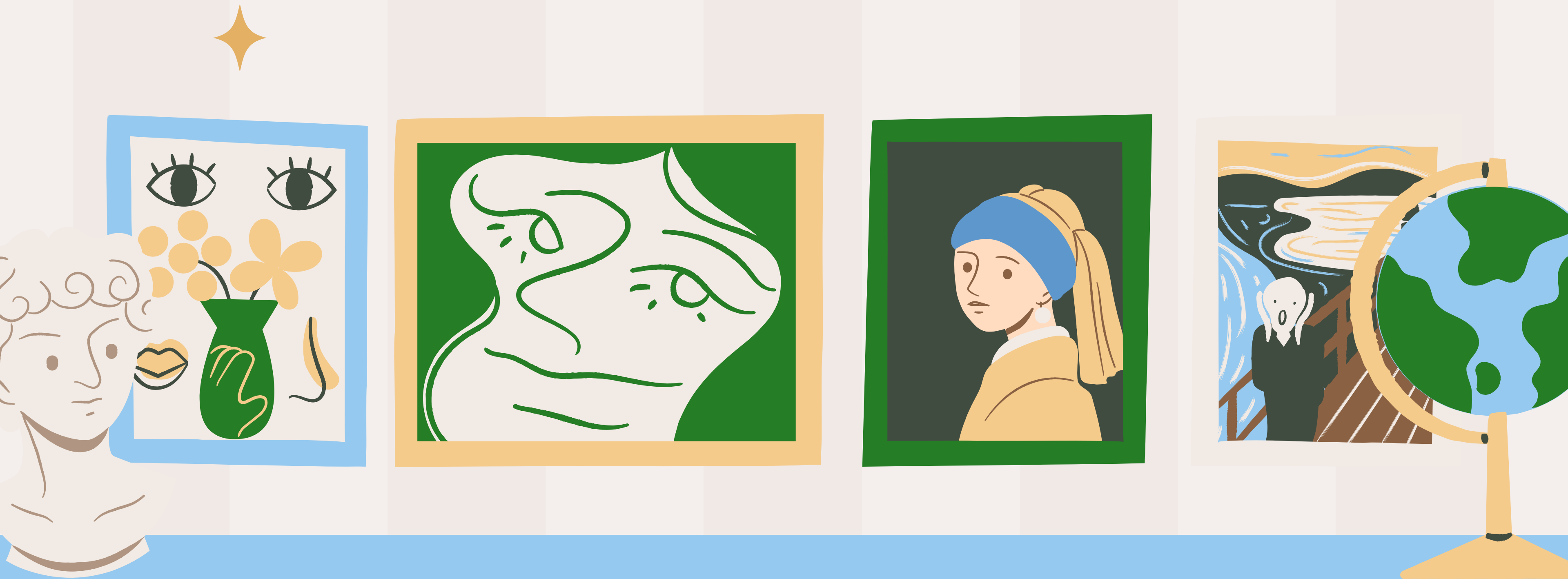

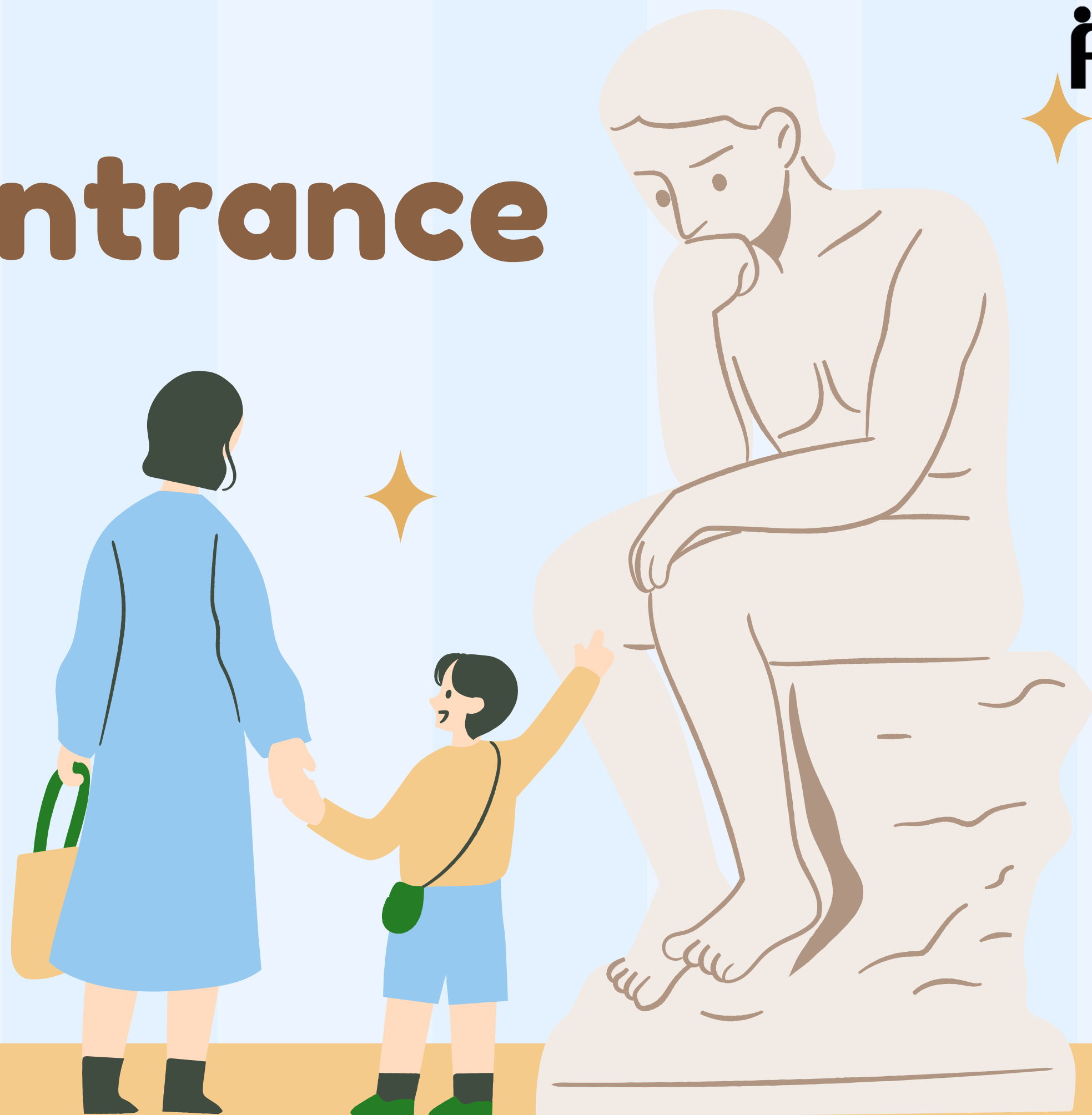

Modern art

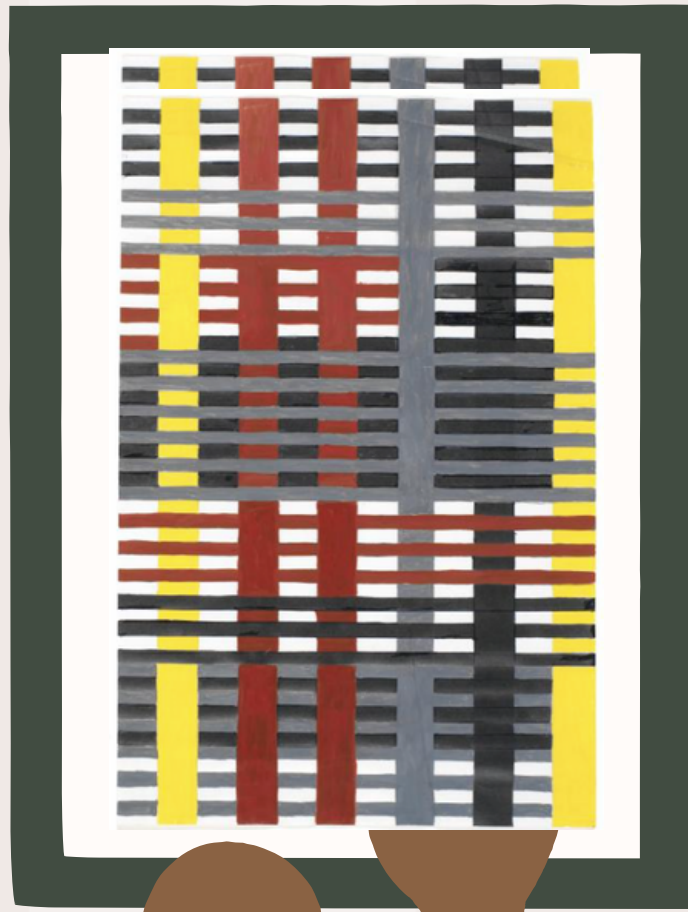
is when artists started to try new and fun ways to make art not just copying real things, but showing feelings and ideas.

