 Psychiatry at the Veterans Hospital in West Palm
24 Beach.

25 Q. And are you also the Medical Director of

1 Inpatient Psychiatric Services there?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And we've filed as our potential Exhibit 2 a
4 true and correct copy of your curriculum vitae, I
5 believe. Is that a true and correct copy?

6 A. Yes.

7 MR. MORRIS: At this time, we would introduce
8 Exhibit 2 as our Exhibit 2.

9 THE COURT: Any objections, Dr. Lahteenmaa?

10 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Okay. Which one is this
11 one?

12 THE COURT: This is his CV. Dr. Treese's CV.

13 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Oh, I haven't even seen it.

14 MR. MORRIS: It was part of our Exhibit 2,
15 which was filed and sent to you.

16 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Well, I mean, I can't argue
17 with his CV. I mean, it says what it says.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Exhibit 2 is admitted
19 without objection.

20 (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 2 was admitted into
21 evidence.)

22 BY MR. MORRIS:

23 Q. And can you tell me, Doctor, approximately
24 how many mental and physical examinations of a patient
25 have you done?

1 A. In my career?

2 Q. In your career?

3 A. I would say thousands.

4 Q. And how many have you done for the Department
5 of Health?

6 A. I would say about around 50 or 60 total in my
7 career.

8 Q. And what types of steps do you take when you
9 do a mental and physical examination of a medical
10 professional for the Department of Health?

11 A. Well, the initial steps would be, well, the
12 process involves a history, a mental status exam,
13 toxicology testing, sometimes neuropsychological
14 testing, if that's indicated, and review of records.
15 Any records that are relevant to the exam that are
16 provided by the Department of Health or the examinee,
17 or that I find on my own. Also, review of collateral
18 sources of information, such as family, colleagues,
19 supervisors, related to the examinee's work.

20 And really, very importantly in this type of
21 exam with the Department of Health, with a fitness for
22 practice exam, one needs to examine the examinee, of
23 course, but also assess the credibility of the
24 complaint and the source of the complaint to make sure
25 that it's an accurate complaint; it's not a frivolous

1 complaint. And so in broad terms, those are the steps
2 I take in an exam with the Department of Health
3 referral.

4 MR. MORRIS: And at this time, the state's
5 going to tender Dr. Treese as an expert in
6 psychiatry, neurology, and addiction medicine.

7 THE COURT: Any objection? Dr. Lahteenmaa?
8 Or do you have any questions for Dr. Treese about
9 his qualifications?

10 DR. LAHTENMAA: No.

11 THE COURT: Okay. The witness is accepted as
12 tender.

13 BY MR. MORRIS:

14 Q. Now, in this particular case, when did you do
15 an examination of Dr. Lahteenmaa?

16 A. It was April 16th, 2024. And so the
17 significance there is that I had erroneously written
18 May 16th on the exam report, but it should be April
19 16th of 2024.

20 Q. And do you know what time that exam was?

21 A. Yes, it was 2:30 in the afternoon.

22 Q. And how long did that exam take?

23 A. About 90 minutes.

24 Q. And in this specific instance, what did you
25 do as far as steps you took or just topics you

1 discussed with her, or what types of testing did you
2 do?

3 A. So I gathered the history of present illness,
4 the presenting problem there. We did spend some time
5 on the introductory forms, the consent forms. It took
6 about 10 minutes at that time. And then I gathered
7 the information about Dr. Lahteenmaa's complaint, her
8 experience of being persecuted by the workplace,
9 Teladoc in this case, and other related people that
10 she claimed were basically tormenting her for raising
11 complaints about how scheduling is done, how
12 information is gathered or processed, and how
13 workflows are prepared.

14 So I gathered information about that. I also
15 gathered information about the whole history in terms
16 of background information, personal history, medical
17 history. All the headings that I have on the exam
18 report, I gathered information.

19 In terms of as the exam progressed -- well,
20 I'll pause there and see if you have any questions.

21 Q. Sure, sure.

22 Did she tell you about any medications she
23 was taking?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. And what medications was she taking?

1 A. Yes, sir. She mentioned she was taking
2 Adderall, 20 milligrams, three times a day.

3 Q. And did she indicate any other medications
4 she was taking?

5 A. One second, let me get to it. Just the
6 Adderall, and actually I didn't have the dose at the
7 time. I didn't write that down, so I don't know if I
8 had the dose at the time. I learned later it was 20
9 milligrams three times a day.

10 Q. Is 20 milligrams three times a day a high
11 dosage?

12 A. I think so.

13 Q. What is the usual dosage you would see for a
14 patient like Dr. Lahteenmaa?

15 A. Well, for a professional, especially for a
16 psychiatrist, I would have concerns about the
17 psychiatrist, if he's going to have a hard time
18 focusing and paying attention. I'd also be concerned
19 about use of the medication sporadically or on a PRN
20 basis. I think it's kind of destabilizing, and I
21 would expect a psychiatrist to be able to modulate and
22 control their own attention a bit better than having
23 to take it sporadically, and as much as three times a
24 day.

25 I would also hope that a psychiatrist, if

1 they were going to take an amphetamine, to take
2 something that would be like an extended release that
3 would allow for better modulation of their attention
4 and their emotions, and be less susceptible to the
5 rapid onset and the quick clearance of that
6 medication, which I think is destabilizing.

7 So that's one concern I had about that
8 medication. But overall, I mean, it's not illegal. I
9 think that it's -- for a true diagnosis of ADHD, it's
10 not an unfair treatment. It's within the realm of
11 acceptable. I think I'm a little bit more on the
12 extreme, or on one end of the spectrum, in terms of
13 how conservative I am with using amphetamines,
14 especially for professionals where attention is
15 critical.

16 Q. Was she prescribed Trazodone, to your
17 knowledge?

18 A. Not that I knew of at the time.

19 Q. Now, did you ask for any toxicology testing
20 with your exam?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. And did you get any toxicology testing from
23 Dr. Lahteenmaa?

24 A. No.

25 Q. And why not? Do you know?

1 A. I don't know. I let Dr. Lahteenmaa know at
2 the time that the things that I thought were the most
3 crucial was that in light of the claims that she was
4 making about being persecuted, to rule out -- well, to
5 assess the credibility of the claim, I wanted to make
6 sure that she could provide information that would
7 substantiate or corroborate that there was some sort
8 of malicious or sinister presence persecuting her, or
9 was this a delusion. So I made it clear that I needed
10 that. I also needed the toxicology testing and
11 collateral source of information. It was three things
12 that were just not negotiable. I absolutely had to
13 have them. And so e-mail attempts and phone calls
14 were not responded to over the course of about three
15 months.

16 Q. Now, I want to be clear. You told her that
17 at the exam?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Okay. And so you told her that she needed to
20 provide you proof of essentially whatever the
21 conspiracy was against her, number two, the
22 toxicology, and number three, collateral source
23 information, correct?

24 A. Yes, which would include professional
25 references or sources as well as personal sources.

1 Q. And you received no response whatsoever?

2 A. None. Well, I did receive a response from
3 Dr. Lahteenmaa after I turned in the report, which I
4 didn't respond to. But in the three months that it
5 took me to complete the report, which I was waiting
6 for a response, just hoping to get more clarity before
7 giving a final report. But yeah, over the course of
8 the three months that the exam report was open, I did
9 not receive a response. And most commonly, either the
10 phone wasn't answered or the e-mail response were not
11 provided.

12 Q. Can you tell me how many phone call attempts
13 were made --

14 A. Three phone calls and --

15 Q. -- to get information?

16 A. Yeah, three phone call attempts and then
17 multiple e-mails.

18 Q. How many e-mails?

19 A. I'm looking that up right now.

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. Be right with you.

22 Q. Sure, take your time.

23 A. So I've seen two requests by e-mail.

24 Q. And can you tell me, did Dr. Lahteenmaa ever
25 talk to you about toxicology testing being done

1 somewhere else?

2 A. No.

3 Q. And would the toxicology testing have been
4 helpful for you?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And how so?

7 A. It could provide some clarity on potential
8 causes for the psychotic symptoms that I had observed
9 during the exam.

10 Q. Okay. And what kinds of psychotic symptoms
11 did you observe?

12 A. Delusional thinking, disorganized speech.
13 And by disorganized speech, I mean her speech would
14 veer off topic, sometimes returning back on topic, but
15 with long periods of time to bring her back to the
16 focus of the interview portion that we're on. Or
17 sometimes tangential in that it just veered off topic
18 and never came back, and it would require rigid and
19 very assertive redirection to bring the topic back to
20 discussion.

21 So there was those two things, those two
22 components of the exam. I felt that there was
23 significant emotional distress by Dr. Lahteenmaa based
24 on the thoughts, content that she was having with the
25 persecutory and paranoid delusions. Like I said,

1 there was disorganized speech. I believe there were
2 negative symptoms of schizophrenia that, although it's
3 hard to verify or corroborate this given that I didn't
4 have any collateral information, but I do believe
5 there was social withdrawal or professional
6 withdrawal. I think that opportunity was starting to
7 slip away from Dr. Lahteenmaa with her work. The file
8 review that I did have showed that she was starting to
9 lose opportunity, lose trust by the employer. There
10 was a lot of confusion expressed by those who were
11 confronted by her claims, her accusations, her
12 allegations of being persecuted. So there was some
13 social limitations starting to emerge in her case.

14 Also -- so those are the main symptoms I was
15 seeing is the positive symptoms including disorganized
16 speech, and delusional thinking, and then the social
17 withdrawal, and the social losses that were happening.
18 And then also another component of the social part is
19 the neglect, neglect of her needs. She started to
20 lose opportunity professionally and income. And so in
21 line with that, even though this is after the exam, I
22 was concerned to find that there was a breast mass
23 that has not been followed as indicated to rule out
24 any potential serious concerns there, which could be
25 an indirect cause for the symptoms that we're seeing

1 on the exam as well as today.

2 Q. And would that be something that if she were
3 treated by a professional that it could be ruled out?

4 A. You mean something related to the breast
5 mass?

6 Q. Yes.

7 A. Yes. There was a CAT scan or a head CT done
8 at Delray Medical Center, which was negative. But I
9 would like to have seen an MRI with a bit more
10 resolution, and also just a thorough workup and
11 assessment of the breast mass, which I think has
12 progressed for about two years. And from what I've
13 seen in the records that I've reviewed since, it
14 hasn't been thoroughly assessed and evaluated.

15 So if that was what I -- you know, on the
16 differential diagnosis, there's the fear that it could
17 be breast cancer. If it was breast cancer, then the
18 brain metastasis is a possibility, which could account
19 at least for part or maybe all of this presentation.
20 So that's a concern.

21 But going back to the earlier question when
22 you said, "What are the symptoms," when you see a
23 social withdrawal and neglect, that's neglect of her
24 health care as well, which is what has played out.

25 Q. Now, when did you prepare your actual report?

1 A. The end of June is when I finalized it and
2 then sent it in on July 1st, I believe. I'll double
3 check. Yeah, July 1st, 2024.

4 Q. At any time had you found out about the
5 Delray hospitalization?

6 A. So are you asking when I found out about the
7 Delray hospitalization?

8 Q. Yes.

9 A. That was recently. I think the Department of
10 Health provided it to me within the past couple of
11 months.

12 Q. And was there anything from the -- first of
13 all, was that voluntary or involuntary?

14 A. Involuntary.

15 Q. And how long was she involuntarily committed?

16 A. It looks like it was about five days in
17 August, roughly like August 8th through the 13th,
18 roughly.

19 Q. And can you tell me what was her admission
20 diagnosis?

21 A. At Delray Medical Center, I'd have to double
22 check that record. I think it was similar to mine,
23 like an unspecified psychosis, but the discharge
24 diagnosis was delusion disorder.

25 Q. And what would it take to diagnose a delusion

1 disorder?

2 A. But another diagnosis was they did allude to
3 the amphetamine use, such as a psychotic disorder due
4 to amphetamine use. So that's another -- they really
5 had still -- their diagnoses were a little more
6 specific than mine. They had more information, more
7 observation with her, but there was still a bit of a
8 provisional quality to it in that they weren't sure if
9 it was a strictly delusional disorder by itself or was
10 the delusional or psychotic thinking due to
11 amphetamine use.

