December 2024 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild continues the Block of the Month series in our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our fourth block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of the Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for December 2024 is what I am calling a **strip block** (because I don't know if it has a name and it is put together by sewing together strips). With the holiday just around the corner, I decided that having an easy block would be well received. There isn't a video for this block so I have simple instructions below.

Color Way: Choose 10 prints/solids from your fabric stash/scraps. Note you may need slightly longer fabric pieces to trim to 10 ½".

What you need for one block:

Colour A – 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1.5" strip Colour B – 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1.5" strip Colour C – 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1.5" strip Colour D – 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1.5" strip





Step 1.

- Using Colours A, and B strips, sew right-sides together along the 10 ½" edge.
- Open and press to the darker fabric.



- Using Colour C, sew right-sides together with Colour B, along the 10 ½" edge.
- Open and press in the same direction as above.



- Using Colour D, sew right-sides with Colour C along the 10 ½" edge to form a 10 ½" by 10 ½" unit
- Open and press in the same direction as above.



- Continue sewing the remaining strips together as described above until all strips are sewn together.

Step 2.

Square block to 10 ½" x 10 ½".

Bring your completed block(s) to the December meeting or the next meeting you attend. If you're unable to attend the December meeting, you can have a friend bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than 3 pm on December 12th and I will pick it up and bring it to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2024/25 LUCK OF THE DRAWZ

The 2024/25 Quilt Challenge was revealed at the November Guild meeting, and 18 members signed on to the challenge! Quilters will have until the June 2025 meeting to complete their submissions, which will consist of making two draws. You can still participate and complete your 'draws' at upcoming Guild meetings or contact Debbie to make arrangements outside of the meetings.

Each participant made two draws. The first draw was for the "Category," and the second was for the "Randomizer" item to incorporate into your submission.

There are 4 Categories:

Traditional Modern Scrappy Non-Quilt but Quilted Item

(cannot be a 'blanket' - could be an art quilt, table

runner, tea cozy, coat etc.)

The second draw was for the Randomizer item you must incorporate into your project. Randomizer items could be anything Quilty - a quilt block, a technique, a type of fabric, utilizing a quilting item, etc. There are 50 Randomizer items.

Judges will determine how well you incorporated the two together.

The Rules are:

- 1. You must incorporate your Category and Randomizer into your submission and reveal your challenge quilt at the June 2025 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 32" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will judge how well you did!

For those of you who don't know, this is Sunbonnet Sue and she has not YET been drawn! Wouldn't she be fun??!



Good luck with your challenges everyone!

*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.



Crock Pot White Lasagna

While searching for a crock pot lasagna recipe, I saw this recipe and thought it would be a quick and easy recipe for you and your family.

You will need:

2 ½ cups store-bought rotisserie chicken, diced

2 cups shredded Italian cheese blend 15 oz. container ricotta cheese 2 (15 oz) jars cheese alfredo sauce ½ cup water

1 tsp Italian seasoning

1 tsp minced garlic

9-12 lasagna noodles (depending on your slow cooker size)

2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese Dried parsley (optional)

Directions:

- 1. In a bowl, combine Italian cheese blend with ricotta cheese. The mixture will be thick.
- 2. In a separate bowl, combine jars of alfredo sauce with water, Italian seasoning, and garlic.
- 3. Assemble the lasagna layers:
 - a. Spread ¼ of the alfredo sauce into the bottom of a slow cooker.
 - b. Arrange 3-4 lasagna noodles over the alfredo sauce (break noodles to fit).
- 4. Spread 1/3 of the chicken on top of the lasagna noodles.
- 5. Then spread 1/3 of the cheese mixture on the chicken.
- 6. Then repeat these same steps twice (alfredo sauce, noodles, chicken, cheese mixture.) Ensure the alfredo sauce covers the edge of the noodles.
- 7. Add shredded mozzarella cheese and dried parsley (optional).
- 8. Cover and cook on low for 2 ½ 3 hours (or until noodles are tender).

Note: Slow cookers are not all the same, so check your lasagna after 2 ½ hours, then keep an eye on it after that point, keeping an eye on the edges so they don't get too dark.