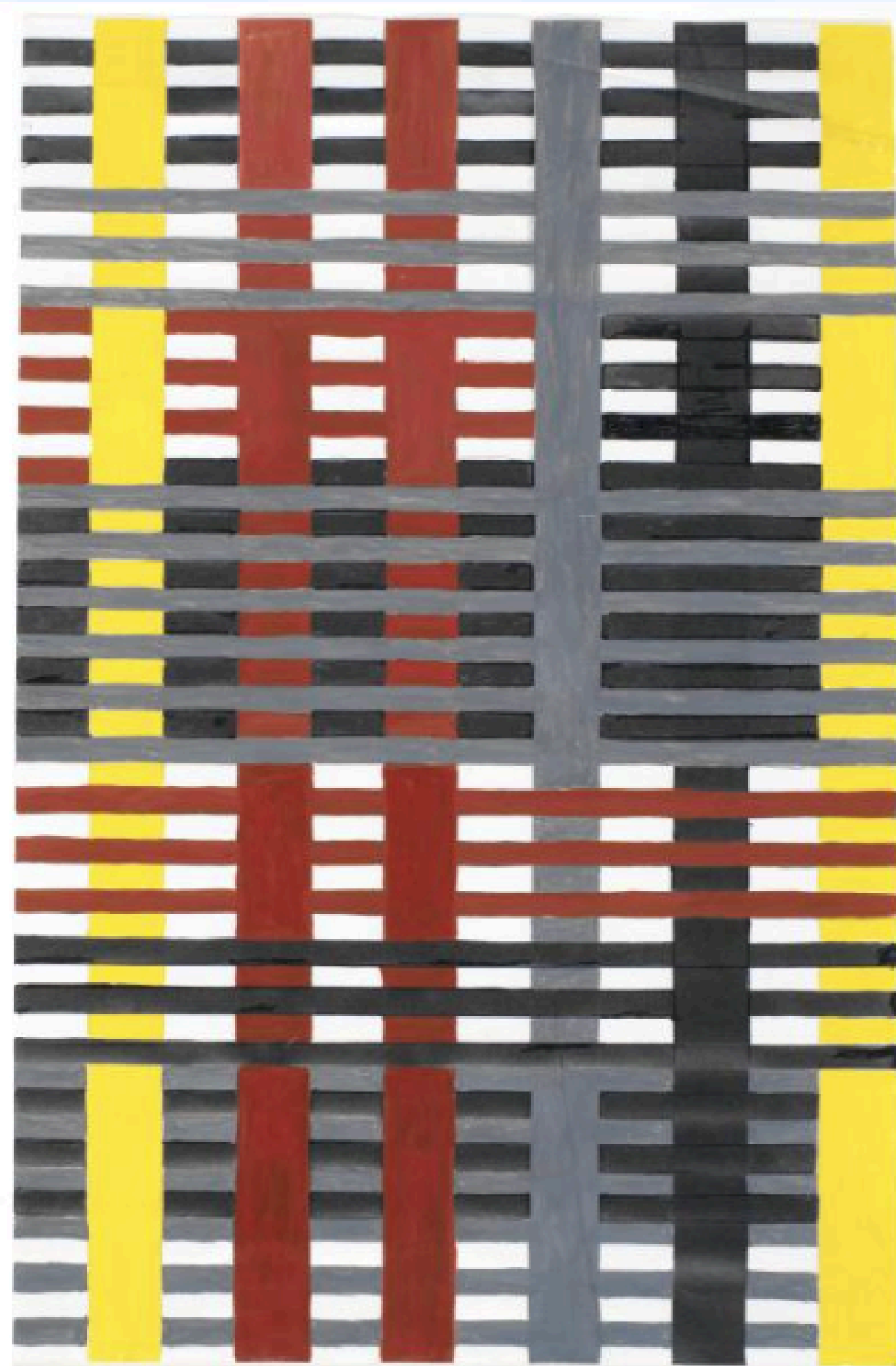
Abstract weaving

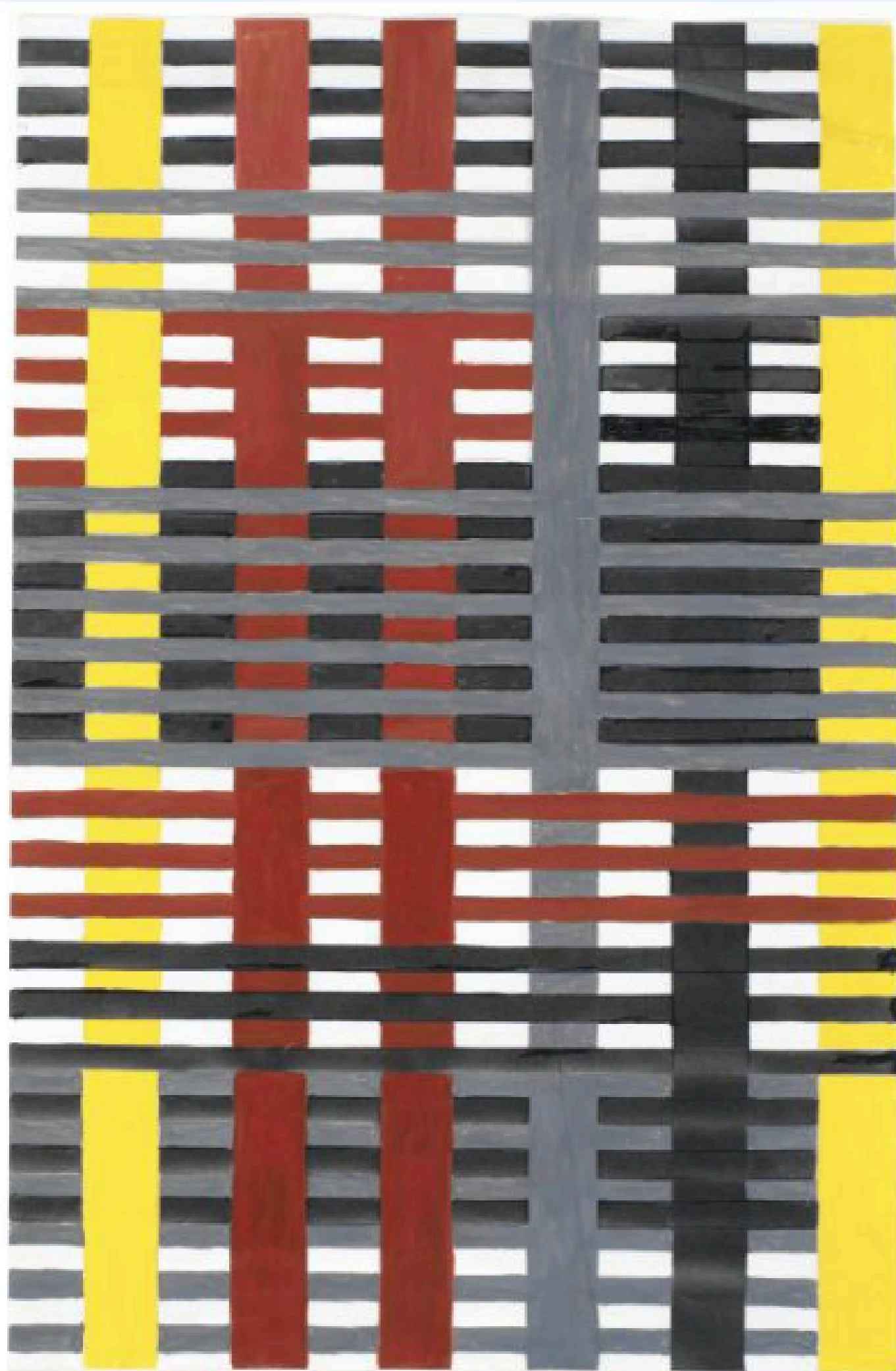


Project Patterned paper

- To make our patterned paper, we'll need white paper, gouache paint, brushes and scissor.

This activity will happen in two steps! First, we'll create two patterned papers and set them aside to dry. Once they're dry, we'll cut them into strips and weave them together to make our very own colorful designs!

It's very important not to use too much paint or water, so our artwork can dry in time and be ready for the next part of the activity!

steps

- To make our patterned paper, we'll need colored paper, tapes and scissor.

In this activity, we'll choose three colors, cut them into strips, and weave them together to create a beautiful braided pattern!