12 So what --

13 Q. And you reviewed those -- I'm sorry.

14 A. Sorry. What was your question that you asked
15 about the diagnosis?

16 Q. You reviewed the -- I'll get back to that.

17 You reviewed the records that are in Exhibit
18 5, the Delray Medical exhibits for Dr. Lahteenmaa?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Okay. And when did you review those? Do you
21 know?

22 A. I would say about 10 days ago, two weeks ago.

23 Q. Okay. And were you notified by Dr.
24 Lahteenmaa that she'd been Baker Acted at all?

25 A. Just by the Department of Health.

1 Q. Okay. And can you tell me what was her
2 discharge diagnosis?

3 A. If you'd like, I can look at the -- let me
4 look at the file. And I see that her admission date
5 was August 12th; discharge date was August 16th. From
6 what I can remember, it was delusional disorder was
7 the discharge diagnosis, and the second diagnosis was
8 psychotic disorder due to substance use, due to a
9 medication, amphetamine use.

10 Q. And did they identify the amphetamine in the
11 records?

12 A. Well, there was a toxicology screen that was
13 positive for amphetamine.

14 Q. And was she taken off of any amphetamines
15 during her treatment?

16 A. Yes, she was.

17 Q. And which amphetamine was she taken off of?

18 A. Adderall.

19 Q. And did she do better as a result of that, or
20 no? Or do you know?

21 A. It was hard for me to tell. It really wasn't
22 clear to me. I know the documentation was a little
23 sparse. So, I mean, I'm inferring that she did better
24 because there was initially a petition for involuntary
25 commitment for psychiatric treatment. But I think she

1 took paliperidone and improved. I'm inferring this,
2 that she did well enough that she was no longer
3 involuntarily committed and then was discharged.

4 Q. And you -- in your report, you issued a
5 statement of limitations, correct?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Okay. And what were those limitations on
8 your examination?

9 A. Yeah, the limitations -- well, you mean, by
10 limitations, I think you might be referring to, like,
11 limitations in the reach of the evaluation, correct?

12 Q. Correct.

13 A. Yeah, the limitations were Dr. Lahteenmaa's
14 participation with the evaluation in providing more
15 information that was requested, which I mentioned
16 before. Also, her disorganized thought process was
17 also a limiting factor in the evaluation. It was very
18 hard to navigate through and gather relevant history.
19 The toxicology testing was also the main limiting
20 factors.

21 Q. Now, you also indicated in that statement
22 that she was aggressively targeted; is that correct?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And what was the source of that claim for
25 aggressively targeting?

1 A. Yeah, Dr. Lahteenmaa had reported that with
2 Teladoc, what I recall her mentioning was that she was
3 trying to -- she was working for the telepsychiatry
4 company, and she began to notice things that would
5 happen when -- if there was an open slot. And the way
6 that -- so basically, the way Teladoc, for her
7 experience, was that they would very aggressively
8 fill, you know, open slots in the schedule, of her
9 schedule. And she felt that there was something
10 sinister about the way they would gather the
11 information about her schedule and about how quickly
12 they would fill up open slots in her schedule, and
13 sometimes even overbook.

14 And so she felt there was a sinister quality
15 to this, and she began to inquire how Teladoc knew
16 about this. And then as she did, began to ask about
17 the operations, the behind-the-scenes operations, like
18 from an IT point of view or just from an operation
19 manager point of view, she felt that they were
20 targeting her and began to become very aggressive
21 toward her and to retaliate, to monitor her, to
22 intrude on her, and even threaten and intimidate her,
23 and made her feel very frightened, is what she
24 reported to me.

25 Q. Now, did she indicate which entities other

1 than Teladoc were watching her or reviewing her?

2 A. Yes. She felt that multiple government
3 agencies from multiple governments were involved, as
4 well as criminal organizations were involved as well.
5 And so, as I tried to gather this information to sort
6 of get more specific detail about what any one group
7 was doing, it would sort of float around, it was sort
8 of free-floating information. So if I said, "Well,
9 we're talking about the FBI, what are they doing?"
10 Well, they're affiliated with this cyber-stalking
11 group or a hacking group from another country, and so
12 it just became very slippery to kind of follow this
13 trail.

14 Q. Now, did you come to any conclusions about
15 her insight and her judgment about her condition?

16 A. Yes. I thought that Dr. Lahteenmaa's
17 judgment was impaired -- no, her insight into the
18 illness was impaired, and the judgment was also
19 impaired.

20 Q. And did you come to any conclusions by
21 reviewing the Delray Medical Center records?

22 A. Yes, I thought the Delray Medical Center
23 records provided a little more specificity on the
24 diagnosis, and the reason why is because they had
25 access to more observation, more time with Dr.

1 Lahteenmaa, and they were actually able to gather some
2 of the collateral sources of information. They spoke
3 to people that had known her, I believe Dr. Dahlin was
4 one of them, perhaps, and one or two others that knew
5 her, and they felt that they had a more secure
6 diagnosis.

7 But in terms of their overall assessment, it
8 was very similar to the impression I had as well, but
9 even more, I guess, specificity and detail to the
10 evaluation because they simply had more information.

11 Q. And that was about three months after your
12 evaluation?

13 A. Yeah, so my evaluation with her was in April,
14 and so her inpatient evaluation was in August, four
15 months.

16 Q. Now, did you ever get a chance to review Dr.
17 D [REDACTED] records?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And when did you get to review those?

20 A. About the same time as the Delray Medical
21 Center records, like around two weeks ago.

22 Q. And did you come to any conclusions after
23 reviewing Dr. D [REDACTED] records?

24 A. Yes, I felt that the records were just not
25 very informative. There's not a lot of content to the

1 records, so I felt that the diagnosis was not secure.
2 I think it's based on a questionnaire. There was no
3 collaterals in there that I could find to support the
4 diagnosis of ADHD, and the follow-up was not as
5 frequent as I would recommend for a professional
6 taking what's a bit of a higher dose of Adderall than
7 most.

8 And then as time went by, the follow-ups
9 became less frequent. So as Dr. [REDACTED] counted today,
10 maybe 23 visits in eight years, but most of those
11 visits were in the beginning, not so much more
12 recently. So I think he had lost track of her, and he
13 wasn't able to pick up on the psychosis to the adverse
14 effect. I think it was a failure to monitor.

15 Q. Now, do you have any concern that he hasn't
16 seen her since May of 2024?

17 A. Well, no. Well, I'm more concerned that I
18 think Dr. Lahteenmaa would really benefit from mental
19 health assessment and treatment by somebody. But it's
20 probably better that she didn't see Dr. [REDACTED] since
21 he'd been prescribing the amphetamines, which likely
22 played some role in the psychosis.

23 Q. And I'll get to your recommendations in a
24 little bit. But first of all, what criteria
25 specifically did you use to diagnose Dr. Lahteenmaa?

1 A. So the positive symptoms of psychosis, which
2 included the significant delusional content. So when
3 you look at a psychotic disorder, you'll have
4 criterion A, which is more the positive symptoms of a
5 psychotic episode. Positive meaning the things that
6 are more noticeable, the things that really jump out
7 at you.

8 In Dr. Lahteenmaa's case, significant
9 disorganized speech and the delusional thought
10 pattern, thought content. Those are the two that
11 really stood out there and they were very clear.
12 There has been some concern about whether I actively
13 questioned in a checklist format, but I think when you
14 have a case where there's a patient or examinee who's
15 in distress, the checklist isn't exactly necessary.
16 If the symptoms are presenting themselves, if they're
17 just falling out toward you, then you don't need to
18 ask if they're there, if they're already being
19 presented to you. So that's one reason why we didn't
20 run a checklist on those symptoms exactly. I did ask
21 about some other possible disorders, but I think in
22 this case -- and I can explain why the full checklist
23 wasn't done at the time of the exam.

24 Now, going on to this criterion A, criterion
25 B is more the negative symptoms of things that are not

1 so noticeable right away, which would be the social
2 symptoms, how well they take care of themselves, how
3 much they're engaged in their personal and
4 professional lives. And there I see that she -- like
5 I mentioned before, I suspected social withdrawal. I
6 suspected that her career opportunities were shrinking
7 and she was starting to lose opportunity.

8 And then criterion C, which is the duration
9 of the illness, it's an estimate, but I think at the
10 time I felt like it was pretty secure based on the
11 time of the complaint with Dr. Dahlin to the time of
12 the exam that she met the criteria of at least six
13 months of psychotic symptoms.

14 Now, criterion D is kind of up in the air
15 because I wasn't able to rule out all the other
16 possible causes. So at the time I saw Dr. Lahteenmaa,
17 there wasn't the possibility of doing a full medical
18 exam as well as the toxicology testing. But based on
19 the pretty clear presence of symptoms within criterion
20 A, B, and C, I felt that there was a secure diagnosis
21 of at least a provisional psychotic disorder.

22 And so the provisional diagnosis was
23 presented on the report because I wanted to pay
24 respect to the fact that it really wasn't a complete
25 exam. And I thought, you know, for the benefit of the

1 doubt, Dr. Lahteenmaa was entitled to try to get
2 hopefully a medical assessment over four or five days
3 time like I recommended on the report to do a thorough
4 assessment and see. Because there are significant
5 consequences if I write schizophrenia or bipolar
6 disorder for monitoring implications. What if it's
7 just a simple medication adverse effect? Then that's
8 going to make a big difference in how she'll be
9 treated going forward as a health care professional.

10 So I thought that was the most careful
11 diagnosis I could give but also while alerting the
12 Department that there was something very serious here
13 that was very limiting. So that's the criteria that I
14 used to make the diagnosis.

15 Q. Does psychosis have a definite or specific
16 duration?

17 A. No, but it does depend on the diagnosis, the
18 specific diagnosis. If you have psychosis due to a
19 medication adverse effect, then that could be short
20 term. If you have schizophrenia diagnosis, that's
21 more of a longer term illness that can be lifelong.
22 So it just depends on the specific diagnosis you have
23 in terms of duration and course of illness.

24 Q. Now, did you find that she was unable to
25 practice osteopathic medicine with reasonable skill

1 and safety to patients?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And what condition did you find that made her
4 unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety to
5 patients?

6 A. Well, in hearing Dr. Dahlin's testimony, I
7 noticed that as well that at times she did feel that
8 the patients presenting for treatment with her she
9 felt were agents of the criminal enterprises or
10 sinister presences that were tormenting her. And so
11 she was likely misperceiving her patient population
12 and not really seeing them clearly or assessing them
13 clearly. Seeing them as a threat to her safety. And
14 so that's one thing that really stood out.

15 But the symptoms were just uncontrolled. The
16 psychotic symptoms were uncontrolled and severe,
17 untreated and possibly being made worse by the
18 amphetamines. And furthermore, I wasn't sure there
19 wasn't any other possible cause that hadn't been
20 assessed or treated. So when you have all these
21 variables that are unaccounted for and then severe
22 psychotic symptoms, I thought that was a major
23 concern.

24 Another concern I had was that her
25 interaction with her psychiatrist, those were probably

1 very brief appointments. And I think in the first 10
2 minutes seeing Dr. Lahteenmaa, I wouldn't have
3 expected there to be a syndemic psychotic disorder.
4 But over the course of time, I felt like, you know,
5 with the stress of the exam, same with his hearing,
6 the thought pattern that I see with Dr. Lahteenmaa
7 gets worse over time as she faces adversity or just
8 common stresses throughout the day. So for those
9 reasons, I felt like she was grossly unprepared and
10 unable to practice as a psychiatrist at the time I saw
11 her.

12 Q. And was your diagnosis unspecified psychosis
13 not due to a known substance or psychological
14 condition?

15 A. Let me just double check. I put two
16 diagnoses: First I put unspecified psychosis not due
17 to a known substance or a physiologic condition out of
18 respect for maybe this is a primary psychiatric
19 diagnosis, which is possible. But then the rule-out
20 diagnosis, I mean, they're both in effect provisional
21 diagnoses that there is some uncertainty. But that's
22 where I also specified that stimulant abuse with
23 stimulant-induced psychotic disorder. So I put both
24 diagnoses there because I didn't know which one it was
25 or if there was even something else. So it's

1 provisional.

