FOOTNOTES: The Catholic Church explains the differences in Gospel miracle stories as the result of each evangelist's unique theological focus, audience, and literary style—while affirming the divine inspiration and truth of all four accounts. Here's a deeper look at how this is understood within Catholic teaching:

Diverse Perspectives, Unified Truth

- Four Evangelists, Four Audiences: Matthew wrote for Jewish Christians, Mark for Roman believers, Luke for Gentiles, and John for a broader theological reflection. Each shaped the narrative to resonate with their audience's needs and expectations.
- Theological Emphasis: The evangelists weren't just chroniclers—they were theologians. For example:
- Matthew emphasizes Jesus as the fulfillment of Jewish prophecy.
- Mark highlights Jesus' suffering and humanity.
- Luke focuses on compassion and inclusion.
- John presents a more mystical and divine portrait of Christ.
- Selective Detailing: Each Gospel includes or omits details to serve its theological message. For instance, the healing of the centurion's servant appears in Matthew and Luke, but not in Mark or John—each writer chose stories that best illustrated their themes.

Inspired, Not Identical

- •Not a Modern Biography: The Gospels aren't journalistic reports. They are kerygmatic—proclamations of faith. The Church teaches that the Holy Spirit inspired the evangelists to write what was necessary for salvation, not to produce identical accounts.
- •Oral Tradition and Variants: Before being written, Jesus' miracles were passed down orally. Variations naturally arose, and the evangelists sometimes harmonized or adapted them.
- •Complementary, Not Contradictory: Differences in composition are seen as complementary facets of the same truth. The Church encourages reading the Gospels together to gain a fuller understanding of Christ's life and mission.

 Catholic Teaching on Scripture
- •Divine Inspiration: According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 105–107), Scripture is "written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit" and teaches "solidly, faithfully and without error that truth which God wanted put into sacred writings."
- •Unity of the Gospels: The Church affirms the unity of the four Gospels, even with their differences. They are "fourfold yet one" in bearing witness to Jesus.