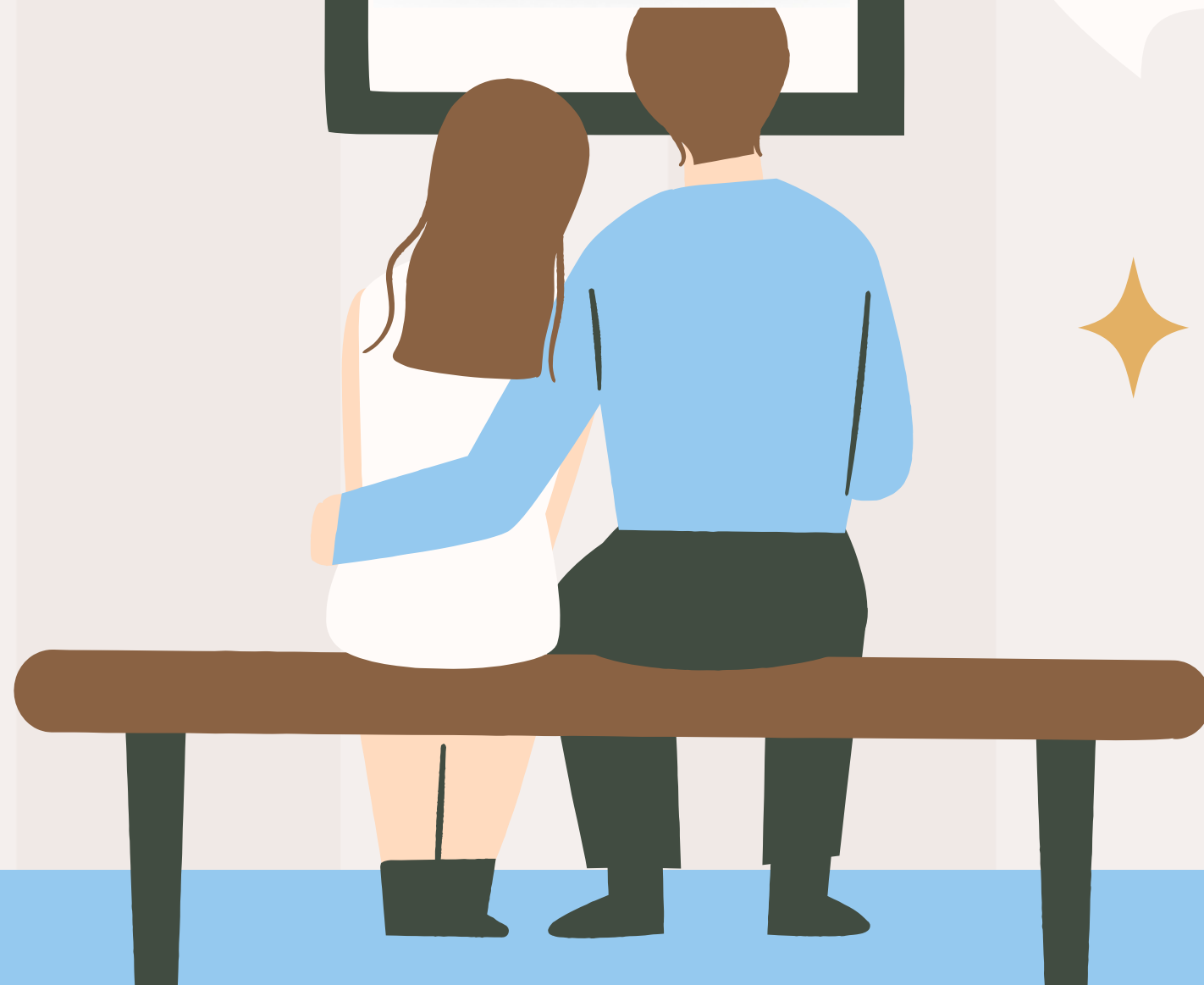

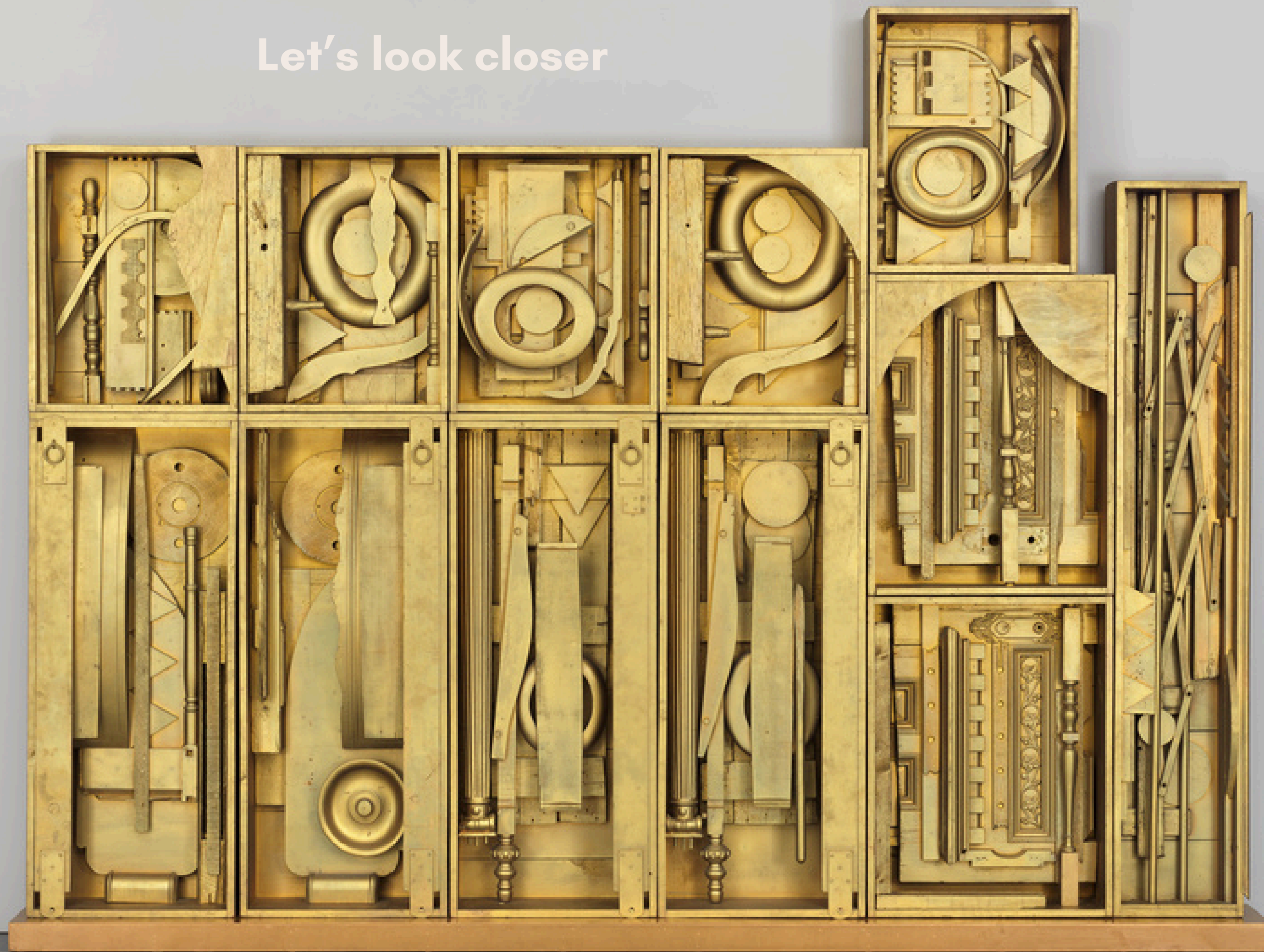

Project

Create. Save. Repeat.

Build Your Sculpture:

- Start by gluing your recycled materials onto the cardboard base. Arrange them in a fun and interesting way — like a puzzle! Layer pieces and create shapes
- Choose One Color and paint Your Sculpture (Paint