2 Q. Would you say it's to a reasonable degree of
3 medical certainty with those rule-out provisions?

4 A. Yes. I mean, to be a little more specific, I
5 thought Dr. Lahteenmaa clearly had severe psychotic
6 symptoms. The only question is, which diagnostic
7 category would they fit into? Schizophrenia, bipolar
8 disorder with psychosis, or drug-induced psychosis? I
9 don't know. I didn't know at the time. And I still
10 don't know.

11 Q. Would schizophrenia normally present in a
12 younger person?

13 A. Yes. So I don't think it's likely for Dr.
14 Lahteenmaa that it's schizophrenia.

15 Q. So is it more likely a substance use disorder
16 of some kind?

17 A. The ones I think would be most likely would
18 be a medication or substance-induced psychosis or a
19 psychotic disorder or presentation due to some medical
20 factor that's yet unknown.

21 Q. And so that could be the breast cancer or
22 something else?

23 A. Right. The breast mass, I mean, we don't
24 know what's going on there. And that's very alarming
25 that it hasn't been assessed.

1 Q. So what recommendations for treatment did you
2 give for Dr. Lahteenmaa?

3 A. The recommendation was that she would be
4 referred to a medically supervised residential
5 assessment and treatment center with capabilities for
6 treatment of both psychiatric and substance use
7 diagnoses for a multi-day evaluation.

8 Q. And do you anticipate that she would also
9 have to go to a monitoring program like PRN?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And why is that?

12 A. Given the severity of the illness as it
13 presented and also just the lack of insight that she's
14 had for some time now, if and when she can kind of
15 regain safety to practice status, then for a long
16 extended time, monitoring would be vital in Dr.
17 Lahteenmaa's case.

18 Q. And can you explain, have you seen the
19 documents that Dr. Lahteenmaa has filed in this case?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Have you seen the exhibits she's filed in
22 this case?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Do those cause you any concern?

25 A. Yes. I think that they're just chaotic and

1 it really manifests, it shows the disorganized thought
2 process and it does not provide any backing for the
3 possibility that this could be like a malicious claim.
4 For example, from time to time I get evaluations or
5 referrals where the HR department truly was abusive or
6 an employer truly was abusive once in a while. And
7 this is not the case here.

8 Most of the time when she's writing people
9 and requesting assistance or claiming these
10 allegations, I see confusion in the other people, I
11 see frustration, I see distress. People are alarmed.
12 And I don't see any sign anywhere that there's some
13 malicious, like deliberately malicious intention by
14 anybody. Just a lot of confusion and just very
15 disorganized behavior by Dr. Lahteenmaa.

16 Q. And have you been able to observe Dr.
17 Lahteenmaa today testifying in her presentation in
18 court?

19 A. Yes. And I think the difference today is
20 that when Dr. Lahteenmaa met with me, I didn't
21 challenge her views at the time. I simply gathered
22 the information, I tried my best to organize the
23 gathering of the information so I can get all the
24 information I needed, all the categories filled, like
25 medical history, personal history and things like

1 that. I never suggested that she was having
2 delusional thinking because I felt like her tolerance
3 for that was limited. Today she's met more
4 confrontation, I've seen more distress and more
5 agitation than I had on the initial evaluation.

6 I also see very clearly here that the thought
7 process for Dr. Lahteenmaa is impaired. She's having
8 a hard time following the discussion, following the
9 train of thought here in this process in court, and
10 following instructions. Even the very simple
11 instructions of ask questions only, don't testify,
12 just ask questions, she had to be redirected multiple
13 times on that. She had a very hard time controlling
14 herself on those instructions. And then the
15 delusional thinking is just out of control. It's not
16 the worst case that I've seen in a psychotic patient.
17 However, for a professional, clearly there are
18 concerns.

19 Q. And what are those concerns?

20 A. The concerns are that with the current
21 function and the current thought process and content
22 with Dr. Lahteenmaa that she's exhibiting today, is
23 that she wouldn't make it more than a couple hours in
24 an office, in a psychiatric practice, before people
25 would be confronting what's happening there.

1 Q. Now, can you tell me, has your diagnosis
2 changed from your evaluation to now, from the time you
3 made the initial evaluation to now, or do you still
4 stick with the same diagnosis of Dr. Lahteenmaa?

5 A. You know, I don't disagree with the diagnoses
6 by Delray Medical Center, but I would keep my
7 diagnoses the same because the medical workup in this
8 case would involve an MRI. It would be a
9 multidisciplinary workup with a medical team that
10 would do a full medical assessment, especially the
11 breast mass and anything related to that, and a much
12 more thorough serum or blood testing and toxicology
13 testing ongoing to assess any potential cause for a
14 psychotic presentation. And some of the testing had
15 not been done at Delray Medical Center. Nothing
16 against Delray Medical Center, but there's always a
17 little more you could do in a case.

18 Q. And can you tell me, is that something that
19 would be done by PRN, or do you know?

20 A. Well, it would be overseen by PRN. I think
21 PRN would require an assessment like I recommended.

22 Q. A medical assessment as well as psychiatric?

23 A. Yes. Basically, a place that's got strong
24 multidisciplinary capabilities. A place that could do
25 all the full medical testing, blood testing, and even

1 make referrals as needed. With all due respect, and I
2 hope this isn't the case, but if there was something
3 troubling on the finding for the breast mass, then the
4 evaluation would be halted and the assessment would go
5 in that direction to rule out any potential
6 challenging diagnosis there.

7 Q. And do you have the ability to opine whether
8 Dr. Lahteenmaa is safe to practice as of today based
9 on everything that you've seen; all the observations,
10 all the paperwork, all the records?

11 A. No, at this time I do not think Dr.
12 Lahteenmaa is capable of practicing as a physician in
13 the state of Florida with reasonable safety and skill.

14 Q. And that is your opinion, correct?

15 A. Correct.

16 MR. MORRIS: No further questions.

17 THE COURT: All right. Before I turn it over
18 to Dr. Lahteenmaa, you have not yet offered
19 Exhibit 1, Dr. Treese's report.

20 MR. MORRIS: I was going to let this stand,
21 but I'll offer Exhibit 1 into evidence.

22 THE COURT: Any objection, Dr. Lahteenmaa?

23 DR. LAHTENMAA: Which one is that one?

24 THE COURT: That is his report, his
25 evaluation.

1 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yeah, yeah, I disagree with
2 most of it, yes.

3 THE COURT: Disagreeing, though, is not an
4 illegal objection. This is the evaluation that he
5 made of you. Of course you disagree with it,
6 because if you didn't, you wouldn't be here today.

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yeah.

8 THE COURT: I just mean, do you have an
9 objection that it's not really the report that he
10 issued? I know you don't agree with it. You
11 don't have to agree with it to -- not to object.
12 You can object.

13 I'm going to admit it because he testified
14 about it for the last hour or so just about, and
15 he has certainly identified that this is his work
16 and his evaluation based upon his --

17 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, I disagree about the
18 dates and that he didn't correct it.

19 THE COURT: Well, he corrected it --

20 DR. LAHTENMAA: That's very concerning,
21 especially when I have two different files.
22 That's not good.

23 THE COURT: Well, I don't understand what you
24 mean, "two different files."

25 DR. LAHTENMAA: Exactly. Well, I'll explain

1 it when -- I don't know when I'm supposed to.

2 THE COURT: All right. Well, you can ask him
3 on cross-examination, but you can also explain
4 what you mean by that. Are you talking about two
5 numbers, like, of your license?

6 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, there seems to be that
7 there is two separate files for me. For example,
8 Dr. Treese did the evaluation on 4-16, not on
9 5-16.

10 THE COURT: But he corrected it.

11 DR. LAHTENMAA: He didn't on paper, not on
12 paper. It's not corrected unless it's done on
13 paper.

14 THE COURT: But this is -- I mean, there are
15 mistakes that show up in documents all the time.

16 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yes, and we always write
17 there was a mistake. The actual evaluation was
18 done on April 16th. And you write an addendum.
19 It's not professional, especially in a case like
20 this.

21 THE COURT: I'm going to overrule the
22 objection. The document is admitted. I mean,
23 he's under oath, and he testified that he made a
24 mistake, and he has corrected it under oath.
25 There's no legal requirement that he go back and

1 write an addendum and attach it to that. The
2 point is, he didn't hide the fact that the date
3 was incorrect. He was asked about the date --

4 DR. LAHTENMAA: But it makes it inaccurate.
5 It's not correct.

6 THE COURT: Okay. Well, it is correct.

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: It wasn't done in May.

8 THE COURT: It is corrected now.

9 DR. LAHTENMAA: Not on paper.

10 THE COURT: You know you were there in April,
11 not in May. So, I know you disagree with the
12 substance of the report. If you agreed, you
13 wouldn't be here today, you would have submitted
14 to whatever penalty the Department wanted to
15 impose on you.

16 So, okay, we're moving on from that exhibit.
17 That exhibit is admitted over objection. And I'll
18 note that you objected.

19 The next question was about Exhibits 3, parts
20 1 and 2. They were identified by Ms. Ellis, but
21 I'm not sure that you offered them or did you
22 offer them?

23 (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1 was admitted into
24 evidence.)

25 MR. MORRIS: I thought we did admit exhibits

1 with Ms. Ellis.

2 THE COURT: I thought we did, too. I mean,
3 she identified them, and they are what they are.
4 They are the file from the Department.

5 Do you have an objection to those exhibits?
6 I don't mean necessarily everything contained in
7 them, but the fact that those are the two halves,
8 roughly, of the investigative reports done by the
9 Department of Health. I'm asking you, Dr.
10 Lahteenmaa.

11 DR. LAHTENMAA: What's that? Oh, can I ask
12 him?

13 THE COURT: No. I'm asking you if you object
14 to the reports that were identified? And I think
15 Mr. Morris did offer them in, but I hadn't marked
16 them yet as admitted. The Exhibits 3, part 1 and
17 part 2, the investigative report from the
18 Department.

19 DR. LAHTENMAA: Once they're corrected on
20 the paper, I agree. Until then, I will object.

21 THE COURT: Okay. They're admitted over
22 objection.

23 All right. This is your final witness, Mr.
24 Morris. Are there any other exhibits you want to
25 offer now so they're subject to cross-examination?

1 MR. MORRIS: I think we did have 4, 5, and 6¹⁷⁴
2 admitted, but I think those are the only ones that
3 we need, quite frankly.
4 THE COURT: I don't think 4 was admitted.
5 That's the final order.
6 MR. MORRIS: Oh, that's the Delray --
7 actually, 4 is Delray Medical Center.
8 THE COURT: Right. Are you offering those?
9 MR. MORRIS: Yes, we're offering those.
10 THE COURT: Okay.
11 MR. MORRIS: Those Dr. Treese did review.
12 THE COURT: Okay. Dr. Lahteenmaa, are you
13 objecting to those as well?
14 DR. LAHTENMAA: I don't have them in front
15 of me. I don't know what they are.
16 THE COURT: Well, they're your medical
17 records from Delray Medical Center.
18 DR. LAHTENMAA: They are inaccurate.
19 THE COURT: Okay. Well, you'll have to
20 testify to that. Inaccurate or accurate, they are
21 what they are.
22 DR. LAHTENMAA: They're falsified, as per --
23 THE COURT: They're falsified?
24 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yes, my friend [REDACTED]
25 --

1 THE COURT: Okay, please stop. Please stop. ¹⁷⁵
2 Is she testifying here today?
3 DR. LAHTENMAA: It's on evidence. She says
4 they're lying.
5 THE COURT: Who all is testifying here today?
6 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, on paper she is.
7 THE COURT: No -- okay. Thank you.
8 DR. LAHTENMAA: I submitted the evidence. I
9 don't know why you have to submit evidence if it
10 doesn't count.
11 THE COURT: Submitting evidence and having
12 evidence accepted into the record are two
13 different things.
14 DR. LAHTENMAA: But it was accepted.
15 THE COURT: No, no. You filed it. It wasn't
16 accepted. It was attached to a motion to dismiss,
17 which was denied.
18 DR. LAHTENMAA: No, not this part. No, this
19 is for final hearing.
20 THE COURT: No, no, no. What you filed for
21 final hearing are your exhibits.
22 DR. LAHTENMAA: It's under that.
23 THE COURT: It's in those?
24 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yes. Evidence of Hacking
25 and Whistleblowing Retaliation, Part 3.

