

Lee Lake History Blip: Homesteading the Islands



We have recently employed Jamin Krause as our lawn mower. He grew up in Hawley, with strong Hawley roots, and is a big history buff! He lead us in the right direction to a Clay County Historical Society article from 2007 that covered the history of the islands on Lee Lake.

Clay County, like much of the midwest, has a rich history of homesteaders (which we have been researching on our property, but that's a story for another day!). Did you know that the two islands on Lee Lake were the last homesteaded land in Clay County? The majority of homesteaders settled in the late 1800s, but these islands were not claimed until 1923 & 1927. This was due to an oversight by the Eglon Township surveyors back in the 1870s, who did not include the islands in their maps.

Islands Con't

A Hawley physician named Dr. Charles W. Simison was able to look into a lot of government loopholes (a very complicated process; he was clearly an intelligent man), and found a way to homestead this land after it was thought that all the available homesteading land was taken.

There were some disputes to his being able to do this; the man who owned the land on the south side of the lake thought he had a good claim to these islands, as he owned the rest of the land in that designated section bordering the lake. During these years, the lake was going through a pretty bad drought, so the islands were not considered islands anymore by many of the people who lived near the lake. In fact, the lake was so low that you could drive straight out to the islands in your car on some of the lake's ridges. Dr. Simison did end up winning the rights to the islands, after it was proved that they are typically islands, and were in that condition at the time of surveying and when the homesteading act began. He built a cabin on the large island afterwards. We are just glad the lake hasn't been that low again for many decades!
