




# September 2024 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild is continuing the Block of the Month series in support of our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our first block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at <a href="https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1">https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1</a> (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for September 2024 is the Building Blocks.



We will use the Missouri Star Quilt Company's technique to make the block. Watch the video on YouTube at <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hC0N2UX\_5ml">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hC0N2UX\_5ml</a> . Block construction starts around 0:55 minutes into the video and goes to 4:15 minutes.

**Color Way**: your choice of colours/prints and one of the three to be a floral print.

#### What you need:

Colour #1 - One, 2 ½" x 7 ½"
Colour #2 - One, 2 ½" x 10"
Colour #3 – 7 ½" square
Or you can use three 10" squares

Finished block size: approximately 9 ½" square.

# A hot Tip from a member

A new technique for me over the summer was to try glue basting using Elmers School glue. I have done pin pasting and glue basting with 505 spray, but never with School glue. I have to say, basting is not my favourite step in the quilt making process, but has quickly become my favourite way to baste. No mess, no smell, much quicker than pins. There are many videos online about this, but for easy reference for quilters who have not seen or tried this technique, here is a video link that demonstrates the technique.

#### **Another Soft Toy Designer**

As many of you may know from *Show and Tell* or the *Puppy Class*, I have sewn many of the patterns from the Funky Friends website, and absolutely love them. While looking for a quilt pattern, I stumbled across a couple of different toy designers, Wendi Gratz from *Shiny Happy World* and Rena Deardon from *Rustic Horseshoe*. These new finds are very different in style from each other, and from Funky Friends.

I'm going to focus on Shiny Happy World this month as I've made more of them so far. Wendi's stuffed toys have a more "cartoonish" flavour to them, and she has a line of dress-up dolls with a number of clothing and accessory patterns. She also recommends the use of weighted plastic pellets to give arms, legs, bottoms (to help them "sit" better), and sometimes ears, a bit more weight. These pellets add a bit of concentrated weight compared to the poly stuffing. I've used these before to weight animals that I've wanted to sit upright, and they provide some stability

without making the toy heavy.

Wendi has created 12 dress able dolls, including some animals and even one monster! She has 25 accessory patterns for the dolls, plus one free one – a set of play clothes. These accessories include clothes, costumes, and toys and stuffies for the dolls. At this point, I've made Meep the monster and Squeak the mouse. I suspect I may have overstuffed them a bit (I tend to make my toys quite firm) as the play clothes were a bit snug on Squeak.

The PDF patterns are available immediately after purchase, so no shipping charges or waiting! Another great feature of this delivery method is that the pattern directions include a number of links to very helpful tips and videos.

In the "Other soft toys" category, there are 31 patterns, including 2 flat blanket characters – a bear and a bunny. While the pictures of the animals on the website and patterns all show them with smallish eyes, I did play around with larger eyes, and even a plastic nose for Buddy.

#### **Another Soft Toy Designer (continued)**

Most of the patterns are classified as easy or super easy, and they certainly are. Four (Dexter Dragon, Bertie Bunny, Caterpillar Phil, and Buddy the puppy) are classed as "Skill builder" but are still quite simple to sew. All the easy patterns can be sewn in a half day, including cutting time.

Also available through shinyhappyworld.com are a range of patterns for embroidery, felt Christmas ornaments, smaller felt stuffies, crocheted stuffies, and applique. The stuffy and doll patterns range from \$7 to \$14 (USD), and most of the crochet patterns are \$7. Applique patterns are available individually and in bundles. I haven't tried any of these yet as I'm still working my way through some bins of minky and fireside scraps! Dexter would like to thank Lillian for his lovely wings!

I'll bring some samples to the September meeting so that you can have a closer look at some of Wendi's creations.



# Creamy Cauliflower Bisque

I didn't get fancy with the cheese and green onion garnish and was tasty all the same.

#### You will need:

1 pound frozen cauliflower florets 1 pound baking potatoes, peeled and cut into 1-inch cubes

1 cup chopped yellow onion

1 rib celery, diced

2 cans (14 oz. each) fat free, reduced sodium chicken broth

 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. dried thyme

🕹 tsp. garlic powder

1/8 tsp. ground red pepper

1 cup evaporated skimmed milk

2 tbsp. butter

 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt

 $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. black pepper

1 cup (4 oz.) shredded reduced-fat

sharp Cheddar Cheese


 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup finely chopped parsley

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup finely chopped green onion

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Combine cauliflower, potatoes, onion, broth, thyme, garlic powder and ground red pepper in 4- to 7-quart Crock-Pot® slow cooker. Cover; cook on LOW 8 hours, or on HIGH 4 hours.
- 2. Pour soup in blender in batches; process until smooth, holding lid down firmly. Return pureed batches to slow cooker. Add milk, butter, salt and black pepper; stir until blended.
- 3. Top individual servings with cheese, parsley and green onions.

Makes 9 servings.