1 THE COURT: Okay. Well, you never told me
2 that. There was no objection to them.

3 DR. LAHTENMAA: So it's there.

4 THE COURT: Okay. So if they're in the
5 record, then you can refer to those in your
6 proposed order.

7 Mr. Morris, any other documents you want to
8 offer?

9 MR. MORRIS: That's it. 1 through 6 is all
10 we're offering.

11 THE COURT: Okay. So we have 1 through 6,
12 right? Okay. And then 10?

13 (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 4 was admitted into
14 evidence.)

15 MR. MORRIS: Oh, yes. Actually, 10 we did
16 offer. It wasn't accepted, I think.

17 THE COURT: Yeah, 10 -- I mean, 10 are in,
18 but they're actually in twice because those are
19 the text messages in there.

20 MR. MORRIS: Right, they're also in the --
21 yeah.

22 THE COURT: They're also in, right, Dr.
23 Lahteenmaa's.

24 MR. MORRIS: So, yeah, other than that, we're
25 fine.

1 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you.

2 Now, Dr. Lahteenmaa, it's your opportunity to
3 cross-examine Dr. Treese.

4 DR. LAHTEENMAA: He's on mute.

5 THE COURT: Okay. Well, ask a question. I'm
6 sure he'll unmute.

7 CROSS-EXAMINATION

8 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

9 Q. Can you hear me?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. So, Mr. Burch, my previous lawyer, did
12 he ever tell you, like, I wrote on the notarized
13 subpoena, which Mr. Morris doesn't have a copy of,
14 supposedly, to tell you that I cannot get a hold of
15 you? This is evidence.

16 THE COURT: I have to ask you a question.
17 Mr. Burch was your attorney.

18 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Yes.

19 THE COURT: And you have an attorney-client
20 privilege, so are you waiving that privilege when
21 you ask questions about things that Mr. Burch did
22 or may have included conversations with you?

23 DR. LAHTEENMAA: No, I'm asking if Mr. Burch
24 contacted Dr. Treese because I was not able to,
25 because of the hacking situation, that I cannot

1 get a hold of him. And this is actually noted on ¹⁷⁸
2 evidence that I submitted. It's called Lawyers
3 Barred, 729, PDF. My letter, it's a subpoena --
4 not subpoena, but the notarized interrogatory.

5 THE COURT: I'm going to let you ask your
6 question. I just want to make sure you're not
7 waiving any attorney-client privilege you may have
8 with your lawyer.

9 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, he let me go because I
10 pointed out the child porn pingbacks.

11 THE COURT: Okay. Well then, again, I'm not
12 the Florida Bar, and I'm sure not the Florida
13 Supreme Court.

14 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yes, but what I'm saying is
15 he's not my lawyer anymore.

16 THE COURT: I know that.

17 DR. LAHTENMAA: Okay.

18 THE COURT: You own the privilege, not him.

19 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yeah.

20 THE COURT: Go ahead and ask Dr. Treese. If
21 you want him to look at a document, you have to
22 tell him where it is. He can't see it.

23 DR. LAHTENMAA: Okay. So it's the Lawyers
24 Barred PDF. That's what it's called. It's one of
25 the last ones that I filed.

1 THE COURT: Right, but he doesn't have it.

2 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Okay.

3 THE COURT: Do you have it, Dr. Treese?

4 DR. LAHTEENMAA: I thought he said he looked
5 at the evidence.

6 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

7 Q. So you haven't looked at the evidence?

8 THE COURT: Well, there's a lot of evidence.
9 I mean, this is admitted into evidence, but it
10 doesn't -- he told you what he said he looked at.
11 I'm not going to testify for him.

12 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Well, can I ask? Am I
13 allowed to?

14 THE COURT: You can ask him, but if he
15 doesn't have it in front of him, you have to tell
16 him what it says, what you're asking him about.

17 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Okay. So may I please read
18 this then?

19 MR. MORRIS: Which exhibit is it?

20 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Like I said, it's called
21 Lawyers Barred.

22 MR. MORRIS: Which -- you have stamped
23 exhibits on some of these.

24 THE WITNESS: I have a question also.

25 THE COURT: I'm looking at it, and it just

1 says -- I mean, I've opened the document, and it
2 says, "Lawyers" at the top. In our portal, I have
3 it as Number 5 in the portal. That's not a number
4 on the exhibit.

5 THE WITNESS: Well, I did review some
6 information in the past couple of days that I
7 think was sent by Dr. Lahteenmaa regarding the
8 lawyer, her relationship with the lawyers and her
9 consultation and things like that.

10 DR. LAHTENMAA: Can I read this part?
11 Specifically, I think it's page -- what is this
12 page? It's towards the end. It's not numbered.
13 It's page 22, looks like.

14 MR. MORRIS: Okay. Towards the end, what is
15 it?

16 DR. LAHTENMAA: Page 22.

17 THE COURT: I've numbered these exhibits now
18 because they were unnumbered. I'll just tell you
19 that if you're looking at the DOAH exhibit portal,
20 the first one that says, "Notice of Filing
21 Evidence," I've admitted as Respondent's 1. The
22 second one that says, "Evidence of Hacking and
23 Whistleblower Retaliation, Part 1," I've admitted
24 over objection as Respondent's 2. The third one,
25 Evidence of Hacking and Whistleblower Retaliation,

1 Part 2, I've admitted as Respondent's 3. And
2 Evidence of Hacking and Whistleblower Retaliation,
3 Part 3, I've admitted as Respondent's 4. Lawyers
4 Barred, I've admitted as Respondent's 5. And the
5 Notice of No Witnesses that was filed in the
6 portal as well, I've admitted as Respondent's 6.

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yeah. So this is the 5,
8 Page 22.

9 THE COURT: This is 5.

10 MR. MORRIS: Hold on, let's see. 22, what is
11 on top of it or what's the --

12 THE COURT: I don't see page numbers on
13 these.

14 DR. LAHTENMAA: No, there's no page numbers.
15 It just says, "Lawyers" because the Barred didn't
16 show up. No surprise there because nothing works
17 properly.

18 MR. MORRIS: But what -- on that actual page
19 that you're looking at, what does it say?

20 DR. LAHTENMAA: Oh, the page at the top?

21 MR. MORRIS: Yeah, just the top.

22 DR. LAHTENMAA: Page 22, there's a picture,
23 a photo.

24 THE COURT: Is this from the request for
25 admissions? That's what it looks like. Where it

1 says, "Dr. Treese requested I provide him with the
2 substance abuse testing results, but he never
3 followed through," is that what you're talking
4 about?

5 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yes, that's it.

6 THE COURT: Okay. So it's page 22 of --

7 MR. MORRIS: Oh, I see it, I see it.

8 THE COURT: Okay.

9 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

10 Q. So, is this --

11 MR. MORRIS: I don't know if the witness sees
12 it though.

13 THE COURT: Go ahead and ask your question,
14 and if Dr. Treese doesn't have the document,
15 you're going to have to read it to him.

16 DR. LAHTENMAA: Okay. So, this is the only
17 notarized interrogatory that I did? I was made to
18 do the whole set all over again. This one I'm
19 talking about two sets. This is the notarized
20 set. And, Mr. Morris, I gave you a different set
21 on 12-10, which was not notarized. So, I have two
22 separate files.

23 MR. MORRIS: We agreed we received
24 unnotarized interrogatories.

25 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, this is the only one.

1 I don't know why we did the unnotarized one, then.

2 Beats me.

3 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

4 Q. But this is what it says: "I am still
5 waiting to hear --" the question is -- this is
6 question number 9 for statement: "Respondent did not
7 provide Dr. Treese with substance abuse testing or
8 medical records." And I wrote there, "no answer."
9 Because you're supposed to say admit or deny. And I
10 wrote, "I'm still waiting to hear from him on how to
11 proceed, but he never followed through and e-mailed me
12 like he was supposed to. Additionally, his office is
13 unavailable when I call for some reason. As soon as
14 he replies, I will be glad to comply. I am aware that
15 the government moves slowly, but this is a bit
16 extreme. Please tell him he can e-mail me at my
17 e-mail or call me at my new phone number any day
18 between 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. And please text first,
19 preferably. And please inform him kindly I have been
20 patiently waiting for over six months. Thank you?"

21 And now it has been over a year. I still
22 have not heard from you, Dr. Treese. I never got
23 those e-mails. I tried to call your office. It says,
24 "This phone number is not in service." And I have
25 videos of that. I have photos. So, to say that I

1 didn't follow through is actually the opposite. I
2 never got anything. Which, of course --

3 THE COURT: I'm sorry to interrupt you, Dr.
4 Lahteenmaa, but you're not asking Dr. Treese a
5 question. You're testifying. So, I mean, this
6 sounds like your testimony.

7 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Well, if I'm not interrupted
8 non-stop, I would get to the question.

9 THE COURT: The question should be first.

10 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Well, how can I ask
11 something when I have to read it first? You said
12 he doesn't have it.

13 THE COURT: You read it, and then you started
14 testifying. I mean, when you read the transcript,
15 you're going to see you are testifying. You
16 haven't been sworn in yet, and so I'm not going to
17 accept it as testimony. But it is just filling
18 the record up with forcing me to interrupt you.
19 And I hate interrupting you, but if you don't ask
20 a question, a witness can't give an answer.

21 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Can I ask a question?

22 THE COURT: Please. But you read him the
23 statement. Now ask the question.

24 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

25 Q. Did Mr. Burch ever tell you Heidi cannot get

1 a hold of you?

2 A. No, I never heard from Mr. Burch. Mr. Burch
3 never contacted me.

4 Q. Do you think it's okay to diagnose someone
5 with psychosis, psychotic disorder, delusional
6 disorder, without looking at the evidence I had in my
7 possession when I met with you in April, April 16th,
8 2024?

9 A. That's kind of a compound question.

10 Q. Well, taking into consideration the size of
11 Teladoc, do you think that whistleblowers face grave
12 dangers in the United States?

13 A. I think that your company, Teladoc, behaves
14 like most telepsychiatry companies. They're very
15 assertive and aggressive in their workflow and in
16 their minimizing open slots and booking clients. I
17 think --

18 Q. Do you think whistleblowers face grave
19 dangers?

20 MR. MORRIS: Objection; she's not letting him
21 finish his answer.

22 THE COURT: Well, the question was -- if you
23 can answer that question, answer it. The question
24 was, do you think whistleblowers in this country
25 are at risk of -- was there more? I just heard at

1 risk.

2 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

3 Q. Yeah, face grave dangers. Just the act of
4 whistleblowing against a big company, major. I didn't
5 hear you.

6 A. That's outside my scope. I'm not sure I'm an
7 expert in that category. I don't know.

8 Q. Okay. But you feel it's okay to diagnose me
9 and not being an expert in that or using common sense
10 without looking at the evidence?

11 A. Which question? I hear two questions there.

12 Q. Do you think it's okay to diagnose someone
13 who just told you they whistleblowed, that it's just
14 okay to diagnose them with psychotic disorder without
15 looking at the evidence?

16 A. I think in your case, I strongly encouraged
17 you to provide me with the evidence, but you did not.

18 Q. I had my phones with me. Why would you not
19 look at them?

20 A. (Indiscernible) was accurate or a fair
21 diagnosis.

22 Q. Why would you not look at my phones in a case
23 like this, this severe?

24 A. I strongly encouraged you to provide me with
25 documentation to support your assertion, but you did

1 not provide it and you did not respond to my efforts
2 to reach you.

3 Q. Okay. I told you the reason. When I met
4 with you, why would you not right then and there take
5 a look at my phone?

6 A. I think that's a boundary violation to look
7 into your phone.

8 Q. In a case like this, but it's not a boundary
9 violation to tell somebody, oh, you're psychotic and
10 go against American Psychiatric Association guidelines
11 that specifically --

12 A. (Indiscernible) --

13 Q. -- state you must look at the evidence --

14 THE COURT REPORTER: I'm sorry. This is the
15 court reporter --

16 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

17 Q. -- before diagnosing?

18 THE COURT REPORTER: -- I can only get down
19 one person at a time.

20 THE COURT: And Doctor, that's why I
21 interrupt you because if you're talking when the
22 witness is talking, the court reporter gets down
23 nothing.

