Charlene and I attended an Information Session on Batting at the Quilt Market last October. It was very informative, and we wanted to share some of the information we learned.

Batting!!!!!

There are several types of Batting:

Polyester Batting is antiallergenic and light weight. This batting can be washed in warm water and can be dried in the dryer, there is 0% shrinkage. This batting is very light weight. Polyester batting used in wall hangings does not leave with them with the wrinkly Quilt look.

80/20 Blend Batting is the # 1 top selling batting used in quilts. The fibers are blended, this provides great strength and durability. This batting offers a lofty and light weight feel. If quilting is done quite close together the quilt will have a flat, low loft appearance. Quilting distance with this batting can be 10" apart.

100% Cotton Batting is natural fibers and breaths. There is 3-5% shrinkage rate when washed. After it is washed it gives a crinkled, lived-in look. Compared to other battings, cotton offers the heaviest weight, it is great for bed quilts. Quilting distance using this batting is 8".

Wool Batting is light weight, warm and moisture wicking. This batting is lightweight and breathes naturally making it a great choice for bed quilts or garments that are used in all seasons and climates. There is a 0-3% shrinkage with this batting. Wool batting usually cost more than

other battings. Quilting distance for using this batting is 4-8'.

Bamboo Batting is excellent to use for hand, domestic and long arm quilting. Bamboo is warm in the winter and cool in the summer. Bamboo is a sustainable crop which does not rely on Pesticides or fertilizer. Bamboo batting is very breathable. Quilt distance for this batting is up to 8".

5 Questions to ask yourself before purchasing batting!

- 1. What is the purpose of the Quilt? Will it be donated, is it for a baby, young family. You may not want to spend money on an expensive batting if the quilt will be used and washed regularly. Is it just going to be used during the holidays?
- **2.** Are the any allergies or material preferences of the person receiving it? Someone who likes natural fibers will not like a polyester batting.
- **3.** What kind of finish and how much will it be quilted? Do you want it to be puffy or be more like a bedspread on a bed?
- **4.** Who will be caring for the quilt? Is the quilt being made for a university student who washes and dries everything?
- **5.** What is your budget for the quilt? You may want to stay with the 80/20 blend which is the most economical batting.

Whatever batting you chose, make sure it is good quality. You want to ensure that your finished project turns our terrific.

Members selling quilted items are to contact Donna for the number of tags you need which will be left at the Quilted Raven in the Guild Basket on top of the library bookshelf for you.



Lime Jello Supreme (Helen)

This is a staple at Christmas, New Years, Easter, and Thanksgiving. If we are hosting, its on the table. If we're not, we bring it. Mom introduced us to this recipe many years ago. Our daughter makes it at her house too.

Ingredients:

- 1 pkg Large Lime Jello
- 1 cup Boiling Water
- 24 Large Marshmallows
- 1 tin Crushed Pineapple
- 1 cup Creamed Cottage Cheese
- 1 cup Whipped Cream Whipped
- 1 cup Sliced Almonds

Directions:

- 1. Dissolve jello in the boiling water.
- In double boiler, combine juice from drained pineapple and the marshmallows. Stir occasionally over hot water until melted. Add marshmallow mixture to jello mix. Chill.
- 3. When it is partially set, fold in cottage cheese, pineapple and almonds. Fold in the whipped cream and chill.

Note: You have to watch, as this chills really fast.
