My Fusion Quilt



Leftover Turkey Casserole

Ingredients:

1/2 tsp kosher salt

1 cup turkey gravy 1 cup whole milk

¹/₄ cup flour

4 tbsp butter, unsalted

- **Directions:**
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and add the butter to a medium sized saucepan melting it on medium heat.
- 2. Add the flour to the pan and whisk well together for 1 minute before adding the gravy, milk and mozzarella, whisking until smooth.
- Add the cornbread, turkey, peas, carrots and green beans to a 9 x 13 pan and cover with the gravy before cooking for 20-25 minutes covered, followed by 10 minutes uncovered.
- 3 cups chopped turkey meat, cooked

3 cups cornbread, cut into 1" chunks

1 cup mozzarella, shredded

1/2 cup frozen peas

- 1 cup chopped carrots
- 1 cup chopped frozen green beans

1/2 tsp coarse ground black pepper