24 DR. LAHTENMAA: I would like to be able to
25 be allowed to actually finish my sentence.

1 THE COURT: Well, you have to ask him a
2 question.

3 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Okay.

4 THE COURT: You speak and ask and speak and
5 ask. And witnesses are used to hearing a question
6 like, what is this -- just ask him the question
7 and give him an opportunity to answer. But I
8 think he answered and was still answering it about
9 the boundary issue of looking at your phone.
10 That's his answer. You may not like it, but
11 that's the answer that I heard was he thought
12 there was a boundary issue there in looking at
13 your phone.

14 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

15 Q. So you are saying, Dr. Treese, it's okay
16 because of a boundary issue to diagnose somebody with
17 psychotic disorder without looking at the evidence?

18 A. No. I think that if you have a case where an
19 employee is being persecuted by an employer and I'm
20 asking you whether it be an HR department or a
21 criminal organization, I routinely ask people to
22 provide me with the information. For example, I might
23 say, send me the HR file. And sometimes I get the HR
24 file and I can corroborate or I can question the claim
25 or even refute the claim.

1 In your case, I asked you for the
2 information. You did not provide it because I don't
3 think you have --

4 Q. Actually, it's the opposite. You didn't
5 contact me. Like I said, I have been waiting for a
6 year. Still nothing. Now --

7 A. I let you know at the time of the exam that
8 for me to consider these claims, these assertions you
9 were making, I needed the corroborating information.
10 Without the information, the evaluation just wasn't
11 going to be complete and I made efforts to contact
12 you. You didn't provide the information and you were
13 not able to be reached.

14 Q. I have the information with me.

15 MR. MORRIS: Objection; argumentative.

16 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

17 Q. Again, I could've printed it out. I could've
18 -- if you haven't seen the evidence, then you should
19 not come up with the diagnosis because you don't have
20 the facts.

21 THE COURT: Are you asking him a question?
22 Are you testifying that without evidence, you
23 shouldn't come up with a diagnosis?

24 DR. LAHTENMAA: I asked him what he thinks
25 about that.

1 THE COURT: That is a statement by you.

2 Please ask a question or I'm going to have to keep
3 interrupting you. Mr. Morris has been very
4 patient about not objecting to every single time
5 you make a statement, but you have to ask a
6 question.

7 BY DR. LAHTEENMAA:

8 Q. Why would you not just state that you're
9 unable to make a diagnosis because you don't have the
10 available evidence?

11 A. Because --

12 Q. This evaluation is not complete.

13 A. Because I have everything we're seeing today
14 from you. Your thought pattern, your speech pattern,
15 your thought content, and your overall behavior really
16 makes the diagnosis again today.

17 Q. Have you looked at the evidence on the court
18 website? The whistleblowing evidence? Have you
19 looked at it?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Okay. Why not?

22 A. Which website?

23 Q. Oh, it's on the court website. It's a public
24 website. That's one place.

25 A. I don't think that relates specifically to

1 your case. I think it's only a reference to, you
2 know, broad possibilities of abuse or persecution that
3 may or may not apply to you.

4 Q. So you're saying it's okay when a patient is
5 attacked by the biggest telemedicine company in the
6 world, it's okay just to slap them with a psychosis
7 diagnosis without looking at any of the evidence?
8 Because that's what you did.

9 A. I think that you were asked to provide the
10 evidence, and for about the third time here in the
11 last 15 minutes, I'm saying that you didn't provide
12 it. You told me you had a whole trove of information.
13 I said, just send it along. I gave you my e-mail
14 address. You're welcome to e-mail me the information.
15 I will review it. You didn't do it.

16 Q. Yet you pursue, without the evidence, to
17 still diagnose me?

18 MR. MORRIS: Objection; asked and answered.

19 THE COURT: Okay. He based his diagnosis on
20 the evidence he had at the time, and he waited six
21 months before issuing his report and still didn't
22 get any additional evidence. That's what he said,
23 and he's been testifying for over an hour now.

24 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

25 Q. Why didn't you correct the date?

1 A. As far as the date, I realized maybe about
2 the past two or three weeks that I put the wrong date,
3 so I knew this day was coming that I'd have a chance
4 to correct it on the record, and if the DOH requests,
5 I can be happy to write an addendum, but I think
6 correcting it on the record is also equivalent. But I
7 didn't hide behind it. It's just a simple error.

8 Q. Did you ask me one single question about my
9 symptoms when I met with you?

10 A. I asked about other symptoms that could be
11 related, such as anxiety, sleep issues, depression,
12 things like that. But as far as the symptoms here --

13 Q. No, you didn't.

14 THE COURT: Wait a second. Wait a second,
15 Doctor. Sorry. You can't ask the question and
16 then you give the answer. He gets to give the
17 answer, and when you testify, you get to give your
18 own testimony, and you don't even have to ask
19 yourself questions, but I won't interrupt you
20 unless there's an objection.

21 DR. LAHTENMAA: So I can't point out if
22 someone's lying?

23 THE COURT: If you ask him a question, and he
24 is saying -- and Dr. Treese is giving an answer,
25 while he's talking, you speak over him and say,

1 no, no, no. You're trying to answer the question
2 for him. Just ask him the question, let him
3 answer the question, and when you testify, you can
4 say he was incorrect, and that's not true, and
5 whatever you're going to say in your defense. But
6 just interrupting him with no, no, no, that's
7 really not helping the record, just in terms of
8 the court reporter getting it down accurately.

9 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

10 Q. Did you ask me any symptoms of psychosis?

11 A. No. The reason being, you presented the
12 psychosis spontaneously without me needing to ask
13 about it. Similarly, if somebody presented to me
14 actively bleeding out of a wound, I wouldn't ask them
15 if they're bleeding, because I can see the blood
16 coming out. In this case, the psychosis was so
17 evident, after about 15 minutes, I couldn't stop it
18 from presenting. It is very clear.

19 Q. Why is it on the records, then? You didn't
20 write there on the evaluation, I did not ask the
21 symptom.

22 A. Well, I think the report is meant to be -- to
23 convey the more relevant, necessary information. I
24 would defeat the purpose of the assessment if I was to
25 give a transcript of the full 80 to 90 minutes of our

1 meeting.

2 Q. So you falsified the record?

3 MR. MORRIS: Objection; she's interrupting
4 and not letting him finish his answer again.

5 THE COURT: Doctor, did you finish your
6 answer? You were saying that it would be a very
7 long report if you did a transcript of the entire
8 90 minutes you spent with her.

9 THE WITNESS: Yeah. A professional report
10 like this is meant to be providing part of the
11 actual history of the assessment, but also,
12 probably more importantly, wants to get the
13 evaluator's impression and formulation and
14 recommendations. So writing every single question
15 down is not necessary, it's not indicated. As a
16 psychiatrist, I think that you can understand
17 that.

18 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

19 Q. Did you falsify?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Okay, so on the papers of my evaluation, it
22 actually says there, I did not answer this question,
23 or ask this question, because I didn't see that
24 anywhere. Because if it's a truthful evaluation, and
25 you just said that you didn't ask me any symptoms of

1 psychosis, then you should have written on the
2 evaluation, I did not ask about this --

3 THE COURT: Question --

4 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

5 Q. -- but I didn't see that written. How so?

6 A. I'm sorry, what was the question?

7 Q. You told me you didn't ask me one symptom
8 regarding psychosis. Then the evaluation that you
9 wrote up should reflect that. So when it says there,
10 is Heidi having auditory hallucinations or whatever,
11 it should say, I did not ask her. I did not see that
12 on the report. It implies that you asked me. So
13 doesn't that mean then that it's inaccurate
14 information?

15 A. That sounds more like a rhetorical question.

16 Q. It's very simple. So can you explain that?
17 It's contradictory. You know, if you write on the
18 report, she's having auditory hallucinations, but you
19 just told me, you didn't ask me. At least there
20 should be somewhere on that report, I did not ask her
21 anything about psychosis, any symptoms.

22 A. That's just not how it's done. I don't put
23 down a checklist of all the questions that could be
24 asked or not asked. But --

25 Q. What do --

1 MR. MORRIS: Objection; she's arguing with
2 the witness again.

3 DR. LAHTENMAA: I asked what he based that
4 on.

5 THE COURT: You're interrupting him. He's
6 talking -- you ask him something, he's talking and
7 you're interrupting him. Let him finish his
8 answer and then ask the next question.

9 Go ahead, Doctor.

10 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

11 Q. Dr. Treese?

12 A. Sorry about that. So the question was -- so
13 what was the question?

14 THE COURT: Why didn't you write in your
15 report that you did not ask any questions
16 specifically about what are your symptoms of
17 psychosis?

18 THE WITNESS: Yeah. So in the report, the
19 question, although I didn't write this, but your
20 symptoms of psychosis presented spontaneously, so
21 I just wrote them down in the report, in the
22 presenting problem component part of the exam, but
23 also the mental status exam is there, as well as
24 the formulation. It's there because it presented
25 without need for a question because it just

1 presented spontaneously. It's such a part of your
2 presentation that you don't need to ask the
3 question because you're reporting it, you're
4 presenting it.

5 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

6 Q. It's also as contradictory as when you told
7 me -- or should I say, did you tell me during our
8 exam, Heidi, I believe you? I believe you were
9 hacked. Whistleblowing in a major telemedicine
10 company is no joke. I'm going to try to help you.
11 Did you tell me something along those lines?

12 A. I said, as best as I can recall, this sounds
13 like a terrible experience. I'm going to need all the
14 information you have about this, collateral
15 information, references from your workplace, and
16 everything else that I requested. I need the full
17 assessment. This sounds like a terrible experience.
18 I will do my best to sort this out and make
19 recommendations that will be helpful.

20 Q. Did you say, Heidi, I believe you, I believe
21 you're hacked?

22 A. I never called you Heidi.

23 Q. Okay. Minus that part, did you say, I
24 believe you, I believe you're hacked?

25 A. No, I didn't say that because my gut feeling

1 at the time was that you were not hacked. I felt that
2 you were psychotic and you were having psychotic
3 symptoms at the time. I would have been very
4 surprised if you provided any information to me that
5 would have corroborated your account of it.

6 Q. Wouldn't that be unlikely, given that most
7 physicians in the United States are victims of some
8 sort of cybercrime, per statistics?

9 A. I think that's just off the track here of,
10 you know, in the age of technology we're all being
11 monitored at some level, but that's not the case.
12 That's not what we're doing here today.

13 Q. Doesn't the risk increase if you whistleblow
14 on a major telemedicine company?

15 MR. MORRIS: Objection; relevance.

16 THE COURT: I don't know how the Doctor can
17 answer that question. How can anyone answer that
18 question? You have to bring in, like, the special
19 agent in charge of the FBI field office and say,
20 if you're a whistleblower at a major Teladoc
21 company, are you increasing your chances of being
22 --

23 DR. LAHTENMAA: Thank you, Judge Cohen.
24 Thank you. I have been asking for the FBI to
25 please help. They are nowhere to be found.

1 THE COURT: And guess what?

2 DR. LAHTENMAA: Nowhere to be found, which
3 is surprising.

4 THE COURT: They're not going to come here
5 and testify in a licensure case, unless you
6 subpoena them, and for some reason --

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: I would love to do that. I
8 didn't know that was a possibility.

9 THE COURT: Well, that's -- we really need to
10 try to get to -- do you have a finish to this?
11 Because you've really asked the same question over
12 and over, and he -- I'm sorry. Dr. Treeese has
13 said multiple times now, and I think the record
14 will clearly reflect it, that he believed from his
15 conversations with you and his evaluation with you
16 on the date of your 90-minute visit with him,
17 April 16, 2024, that the evidence of psychosis was
18 presented by you through your conversation with
19 him and the information that he was getting from
20 you through the questions he asked.

21 DR. LAHTENMAA: May I ask --

22 THE COURT: I don't think he's going to say,
23 and I think he's said this three times he's not
24 going to say this, I should ask you, please tell
25 me what evidence you have of -- that you're having

1 a psychotic break. That doesn't sound like it
2 would be a very good psychiatric technique, if you
3 ask a lay person.

4 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

5 Q. Dr. Treese?

6 THE COURT: He let you -- he asks you
7 questions, he let you talk about the issues that
8 you're facing, and from that he concluded that --
9 that he believes there is a -- you're suffering
10 from psychosis of unspecified origin.

