Chuck Gross began his Martial Arts training in 1964 at the Shuri Goju School of Karate in North Miami, Florida under the direction of Master John Pachivas and Larry Pizzi. He also began studies in Nisei Goju under the supervision of Frank Ruiz and John Glordano in 1969.

In 1985 he continued his studies with Hanshi Glen Mehlman at the Miami Beach Dojo where he began basic sword techniques with Hanshi Larry Pizzi and Shinkage Rue with Hanshi Alberto Caputo. In 2010 he expanded his studies in the Muso Shinden Ryu Iaido system with Kioshi Roger Wehrhahn and continues to this present day.
