- 1) A motion to reconfirm our Christmas Sale Policy (https://nebula.wsimg.com/ff8d98b0f8cbb74058c03c90ca90e0c6?AccessKeyId=F66BE465C491783 EC989&disposition=0&alloworigin=1);
- 2) A motion to increase our fees to \$40 annually; and
- 3) The election of officers to the Executive Committee.

Item #2 is not something that we have taken lightly. There has not been a fee increase for some time and it is now appropriate to meet the operational requirements of the Guild and provide value added components.

As to Item #3, the by-laws state that "At each AGM, directors shall be elected from among the members for a 2-year term. The total number of directors, continuing or newly elected, shall be at least 3 and not more than 12."

The current Executive Committee has 5 members. Of these, three are continuing and the 2 whose terms are up have advised that they will not seek re-election. While feasibly 3 people could carry out the work of the Executive, at least 5 is desirable to undertake the responsibilities.

On a totally different note, we are gaining significantly in the daily allotment of sunshine each day. I for one am very happy about that.

Tips from The Quilted Raven Fabric Marking Tools

There are a wide variety of marking tools on the market and several different companies make them. Clover, Bohin, Prym, Sewline and Taylor Seville are a few. The choices can be a bit overwhelming.

You may wonder which marking tool is right for you. Ask yourself, what is the purpose and what type of mark do you need to make?

To be a good marking tool it must:

- be easy to see on your fabric
- easy to erase or remove
- not break easily
- not dry out

Prior to using any marking tool on a project, TEST IT! Make sure it will do what you want. Testing them over time is preferable to ensure that you do not ruin your project. I went to several manufacturers websites and there is little or no information on the marking tools. Information can be found by asking fellow quilters which marking tools they like to use or searching the internet to find the top marking tools specific to the style you are looking for. ie chalk, water soluble, air erase pens.

Different Types of Marking Tools Hera Marker

- the Hera Marker is a plastic tool
- it temporarily creases fabric
- you need to press firmly to leave a mark on the fabric
- can only be used on if fabric is on a hard surface

Chalk

- three styles: pen, wheel or disc
- comes in a variety of colours
- never dries out, they last a long time
- easy to use but may smudge
- the pencils leave a finer line, but lead does break, and they have to be sharpened
- the pencils come in mechanical pen form or a regular pencil
- the wheel makes thin lines, you cannot make dots with a wheel marker
- tailor's chalk is a small disk of chalk, pressing too hard can make lines difficult to remove

Fabric Marking Tools continued...

Water Erasable

- these pens allow you to mark fabric and erase with water
- to remove marks, you must follow manufacturer's instructions on how to remove
- the pens could bleed on fabrics
- it is not recommended to leave the marks on a long period of time
- can only be used on light to medium-coloured fabrics
- heat can set the marks, either by ironing or left out in the sun

Air Erasable

- the markings from these pens may fade over time
- it is best to mark when working on a project, so you do not have to remark
- heat may affect the marks leaving them darker than originally marked

Another tool for your kit is a **Fabric Eraser**. This eraser differs from a regular eraser, it will remove marks and not leave a residue on the fabric.

The Quilted Raven carries a variety of marking tools including several styles of chalk marking tools.

One final remark to remember!

Test, test, test before using. Mark lightly to ensure the marks will come off. Ensure you have a marking tool to use on both light and dark fabrics.



EPP - English Paper Piecing



Stew Good to Be True

Slow cooker beef and vegetable stew

Ingredients:

2 pounds of stewing beef, trim fat, 1-inch cubes

- 3 cups peeled and cubed potatoes
- 2 cups chopped carrots
- 11/2 cups chopped onion
- 2 cups no-salt added tomato sauce
- 1 can (10 oz/284 mL) reduced-sodium beef broth, undiluted
- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 2 tsp minced garlic
- 1 bay leaf
- 1¼ tsp each dried marjoram and dried thyme
- 1 tsp granulated sugar
- ½ tsp each salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tbsp cornstarch
- 1/4 cup minced fresh parsley

Directions:

- Combine all ingredients except cornstarch and parsley in a 3-quarter or larger slow cooker. Cover and simmer on low setting for 8 hours.
- Combine cornstarch with an equal amount water and stir until lump-free. Add to stew and mix well. Cook for 1 more hour. Stir in parsley just before serving.