11 BY DR. LAHTENMAA:

12 Q. Dr. Treese?

13 A. Yes?

14 Q. Do you think it's very unusual that somebody
15 who whistleblows on the biggest telemedicine company
16 in the world, everyone, Florida Department of State,
17 Department of Health, everyone, all of you, your
18 psychiatrists, everyone refuses forensic evaluation of
19 my devices?

20 MR. MORRIS: Objection. This is beyond his
21 scope.

22 THE COURT: What does that have to do with
23 Dr. Treese's evaluation of you? You're testifying
24 about something that --

25 DR. LAHTENMAA: I'm asking, isn't it a

1 little bit unusual that everyone, every medical
2 center --

3 THE COURT: Please, Doctor, please. We're
4 not going to go down this road. You have --

5 DR. LAHTENMAA: Why not?

6 THE COURT: Because it's not relevant. This
7 case is about an evaluation by you based upon a
8 complaint and nothing more.

9 DR. LAHTENMAA: But that's the most relevant
10 part.

11 THE COURT: Dr. Treese does not work -- at
12 least you haven't shown that he works for Teladoc,
13 that he was part of a conspiracy, that he was
14 somehow tied into this whole thing. I mean,
15 you're really trying to put your words into his
16 mouth and it's not -- we're not getting there.

17 So I would prefer that when you're
18 testifying, you tell your version of this with
19 what you think should have been done and whatever.
20 I mean, the Doctor, his report is here. It's 10
21 pages long. You've gone through a lot of it. His
22 lawyer went through the entire report with him.
23 And if you have specific questions about what's in
24 the report, but you keep going back to, wouldn't
25 anyone agree that if you're a whistleblower

1 against the largest telemedicine company in the
2 country or in the world, that you might suffer
3 some consequences for having done that? I don't
4 know how --

5 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, we're just arguing.

6 THE COURT: It's not a question to a
7 layperson. It's a question to some type of cyber
8 expert or some legal expert that would opine on
9 what causes people to suffer if they go up against
10 a big corporate entity.

11 DR. LAHTENMAA: Why have I been denied that?
12 I've been asking. This is part of the evaluation
13 that Florida Department of Health should do. Yet
14 they deny and they have continued to deny forensic
15 evaluation of my devices. Now we're just arguing
16 and everybody's giving their opinions. I like
17 facts. And it's very easy; do the evaluation. Is
18 she hacked? Is she not? This isn't math. This
19 is not art. It's very easy to determine that
20 versus just everybody coming here and giving -- -

21 THE COURT: And you may not agree with this,
22 but Dr. Treese testified -- are you still there?
23 Looks like you froze.

24 Are you back? You froze for a minute. Can
25 you hear us?

1 DR. LAHTENMAA: I'm back. I can hear you.

2 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you.

3 Dr. Treese testified that he asked for you
4 and he put in his report that, I'm looking at the
5 report here under the section on collateral
6 information, professional and personal contacts,
7 records that could elaborate on her account of
8 what she reported has happened to her over the
9 past three years, and treatment records were
10 requested and were not provided by her.

11 He did not base his report on those records
12 because he wrote in, when he wrote the report, he
13 said he had asked for those things and you had not
14 provided them.

15 DR. LAHTENMAA: I cannot do a forensic
16 evaluation of my own devices. This has to be done
17 by a professional appointed by Florida Department
18 of Health. It is your job.

19 THE COURT: What does that have to do with --
20 it's not my job. It's not Dr. Treese's job. He's
21 a psychiatrist.

22 DR. LAHTENMAA: I'm talking about in
23 general, Florida Department of Health when they do
24 investigations.

25 THE COURT: I'm not even going to ask you

1 what you did with it, because it's not relevant to²⁰⁴
2 the issues here.

3 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, it's the biggest -- it
4 is.

5 THE COURT: No, the biggest relevance to your
6 issues --

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: (Indiscernible), oh, my
8 gosh, she's not psychotic.

9 THE COURT: All right.

10 DR. LAHTENMAA: She's actually hacked, all
11 her devices.

12 THE COURT: Do you have any new questions for
13 Dr. Treese? Because we're about to move on.

14 DR. LAHTENMAA: No, that's it.

15 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Morris, any more
16 questions for Dr. Treese?

17 MR. MORRIS: No, no more questions.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you, Dr. Treese.

19 THE WITNESS: Take care, everybody.

20 MR. MORRIS: Thank you.

21 THE COURT: Have a good rest of your day.
22 Mr. Morris, do you have anything further?

23 MR. MORRIS: No further witnesses from the
24 Department. The Department rests.

25 THE COURT: Okay. The Department has rested

1 its case.

2 We're going to take a 10-minute break. And
3 when we come back, Dr. Lahteenmaa, it is your turn
4 to present your case. Okay? So when we come
5 back, I'm going to swear you in, and you'll have
6 the opportunity to testify to the fullest extent
7 as to why the Department should not impose what
8 it's trying to do to you.

9 DR. LAHTEENMAA: How many hours do I have for
10 that?

11 THE COURT: How much time?

12 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Yeah.

13 THE COURT: Well, let's hear how we get
14 going. I mean, how much time do you need?

15 DR. LAHTEENMAA: If I go through all the
16 evidence, it'll take months.

17 THE COURT: Oh, my gosh. You're going to get
18 two hours roughly, two-and-a-half hours, but we're
19 not going to take two months. I mean, come on.

20 DR. LAHTEENMAA: That's how (indiscernible) I
21 am.

22 THE COURT: It's not really -- you think it's
23 funny now, but it's not really funny.

24 DR. LAHTEENMAA: No, it's not funny.

25 THE COURT: Because we're not --

1 DR. LAHTENMAA: But it's true.

2 THE COURT: This lawsuit, this case is not
3 about a whistleblower suit. I'm not going to make
4 rulings on a whistleblower suit. I can't. It's
5 not before us today. This proceeding is not about
6 the dispute you have with your attorney, and I
7 think attorneys generally --

8 DR. LAHTENMAA: I don't have a dispute with
9 him.

10 THE COURT: Oh, well, you filed a grievance
11 against him. That sounds like a dispute to me.
12 But that's fine. But this proceeding is not about
13 that.

14 So I want you to tell me why the Department,
15 the case they just put on, is -- they're wrong. I
16 mean, that's basically what you have to prove, is
17 that they have the burden of proving by clear and
18 convincing evidence that you are unable to
19 practice with reasonable skill and safety. And
20 now it's your opportunity -- they may have
21 presented that case, and now it's your opportunity
22 to say, tell them, and me, why they're wrong.

23 And then when it's all said and done, I'll
24 get to write an order about it and figure it out
25 from the evidence presented and from what you say

1 in your testimony.

2 So we'll be back at 2:30. In recess until
3 then, and then we'll get started with your
4 testimony.

5 (Recess.)

6 THE COURT REPORTER: This is the court
7 reporter, Your Honor. I'm back.

8 THE COURT: Thank you.

9 THE COURT REPORTER: You're welcome.

10 THE COURT: Okay, everyone's back.

11 Dr. Lahteenmaa, the Department has rested its
12 case. It's your opportunity now to testify, so if
13 you'd raise your right hand, please.

14 Do you swear or affirm the testimony you'll
15 give in this proceeding will be the truth, the
16 whole truth and nothing but the truth?

17 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Yes, I do.

18 THE COURT: And will you state your name for
19 the record, although I think the court reporter
20 certainly has your name. Go ahead.

21 DR. LAHTEENMAA: Heidi Marjaana Lahteenmaa.

22 THE COURT: And you don't have to ask any
23 questions, unless you have a question for me. So
24 you can just testify. You don't have to ask a
25 question and answer your own question. So that's

1 the beauty of testifying on your own behalf.

2 So if there's an objection, please pause so I
3 can deal with the objection, but there shouldn't
4 be a whole lot of interruptions.

5 DR. LAHTENMAA: Do I refer to the evidence
6 as I go?

7 THE COURT: Yes. If you want us to look at
8 something as you're testifying, then tell us what
9 to look at, and we will.

10 DR. LAHTENMAA: Okay. So, well, I guess we
11 should start from the beginning, and I'll try to
12 make it as painless as possible, this whole thing.
13 Evidence of hacking a whistleblower, retaliation,
14 part one. First page. So this is a copy of the
15 contract I made with Jacob Tubbs, Bryce Armstrong,
16 regarding the Teladoc whistleblowing. And he told
17 me, after about three weeks of me gathering
18 evidence, I was making it extremely detailed. He
19 told me, be really careful, because Teladoc likely
20 sees everything that you do on that laptop. Can
21 see everything you type, knows everything you
22 type, and basically everything you do on that
23 laptop. Well, of course it was too late. So I
24 guess they were using the bossware to watch me do
25 the whistleblowing report.

1 So I had the contract with Bryce Armstrong.
2 It's right there. So my first grievance is that
3 nobody from the Florida Department of Health ever
4 contacted Bryce Armstrong even though I asked
5 multiple times to verify my story. Take a look at
6 the evidence. Take a look at the beautiful,
7 extremely detailed PowerPoint of about 26
8 gigabytes of Teladoc whistleblowing material.
9 Including patient rotation layers, charges of over
10 \$6,000 for follow-up under my name. I have copies
11 of those on the court website. I think actually
12 there was a \$4,000 bill for 15-minute follow-up.
13 But there was up to \$6,000.

14 So I discovered three different layers. And
15 every time you click and refresh the screen, a new
16 layer will pop up. So basically they had blocked
17 your schedule. And then you would click refresh,
18 and it would open up more 15-minute slots. That's
19 how they would rotate them. So either way, this
20 was a very, very detailed PowerPoint with tons of
21 evidence. And so I worked on it for a long time.

22 So basically, I feel it's very unfair that
23 nobody contacted Bryce Armstrong to discuss this
24 versus just accusing me, oh, no, you're psychotic.
25 So that's issue number one.

1 Then the second problem is that I had asked
2 Florida Department of Health multiple times to
3 contact the FBI to verify this. Yet, no one
4 contacted me that I know of. And it's absolutely
5 horrible to leave somebody in that situation. I
6 live by myself. I had just moved. I'm doing this
7 report. Jacob tells me, Heidi, they're probably
8 watching you. But too late.

9 So I got cyberattacked. I have tons of
10 evidence that I have posted. Somebody broke into
11 my home. They placed whatever devices they can
12 hack you or crack you or whatever. Blocked my
13 Uber. I couldn't get out anywhere to leave. The
14 Uber would stop. My phone calls were stopped. My
15 internet was stopped. I was essentially kept as a
16 prisoner for over a year. I have posted my
17 diaries, some of them, to the Florida Department
18 of Health site. I wasn't allowed to leave. What
19 am I going to do? Walk to the airport? I had
20 sold my car. So I snuck out a letter to the FBI.
21 I sent it from my neighbor's mailbox, hoping that
22 it would get to them, which it did.

23 So, it is so wrong for the Florida Department
24 of Health to do what you do. Not to contact them,
25 not to verify anything after this hell. It's such

1 an easy thing to do. Just pick up the phone, call
2 them, or call Jacob. But you didn't do it. So
3 here I am, tormented by this cyberattack, who
4 blocked every single thing I do. All my phone
5 calls, my transportation, my e-mails. My medical
6 licenses get canceled by them.

7 I walked to my neighbor's house. [REDACTED] is
8 the only one I knew who could help me. His
9 internet gets hacked. His phone gets hacked.
10 Somebody places some walkie-talkie in his home. I
11 do police reports. Tons of them. They don't do
12 anything. I go to the FBI a couple of times.
13 They just give me weird tasks to do, like go get
14 copies of your police reports. Can't they get
15 them? What do I need to get them for? None of it
16 made any sense.

17 I'm fighting with Teladoc; you have the
18 evidence, some of it. And to top it all off, the
19 worst thing is, with somebody in this situation,
20 you would think there's some whistleblowing
21 protection, right? You would think. So I call
22 Governor DeSantis' office multiple times. You
23 know what they tell me? They tell me, Heidi, we
24 cannot help you. I said, why? Why can't you help
25 me? You are the head of the Florida Department of

1 Health. They said, we cannot help you. These
2 orders come from D.C. I call the FBI. They said
3 they're trying to help me. What does that even
4 mean? What do you mean trying to help me? So you
5 mean you're struggling? Who is the enemy?

