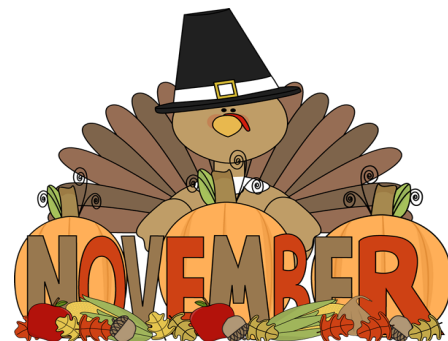

Box of cake mix and icing or brownie mix

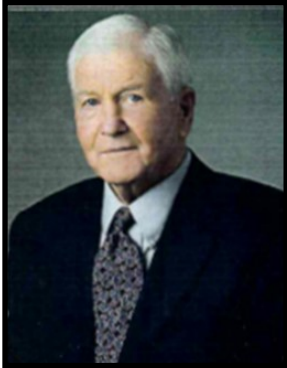
Week 5: December 2

Aubrey H. Fitzgerald

Aubrey H. Fitzgerald departed this life on Thursday, October 11, 2018. Aubrey was devoted to his family, especially his wife of 61 years, Shirley. He was also devoted to his church, his community and his alma mater, the College of William & Mary. He was an active leader in the Warwick United Church of Christ and its choir up until the time of his passing. Aubrey served 18 years on Newport News City Council, including two terms as Vice-Mayor. Aubrey was also appointed to the Christopher Newport University Board of Visitors and served on the Peninsula Airport Commission. While Aubrey's civic accomplishments are too numerous to list, his service with the Peninsula Kiwanis Club and the Newport News Republican City Committee were very important to him. In 2003 he received the Alumni Medallion, awarded for lifetime achievement and devotion to the College of William & Mary.

Funeral Services were conducted on Monday, October 15, 2018 at Weymouth Funeral Home by Rev. Sallye Hardy, with Interment following at Peninsula Memorial Park. 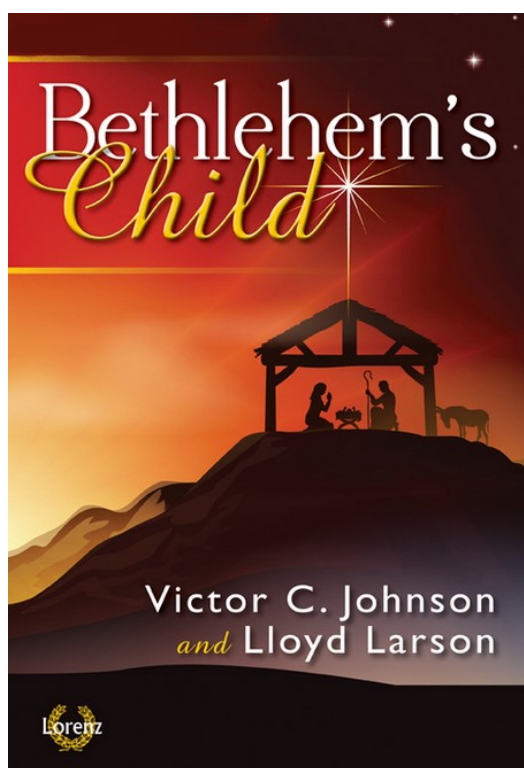
