# The Quilted Raven

Using the wrong type of needles in your sewing machine can be frustrating. It can lead to needle or thread breakage, fabric puckering, holes in fabric, or skipped stitches.

Here is an overview on types of needles that will help when sewing your projects.

#### **Brands of Needles**

There are many companies that manufacture needles. Schmetz, Organ, Singer, Superior Threads, Janome, Bernina are just a few companies producing needles. Schmetz is the most common name in needles, they do state that their needles are compatible with most sewing machines. Make sure you check your Sewing Machine Manual to ensure you are using the correct Brand of needles for your machine.

#### **Needle Size**

Needles comes in sizes from 60/8 up to 120/19. What do those number mean?

The number on the left is the European size of needle and the number on the right is the American Size. The larger the number larger the needle, a lower number indicates a finer needle. A smaller size needle pierces your fabric easily. A needle that is larger may leave holes in your fabric.

Ensure you pair your needle with your thread. 50wt thread is paired with an 80/12 needle. Your quilt store should carry a Quick Reference Table with information on which needle size to use with different fabric types and threads.

#### **Needle Types**

There are a variety of needle types to be used with different fabric and project in mind. Ensure you choose the right needle for your project.

# Quilting Tips from The Quilted Raven (continued)

There are over 12 different needle types for sewing. Here are a some of the most common for Quilting projects.

**Universal:** Most common needle. Needle tip slightly rounded. They don't bend or break easily. **Top Stitching:** Extra sharp point, great for piecing. The large eye allows thick topstitching thread to be used.

**Quilting:** These needles are designed to go through several layers of fabric. An extra sharp point helps to eliminate skipped stiches.

**Microtex (Sharp):** this needle has a slim acute point. Great to use with fabrics with higher thread count like Batiks.

**Jeans:** these needles feature a medium ballpoint and reinforced blade. The needle works best in extra thick woven fabrics.

#### Needle "Rule" Book

Here are a few tips to remember when sewing.

- Change your needle every 4-8 hours or after every project.
- Get to know needle types. Ask your Quilt store or check out websites.
- Know your thread weight and use appropriate needle size.
- Store needles that have only been used a short time in a tomato or strawberry pin cushion. It will sharpen your needle at the same time.
- Check your manual to see what kind of needles your machine uses.
- A "popping" or "ticking" sound while quilting may be an indication of a dull needle.
- Never sew over pins! A needle may break and lodge in your machine or fly into your face.
- Dull needles result in poor or skipped stiches.... change your needle.



Always wanted to make fun hexagons - then this class is for you. A kit purchase for \$20.00 will provide you with most of the essentials required. All you need to provide will be sharp scissors, your choice of fabrics and a sense of adventure.



#### Y - Seams Not Cry Seams

In this workshop, you will learn all about how to tackle y-seams, from making hexagon blocks to piecing blocks together using y-seam methods. We will trouble-shoot common issues. The project that will be worked on will measure approx. 19"x19" so perfect for a cushion cover or mini quilt, but the sky is the limit for making a larger quilt once you become comfortable with this new technique. Fabric cutting instructions will be provided once you have registered so you will be able to come to the class and get sewing right away.



#### **Bloem Quilt**

#### Additional Show N' Tell

After the December Sale, I was approached by friends to make a queen-sized quilt for a mutual friend. I picked a simple pattern with the BQ2 (A pattern by Denise Bowles for Maple Island Quilts) and we collaborated on the colours. The timeline was tight, but 32.5 hours of work and a speedy turn around by my friend Marilyn Moran, saw the delivery of said quilt on New Year's Day. The happy recipient gave me permission to show it to you here.

Those of you that have made this pattern will note a variation in the quilt. were tight on the poppy fabric and there was no room for error. On the last cut, the ruler slipped, taking with it my seam allowance. Trying to piece a strip in did not do it for me. A quick math calculation and two pinwheels solved the problem. You should know that the ruler has since been sprayed with "Grippy" no slip coating!

# Creamy Cauliflower Bisque

I didn't get fancy with the cheese and green onion garnish and it was tasty all the same.

#### **Ingredients:**

1 pound frozen cauliflower florets
1 pound baking potatoes, peeled
and cut into 1-inch cubes
1 cup chopped yellow onion
1 rib celery, diced
2 cans (14 oz. each) fat free,
reduced sodium chicken broth
\(\frac{1}{2}\) tsp. dried thyme
\(\frac{1}{4}\) tsp. garlic powder
1/8 tsp. ground red pepper
1 cup evaporated skimmed milk

½ tsp. salt

2 tbsp. butter

 $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. black pepper

1 cup (4 oz.) shredded reduced-

fat sharp Cheddar Cheese

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup finely chopped parsley

 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup finely chopped green onion

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Combine cauliflower, potatoes, onion, broth, thyme, garlic powder and ground red pepper in 4- to 7-quart Crock-Pot® slow cooker. Cover; cook on LOW 8 hours, or on HIGH 4 hours.
- 2. Pour soup in blender in batches; process until smooth, holding lid down firmly. Return pureed batches to slow cooker. Add milk, butter, salt and black pepper; stir until blended.
- 3. Top individual servings with cheese, parsley and green onions.