6 I was approached by a Chinese man called Wu
7 after my whistleblowing. I go to T-Mobile. I've
8 never seen him before. He goes to buy a SIM card.
9 And he looks at me. He says, I'm so sorry we had
10 to take away your phone. And he was smiling.
11 They thought it was funny. So I go outside, and
12 he wants to go have a cup of coffee at Starbucks
13 or somewhere. So I didn't go. So I knew
14 essentially I was their prisoner.

15 So then comes Bobby. This is a year later.
16 I've been tortured and tormented for a year. I
17 decide again who knows who they are. There's tons
18 of bots that would show up in the evening.
19 Usually around 9 o'clock. They would disappear in
20 the morning around 9 o'clock. So I was fighting
21 with them trying to get control of the router.
22 But either way. So I was fighting with them for a
23 year doing different things, trying to get rid of
24 them.

25 What do you do? I don't know what to do in

1 that situation. So I figured I'll call Bobby.
2 He's really good with computers. So he comes. He
3 flies over. It's in November or on Thanksgiving.
4 It's after a year. It's like November 2023. I
5 was on January 2023. So he comes over with his
6 dad's government cell phone. I show him the
7 Teladoc subpoena. They have subpoenaed patient's
8 medical records from me, which makes no sense. I
9 don't know the medical records. It's Teladoc.
10 Why would they get them from me?

11 I show them to Bobby. He sees patients --
12 these problems that I was having, problems with
13 the system. I wasn't the only one. Dr. [REDACTED],
14 [REDACTED] Also (Indiscernible) [REDACTED] who
15 signed up with Teladoc, but I don't think she ever
16 saw a patient from them. But [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
17 did. And Dr. [REDACTED] So we were all
18 having problems. I had tons of text messages
19 about them. Similar problems, you know, patient
20 rotations. I would see [REDACTED]'s patients. They
21 would tell me I can't get into [REDACTED] schedule.
22 I'd call [REDACTED] He's in Miami. Say, hey, I just
23 saw your patient. They're telling me your
24 schedule is full. I was like, no, it's not. I
25 have a whole system full of hosts. Same thing.

1 So we would just talk about these issues.

2 Anyways, so Bobby comes over in November. He
3 sees all these problems. Well, not all of them.
4 You know, a few. And he makes this report, a
5 complaint. So then there's of course tons of
6 problems with the report itself. Like I have
7 said, and you both should be aware of my
8 grievances, regarding this whole thing like no
9 signed initial complaint, no primary care, all the
10 attempts to get a lawyer are being stopped. If I
11 get one it's sabotaged, like with -- well, with
12 Jacob for example. He said he cannot be my lawyer
13 because I'm hacked. And then Mr. Burch let me go
14 because of the -- the child porn pingbacks. I had
15 a couple other lawyers but they let me go too.
16 Usually there's somebody calls in between. It's
17 intercepted somehow.

18 So that's another problem. That's one of the
19 biggest problems. And this procedure overall to
20 one license with two dates of issuance. My other
21 license is canceled by hackers. All my devices
22 still being hacked. I actually took them in a
23 place in Florida and they have to attach their
24 system to mine. And his phone rings. He goes
25 away, he comes back in five minutes, and he says,

1 "Never mind, we can't help you." I said, "Why?"
2 He said, "This hacking is way too advanced for
3 us." So he wouldn't help me.

4 I have a problem with Florida Department of
5 Health ignoring the evidence from my friends and
6 my family and me who says I'm clearly hacked. I'm
7 probably in danger because I think the -- I think
8 the organized crime had hacked into Teladoc
9 systems and I was employed then so incidentally
10 and the cybergangs, because I made a fake Uber
11 account. A mafia came to pick me up from Palm
12 Beach. And I knew they knew who I was. They
13 didn't know my name, they didn't know anything
14 because it was a fake account. They didn't have
15 my picture. But when he dropped me off he said --
16 I said I'll give him the tip on the app. And he
17 said, "Okay, thank you, Doctor." He told me he
18 was mafia, and his dad was mafia also. I think
19 they had hacked into Teladoc systems. So I think
20 that might be a problem.

21 So, yeah, I don't see how any of this process
22 is fair at this point you know, especially without
23 a lawyer. I mean, I'm being told I'm impaired,
24 severely psychotic. Yet, my motions are accepted.
25 And I don't know how in depth I would even go

1 about the Administrative problems. I think you
2 have most of those. Can I just skip those? Or
3 how does that work? It doesn't count if I don't
4 talk about them?

5 THE COURT: I don't understand what you mean.

6 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, you know the
7 administrative problems like the second license
8 and, you know, things like that that I have
9 already talked about in my motions. Do I have
10 to --

11 THE COURT: I mean, how is that second --
12 second license number affected your ability to
13 practice when you were practicing and your ability
14 to --

15 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well -- well, I think it's a
16 big problem. You know, everybody says, oh, you're
17 psychotic. Okay, well, how do you explain that I
18 was given an M.D. -- M.D. certification instead of
19 a D.O.? Why do I have two social security
20 numbers? You know, why do I have two licenses?
21 Literally all my doctor friends said, no, that's
22 not possible. I don't believe you. It's
23 impossible. Nobody can have two active licenses.
24 They have never heard of it.

25 So obviously something is wrong. This is not

1 normal. I should not be called an M.D., my board
2 certification. I should not have two different
3 social security numbers. One of them, the wrong
4 one ended up in my taxes. There has been verified
5 hacking to my tax accounts and my Bitcoin. It was
6 actually on the news. Elite tax, who I used, they
7 were charged with like 20 million dollar fraud or
8 something. It's on the news. So that is
9 all linked to all these fraud.

10 IRS has me as an identity theft victim. Yet,
11 Florida Department of Health will not verify
12 anything. And you guys keep just tormenting me.
13 It's absolutely horrible to do that to somebody
14 who is a whistleblower. And then I get this on
15 top of that. It's inhumane. I cannot even put it
16 into words. That's why I use words like torture.
17 It is psychological torture to take away something
18 that you have worked 20 years for, taking super
19 good care of your patients. I have tons of
20 letters from my patients. And do my due
21 diligence, to report fraud. And this is what I
22 get despite all the whistleblower protections.

23 It's just more abuse essentially from the
24 place that should protect me. The state of
25 Florida should protect me, but they don't. The

1 FBI, they did when they first came, because I know
2 I was able to log on to Teladoc. I don't know
3 what happened after that. Because the hacking
4 just would not stop, it would just get worse. I
5 have no idea what happened there.

6 So yeah, so there's tons of human rights
7 violations. Civil rights violations. False
8 imprisonment. I have tons of evidence about that.
9 Taking all that in consideration, nothing about
10 this process is fair. Plus the issues with the
11 process itself. So there's constitutional
12 violations and unlawful restraint of liberty and
13 abuse of administrative authority and procedural
14 irregularities.

15 I actually did this complaint, and I took it
16 to Interpol in Lisbon. And they knew about this.
17 I said, "Can you please make them stop?" This is
18 not okay after two and a half years, to take away
19 my career, take away my income. I worked for one
20 and a half years. Because of cyberhacking. I
21 must be the only person in the world who reports
22 cyberhacking and gets labeled as psychotic.
23 Nobody looks at the evidence. No one. Nobody
24 calls the FBI. Nobody calls Jacob. Nothing.
25 Nothing gets done.

1 My health insurance gets cancelled by
2 hackers. On August 12th, I called the FBI at NSA.
3 I said you have to help me. Now they cancelled my
4 health insurance. I need a biopsy for the breast
5 mass. What did they do? Admit me under Baker Act
6 for five days. No BA-32. They have no legal
7 right to keep me there for five days, but they
8 did.

9 And after my discharge, all my medical
10 appointments were cancelled. The biopsy, I was
11 going to pay cash. Judah Friedman ordered it from
12 Florida Cancer Center. I was going to pay cash
13 for it because I had no health insurance. All of
14 those got cancelled. I was harassed and tormented
15 to the point I had to leave the United States in
16 January. I figured I'm never going to get medical
17 care there. I tried. I had waited. They got
18 cancelled at the last minute.

19 So I go on the boat, in a ferry around the
20 world. It continues on the boat. I ask the
21 captain, Frank -- I can't remember his last
22 name -- I said, "What's going on?" He said, "I
23 cannot help the situation because these orders
24 come from the government." And it's Holland
25 America, so it was under US orders.

1 So I'm getting anemic. I get off in Lisbon.
2 I drag myself to Interpol or Policia Judiciary.
3 They already know about all this. I didn't even
4 have to explain anything. They said, "You have to
5 go to the hospital." I said I know because my
6 hemoglobin was low. Only in Portugal did I get
7 medical help. In five days -- within five days, I
8 had seen a specialist, I got imaging and a
9 surgery. I was going to die from anemia probably.
10 I was passing out on the boat from low hemoglobin
11 because I was denied medical care in the United
12 States. Somebody cancelled it. Somebody
13 cancelled my health insurance and my follow-ups.
14 This is how bad the torment is and the targeting.

15 So then I recovered in Portugal. I was there
16 three months. I go back to Policia Judiciary. I
17 said, they're taking away my income. They're
18 ruining my career because they're saying I'm
19 psychotic when I reported cyberhacking. And you
20 know what they said? They said Americans are
21 crazy. This would never happen in Portugal.
22 There's no way they would admit you for psychosis.

23 I said, "I need help." You know, when I went
24 through the first time, I said, "I don't know what
25 hospital to go to. I'm afraid because Teladoc is

1 in Portugal. Mafia is all over." They said, "If²²¹
2 you need help with mafia, you came to the right
3 place. We're one of the best of the best." And
4 they are. I got the best care in Portugal. They
5 hid my records in the hospital. I am so grateful.
6 Without going there, I would have never gotten
7 help. Had I taken the boat back to the United
8 States, I would have been tormented by mafia,
9 Teladoc, Florida Department of Health, U.S.
10 government because they probably don't know what
11 to do with this case. Thank God I got off in
12 Portugal. I think Interpol and Policia Judiciary
13 saved my life. I would have passed out at some
14 point just like I did in the boat.

15 So now I'm in Finland. And the reason I keep
16 bringing this up is this, what is happening here
17 is so unfair. I am denied all the rights that a
18 person should have, right to counsel, fair
19 process, all ignored even though this is verified.
20 Verified by Governor DeSantis, Interpol, they told
21 me to go to DIAP, Which is a court in Lisbon where
22 you can go complain about the FBI operations in
23 Portuguese soil. Because I told them they were
24 too intense. They are not allowed to target me
25 and take away my livelihood, my career, everything

1 else. Because that means I cannot afford health
2 insurance and go get treatment for this lump that
3 still needs biopsy. And they said, "Well, you
4 have to go to court and file." So I did.

5 So yeah, it's a very complex case. I cannot
6 see how this is anything but retaliation at this
7 point. Take into consideration how nothing is
8 verified and literally nothing good has happened
9 even since after I got -- when the FBI came, and
10 when I have been in Miramar a couple of times to
11 talk to them. I'm sure they got plenty of data.
12 But as far as my individual case, it's not getting
13 better. It's getting worse. Now I'm going to
14 lose my license. What I'm going to do? What am I
15 going to do? Stocks? I don't know.

16 So yeah, there's plenty of -- all kinds of
17 violations. Actually, I wrote a list about all
18 violations, legal violations. But it would take
19 hours, literally, to go through all this. So I
20 don't think there's much point in doing that, I
21 mean, stating every single legal violation, like
22 by number. So I think that's plenty, though. I
23 don't know what else to say.

24 I just -- I guess, you know they say, if you
25 see something, say something. Better think twice

1 if you're in medicine, medical field. Because
2 will the government have your back? I don't know.
3 I don't think they will. Not when it comes to big
4 corporations. I don't think they will. So yeah,
5 it's just more retaliation. I guess, no one will
6 actually look at the evidence, which I just carry
7 with me all over the place. Which gets old. What
8 am I supposed to do, drop it off somewhere? I
9 don't know what else to say. I don't know what
10 I'm supposed to say. Isn't that enough? I don't
11 know what else to say. I think I'm done.