every part of your sculpture — make sure no spot is left unpainted! This might take a few layers)
- Let the paint dry

Try to choose colors that make your sculpture stand out!



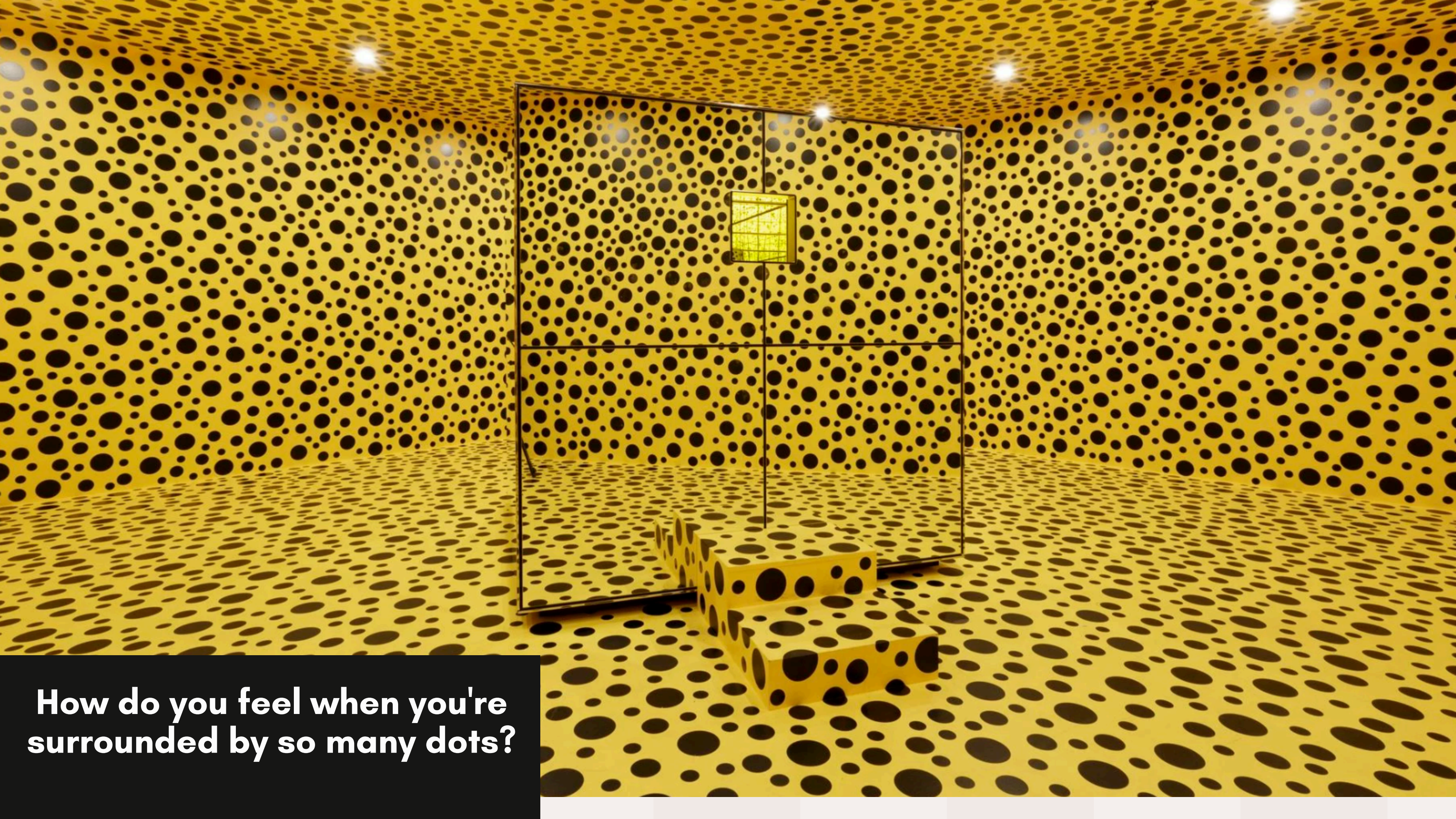

Her art is full of bright colors, patterns, and infinity mirrors, making us feel like we're in a dream full of shapes and color.



