Pastor's Message

"In the beginning . . . "

There are definitely endings and beginnings in our lives; the daily rising and setting of the sun reminds us that tomorrow is a new day, unless of course you are the 'night people.' You are the people running seven-elevens, administering the two a.m. medications, scrubbing the floors of nursing homes, delivering the stock for the next days sales. Perhaps you are the stocker coming in at midnight to be sure all those cans of pumpkin were under the right tag on the end of the aisle or the hottest doll was marked with the proper price.

For years, I delivered the Richmond Times Dispatch, beginning at 3 a.m. with Jesse asleep in the back of the wagon and returning by seven, work done. I have a bit of an idea of being one of those who worked in the night, without acknowledgement but with great expectation – even on Christmas Day. I came to appreciate this part of our world.

I remind you of this, to increase your awareness of the 'unseen' pieces of our expected culture of convenience and service. Ours is an unusually sophisticated society that requires a lot of each other and, quite frankly, of our families.

So, I ask myself, as pastor, as colleague, as a sister in Christ – what is realistic to expect of those who call themselves Christians – those who voluntarily have chosen to be a part of Warwick United Church of Christ. Your lives are busy – work, family – where will your own faith growth and faith expression occur – when. I actually ask myself are Sundays really important anymore. For this note, I go to the historic story of the birth of this fellow Jesus.

I think it is fair to expect these things:

Like the angels, for you to speak – particularly for those who might be most afraid.

Like Mary and Elizabeth, for you to be willing to serve – particularly in ways you've never served before.

Like Joseph, for you to be willing to stand up – consider the law, consider what might be proper, but DO

What God would have you to do.

Like the Innkeeper, for you to share what you have – your space, your time, your resources.

Our obligation is to keep the story fresh, to keep the truths of the texts flowing, to keep stirring you up to 'love and good deeds'!

It all begins again, this Sunday morning – yep, the coffee is on, the community is gathering – a new beginning is showing up.

Welcome Rev. James

Welcome Rev. James Semmelroth Darnell!

On Sunday, **December 10th**, with overwhelming consensus, the congregation agreed to try a 'co-pastor' model of leadership as we continue to move forward developing our life together and with the world. The Rev. James Semmelroth Darnell was voted to come on staff to co-pastor the good folks of Warwick and to guide the development of the congregation's resources, hopes and dreams.

The timing of this was guided by Rev. Robin resigning to take a full time position, and provides a distinct opportunity to revise how we are able to work together. One of the gifts of the model is that both James and Sallye can work within their own passions and call in ministry. For now, the biggest consideration is they will share the responsibilities of worship and preaching, Sallye will take the lead with Children's Ministry and Administrative details, and James will take the lead on Adult Formation and Strategic Planning.

As the POPS determine their priorities, ministers will either share assignments there (Such as Worship/Liturgy and the Arts) or specifically be the support staff for a POPs growing work.

Now the real test of partnering, collaborating, and discipling is about to begin.

Dear Friends.

I am delighted to be serving alongside Sallye Hardy as your new co-pastor. I am grateful for your confidence in our leadership, and for your willingness to explore this new model of co-pastoring. I look forward to getting to know you better in the next few months - I hope to meet with many of you one on one for coffee, lunch, or dinner to learn about each of you and your hopes for our faith community. It is my great joy to take on this more official role with you, having been a part of Warwick UCC since May 2017. I pray that God will richly bless us with a long and fruitful ministry at Warwick.

I am originally from Peoria, Illinois. I earned a BA in theatre history from Illinois State University in 2006 and a Master of Divinity from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington in 2011. I was raised in the United Methodist Church, and was later confirmed in Peoria Heights (IL) Congregational Church. In November 2011, I was ordained a minister of the United Church of Christ at my home church, The United Church + Die Vereinigte Kirche (UCC/UMC) of Washington, DC, a historic German-English bilingual congregation. From 2011-2012 I served as the pastor of St. John United Church of Christ in rural St. Clair, Missouri. From 2012 - 2017, I returned to



Washington, working in fundraising full-time at The George Washington University and United Nations Foundation, while providing volunteer assistance in my home congregation and pulpit supply elsewhere. I was the coordinator of The United Church's Fall Sale & German Luncheon which annually raised \$10,000 over two days. Prior to being ordained I served as an intern for Plymouth Congregational UCC in Des Moines, IA; New Church UCC in Peoria, IL; Washington, DC Office of the United Church of Christ; Bethesda UCC in Bethesda, MD; Human Rights Campaign and Interfaith Alliance national offices, both in Washington, DC. I have served as a delegate to the UCC General Synod five times, and served on the board of directors of Justice and Witness Ministries and on the UCC Council of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

Presently I serve on the board of directors of the Evangelical & Reformed Historical Society and the UCC Historical Council. Outside of ministry, I currently work full-time as a Development Research Analyst at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, which brought me to the Hampton Roads area in May 2017. My avocations include history, community theatre, singing, and German language, culture, food, and music. Also, a German-American historian, I was the editor of "A Little Girl From Niederstetten," a postwar memoir, and am presently working on "Frankfurt am Potomac: The German Speaking People of the District of Columbia."

It is such an honor to serve with you. I know that Newport News needs our open and affirming, inclusive, compassionate witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ. May we explore new and exciting ways of sharing and living out God's love for all, in partnership together.