12 THE COURT: Mr. Morris, do you have any
13 questions for Dr. Lahteenmaa?

14 MR. MORRIS: Just a few.

15 CROSS-EXAMINATION

16 BY MR. MORRIS:

17 Q. First of all, did you say you're in Finland
18 now?

19 A. Yeah, I just got here a couple of days ago.

20 Q. Okay. You're aware that all the evaluation
21 recommended was that you be treated and go to PRN,
22 correct?

23 A. Yeah, I'm aware of that recommendation.

24 Q. And why won't you go to PRN?

25 A. Well, one thing is, it's not going to help

1 with hacking. I haven't taken Adderall for a long
2 time. Last time I filled it was over a year ago. But
3 guess what? I'm still hacked. All my devices are
4 still hacked. And PRN, I have no health insurance. I
5 haven't worked for one and a half years. I got a
6 \$50,000 bill from Delray. Getting a lawyer, that's
7 probably going to be \$40,000. I still have \$6,000 in
8 student loans. Just basic living on top of that.
9 When you're not working, and you're just living off
10 stock money, I would go to PRN, pay cash, go to the
11 United States without a lawyer, after I whistleblow on
12 Teladoc. I mean, I did that. That alone is
13 dangerous. Minus all the other stuff. And you know I
14 did that because there's a contract.

15 So, going to the United States, it just seems
16 absolutely insane. Going to PRN, which is not going
17 to help. I'm just going to argue with them.
18 Remember, I was held at Delray with a BA-32 for five
19 days. That's illegal.

20 Q. You had physicians sign off on that, you
21 being held, correct?

22 A. There was so much confusion about that paper.
23 I never saw anybody. You're supposed to have the
24 BA-32 after three days. I don't have copies of that.
25 I've got all my medical files from Delray. I was

1 asking for a lawyer. I wasn't given one. I asked to
2 see a social worker. I wasn't given one. [REDACTED]
3 [REDACTED](phonetic) was given as my proxy. Yet, the
4 evidence that I brought up earlier, right here,
5 Evidence of Hacking a Whistleblower Retaliation Part
6 3, Exhibit 32, it says there on the bottom of the
7 page, "New collateral per friend, [REDACTED] Medical
8 Proxy." Then it goes on.

9 But the text message with me and [REDACTED], I
10 said, "did you sign some papers for me ever?" [REDACTED]
11 says, "No, never". Well, that's illegal then, what
12 they did per proc. No surprise there. As they
13 assigned you illegally as my guardian, proxy. What it
14 sounds like, basically, is that you and [REDACTED] both are
15 saying, oh yeah, she's psychotic. And [REDACTED] says,
16 well, I think spinning a web of a lie for what I said
17 and how they said, if that is, the quote is illegal
18 too, Heidi. And this is --

19 Q. Now -- now, you've indicated that you were
20 held incommunicado; is that correct?

21 A. I don't know what the wording is. I just
22 Googled it. Mostly incommunicado, but I don't know if
23 that's the right legal word because there's not a lot
24 to reference to the case like this. Actually, I don't
25 think there has ever been a case like, honestly, where

1 a physician is taken as a hostage -- not as a hostage,
2 but a prisoner for two and a half years. And all the
3 --

4 Q. Now, you --

5 A. -- (indiscernible).

6 Q. Now, you had the ability to have somebody
7 independently examine all of your devices at some
8 point, correct?

9 A. I went in Florida. They refused. They said
10 this hacking is way too complex for us. I went to an
11 actual place --

12 Q. To where?

13 A. -- a professional. It was in Florida, north
14 of Palm Beach. I think it's -- I can't remember now
15 the name of it. But it's a place -- it's a business
16 that helps you with cybersecurity and they can get rid
17 of hackers and whatever in your system. It helps
18 other businesses. That's all they do. And they said,
19 "We cannot help you".

20 Q. And you wanted the Florida Department of
21 Health to examine all of your devices, correct?

22 A. Well, I think being a state agency, they can
23 do more, you know, versus just an individual company,
24 you know. But again, I don't know.

25 Q. Why would we have the expertise to do that?

1 A. Well, from what I read on the internet, you
2 know, that's what it says. That if you ask for
3 forensic evaluation cases like this, you're supposed
4 to be given one, and they're supposed to evaluate all
5 the evidence, including calling the FBI, including
6 calling Jacob, ordering forensic examination of my
7 devices. That's what it says.

8 Q. Do you think that by forensic examination,
9 they mean evaluation of your medical and physical
10 condition by a doctor?

11 A. No, devices. And Mr. Morris, Governor
12 DeSantis, their office said these orders come from
13 D.C. The boat captain said these are government
14 orders. I cannot do anything. Policia Judiciary and
15 Interpol, they told me we cannot stop the FBI
16 operations in Portugal. They confirmed this. This
17 was last week. They told me go to the court to get
18 out. Guess what? They took my complaint. They
19 didn't turn me away and say, oh, you're psychotic.
20 They took it, the whole thing.

21 Q. How many people are involved in this
22 conspiracy against you?

23 A. It's not, well, conspiracy. You can call it
24 whatever you want. But have you read Mr. Burch's
25 interrogatory that was notarized? You would know. I

1 listed them there. I put a lot of work to it. I
2 don't know why I had to do it twice. I guess I can
3 pull it up and tell you, but it's a ton of people that
4 I have actually talked to, reported this to, in hopes
5 that, you know, how weird is it? Can you imagine?
6 Now, you go and you look at the news. Pretty much the
7 entire United States has been hacked.

8 MR. MORRIS: No further questions, Your
9 Honor.

10 DR. LAHTENMAA: So I'm just saying, it's
11 kind of weird. If any decision anywhere in the
12 United States calls, they work for the biggest
13 telemedicine company in the world. They call the
14 FBI and say, hey, I have been hacked, please help
15 me. Nobody comes. How odd is that? That's not
16 normal.

17 Again, whistleblowers don't get any help in
18 the United States. They just get retaliated
19 against. And you can tell me all day long that
20 I'm psychotic, but at the end of the day, you
21 might want to look at the evidence.

22 MR. MORRIS: No further questions, Your
23 Honor.

24 THE COURT: Thank you.

25 Doctor, any further testimony you want to

1 give?

2 DR. LAHTENMAA: Well, just to think that I
3 don't -- I would prefer facts versus just tons of
4 people getting together giving their opinions.
5 It's a very easy case. I'm either hacked or I'm
6 not. I'm either delusional about it or I'm not.
7 I'm either impaired or I'm not. If I'm so
8 impaired, why are we talking? Shouldn't you be
9 talking to [REDACTED] Or somebody?

10 So -- so it never had to get to this point,
11 to this level of torment. It's absolutely
12 horrible. It's inhumane. When it comes out, it's
13 not going to look good. It's going to look awful.
14 That whistleblower in Florida, the doctor was
15 treated like this. It's not going to look good.
16 And it shouldn't because what has been done, it is
17 the biggest injustice. It really is.

18 And it could be lethal because it's not just
19 minor retaliation. My career has been ruined. My
20 income has been ruined. Health insurance
21 cancelled. I was slapped with a \$50,000 bill for
22 asking, begging for help. All my biopsies
23 cancelled to the point that I had to leave the
24 United States only to get help in Portugal where
25 they're like, Americans are crazy. Don't worry.

1 We're not going to Baker Act you. Because I said
2 I'm afraid to go to the hospital because last time
3 when I did that in Florida, that's what they did.
4 They said don't worry. If you have a mafia after
5 you, you came to the right place. Nobody told me
6 I was crazy. How nice was that to get validated
7 after so long? So yeah, it's not going to look
8 good. It's going to look awful.

9 Yeah, so it could be deadly because still,
10 you know, you can take away my license. Go ahead.
11 But you also ruin my career, my finances, and
12 there's no way I'm going to take with all these
13 bills that I have, go to the hospital and be like,
14 oh, yeah, here's another \$15,000, get a biopsy.
15 Not going to happen. Same thing with the PRN; I'm
16 not going to come to the United States without a
17 lawyer, go to the PRN and for what? Pay cash,
18 there goes -- what am I going to have left? I
19 suppose that's what everybody wants. I don't
20 know.

21 It seems weird that no positive events have
22 happened at all. Nothing. It's no positive
23 improvement. It's just more retaliation and
24 harassment. So yeah, I should be upset. I'm
25 responding appropriately. I think most people

1 would be even more upset. They probably would
2 have been violent by now. But that's not me. I
3 don't like violence.

4 I don't have anything else to say.

5 THE COURT: Anything further, Mr. Morris?

6 MR. MORRIS: I have nothing further, Your
7 Honor.

8 THE COURT: So, I mentioned at the beginning
9 of the hearing that you have the opportunity to
10 file proposed recommended orders. The normal time
11 is 10 days from the date of the filing of the
12 transcript with DOAH. Does that work? Do you
13 need more time? Whatever you need, fine.

14 MR. MORRIS: We're fine with that, Your
15 Honor.

16 THE COURT: Okay.

17 DR. LAHTENMAA: File what now?

18 THE COURT: Proposed order. What you want me
19 to find in here, you have the opportunity to
20 submit a proposed order based on what ruling I
21 make in the case. Whether you submit it or not, I
22 have to still make -- write my order and make a
23 decision, recommendation to the Board of
24 Osteopathic Medicine.

25 And that's 10 days from the date of the

1 filing of the transcript. The court reporter will
2 file the transcript and then a notice will go out
3 electronically that the transcript has been filed
4 and that starts the clock.

5 DR. LAHTENMAA: So I have to do something 10
6 days after that, within 10 days?

7 THE COURT: Right. If you want. If you
8 don't want to, you don't have to. But you can put
9 in writing your argument and what you want me to
10 rule in the case. But whether you do that or not,
11 I still have to review the record and make my
12 ruling.

13 DR. LAHTENMAA: Oh, so I still have to state
14 that in writing, what I want you to do?

15 So, Judge Cohen, you know what I want you to
16 do.

17 THE COURT: I know what you want me to do.
18 It's just -- you know.

19 DR. LAHTENMAA: That's a lot of paperwork.

20 THE COURT: Hand you a brand new license or
21 one license, not two. So, but -- yeah, you
22 don't -- but you don't have -- I mean, it's --
23 it's -- it's there for you to do to propose what
24 you want to do, what your argument is, put your
25 argument into writing. Because you did submit a

1 lot of documents here, but they're kind of all
2 clumped together. And of course, I'm going to go
3 through them and you pointed out some. That
4 Exhibit 32 is very interesting to me because is
5 that your friend, is that [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] that's
6 mentioned in there?

7 DR. LAHTENMAA: Yeah.

8 THE COURT: Okay. So that's new information.
9 Okay. Anyhow, if there's nothing further
10 today, then these proceedings are now closed. And
11 thank you very much.

12 And Dr. Lahteenmaa, I just want you to know
13 that by interrupting you, I'm sorry to do it so
14 much when you're asking the questions. It's hard
15 without a lawyer. But if there'd been a lawyer
16 there, Mr. Morris would have been objecting about
17 every 10 seconds and to, you know, testimony
18 instead of questions. And it's just -- it's hard
19 to set up separate your testimony. I mean, you're
20 a psychiatrist, you're not a lawyer. I get it.
21 You've got a lot more training under your belt
22 than a lawyer has. But, it's still a different
23 profession.

24 DR. LAHTENMAA: Judge Cohen, I'm sorry to
25 interrupt you. I told my friend I'm surprised I

1 didn't get kicked out of court.

2 THE COURT: Never. So, I don't mind
3 interrupting me. It's just -- it's just hard for
4 the court reporter to get everything down and it's
5 hard to make sense of the transcript when there's
6 a lot of testimony along with a question. But I
7 think I'll be able to sort it out.

8 All right, then. Thank you, Jessica, for
9 your court reporting today. I hope you got
10 everything down perfectly. I'm sure you did a lot
11 better than my notes, so.

12 THE COURT REPORTER: Thank you.

13 THE COURT: And if there's nothing further,
14 these proceedings are now closed.

15 MR. MORRIS: Thank you, Your Honor.

16 THE COURT: Take care, everyone.

18 3:18 p.m.)

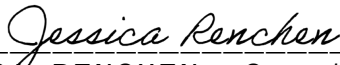