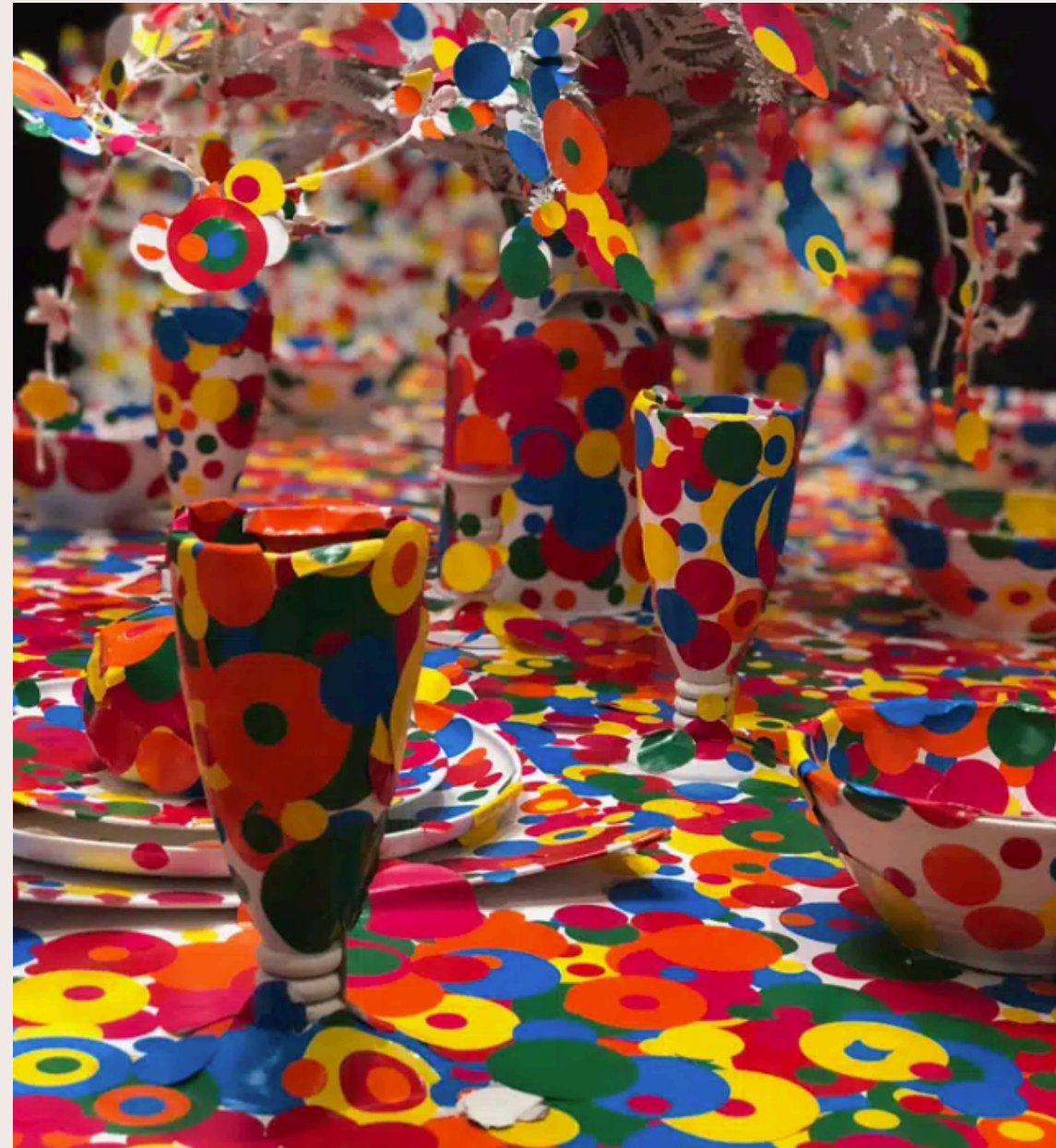

