Yellowknife Quilt Guild Scrap/Stash Quilt Challenge

The Challenge for this year will be a Scrap/Stash Challenge. Make a quilt or quilted item...use your scraps/stash.

We want to make it simple and fun to enter!

There are no design limitations there will be 4 categories:

Categories:

- 1. Smaller than a 36" square
- 2. Quilt Size -any size of quilt
- 3. Used only scraps on quilt top
- 4. Viewers' Choice-every quilt project is entered



Here is the chance to have some fun and use up your scraps and reduce your stash.






CHALLENGE GUIDELINES

- 1. The project can be any size, refer to categories!
- 2. Entries must be completed quilts, sewn, quilted, and with appropriate edges finished.
- 3. Projects may be patchwork, applique, rag quilts, use your imagination, but it must be a completed piece to enter.
- 4. Entries must be obviously (80%) scrappy or from your stash for the top of your quilt. For the challenge, matched precut (such as jelly roll and charm pack or kits) projects are not the intent and will not qualify for prizes. (Using leftover scraps from them is encouraged!).
- 5. A "scrap" is defined as a piece of fabric smaller than a fat quarter which is remaining after use in a previous project. It may be from your own previous projects, or you may use someone else's scraps. New fabric acquired especially for a project is not scrap. An item from your "stash" is a piece of fabric you have purchased but have not found a use for it yet.

Ingredients:

3 cups warm water

½ cups sugar

6 tbsp oil

1 tsp salt

2 tbsp fast rising yeast

2 beaten eggs (room temp)

6-8 cups flour

My friend and fellow quilter Laurette Keller (we met a couple years back at a course in Beaverlodge and go to the same retreats) posted this tried-and-true recipe so I'm sharing it with you.

Directions:

- 1. Mix first 5 ingredients. Add beaten eggs and then mix in flour.
- 2. Let rise 15 minutes and then punch down.
- 3. Let rise another 15 minutes and then punch down.
- Let rise another 15 minutes. Make into buns and put on greased pans.
- 5. Let rise 1 hour.
- 6. Bake at 350 for 18 20 minutes.

Note: Laurette mixed her dough with mixer.