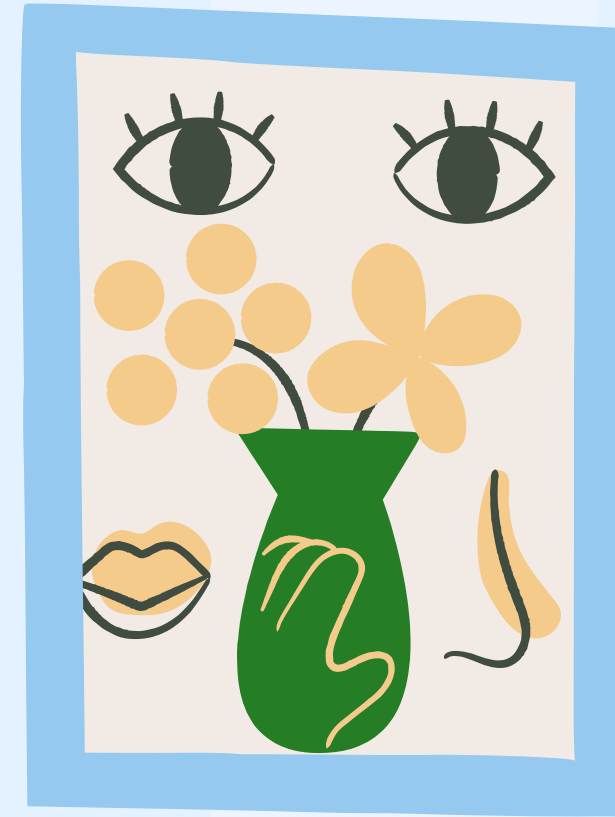
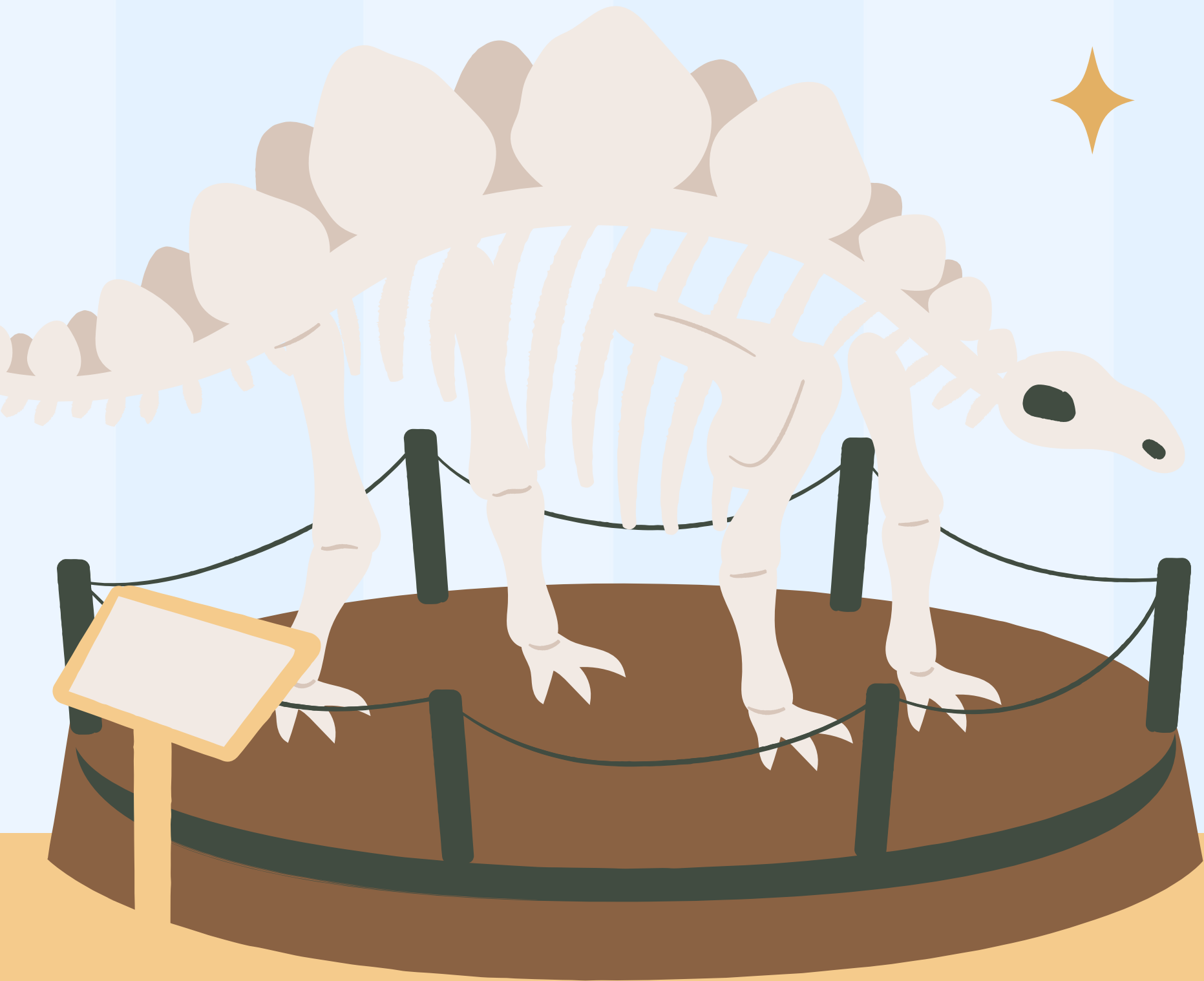
