The Houston Quilt Market not only had sessions on new products, but they also distributed information on a variety of topics. The topic I would like to share is Copyright.

Copyright Tips and The Quilter

What is Copyright

In the simplest terms, Copyright is when you create something. Art, photographs, music, painting, the list goes on. Canadian Law protects all original creative works. Photocopies are copies, we all understand that. Did you know that to display someone's work on your website you need to have permission first. Many patterns will put a note in the pattern indicating what the pattern and items made can be used for.

Basic Blocks, Techniques

Basic blocks, example Drunkards Path, that have been around forever, are not protected under copyright. If a pattern is designed using a variety of basic blocks, then it is protected. A pattern which only uses one block through the whole quilt would not be protected. The same goes for Techniques. A technique showing a new style is not protected. If you produce a video with directions using a binding technique, then it would be protected under Copyright.

Trademark vs Copyright

Copyright is rights for creative works. Trademarks are words, symbols or an element that helps consumers identify a brand. Example: Janome, Pfaff, Schmetz Needles.

Quilting Tips from The Quilted Raven (continued)

Going Forward, what is allowed?

Can I copy a pattern from a friend? – No

Can I use a copy of a pattern a Quilt Store has purchased? - No. - The person who purchases the pattern owns the physical copy, not the contents.

Can I share a link? - Yes

Can I post people's work on my Facebook? - Yes, if you have permission

If you display or sell a Quilt, from a pattern, permission and acknowledgement is required from the Artist.

Thank you to everyone who participated in this year's sale!!!

To those who donated quilted items, to those who donated cash, to those who sold their own items, to those who worked the sale and especially those who organized and set up the sale......a very, very sincere thank you.

All of you were a big part in making this sale one of the best we have had in years.

As this is our major fundraiser for the year it is expected that members contribute in some way. It was amazing to see that 22 members donated quilted items and 17 members donated cash.

That's 39 of our 67 members!!!

Wowza!!!!! That is pretty darn amazing!!

Most items sold were smaller items (i.e., table runners, wall hangings, etc.) but a couple of larger items sold as well. People were definitely in the buying spirit.

For those who may be interested our gross sales of quilted items were **\$7,135.00** the day of the sale.

As of the time of writing this article, the total amount we made from the sale (after additional monetary donations from members were collected and the expenses were paid) is

\$2,488.09

This money raised goes back to the membership for offsetting our costs of the Baker Center rentals, Retreats, Out of Town Teacher expenses, meeting prizes, etc.

Oven Roasted Vegetables

In my family, vegetables are a big part of special occasion dinners such as Christmas dinner. In the past, the vegetables have been boiled but in the last couple of years we have roasted the vegetables. This a basic recipe and there are many more out there for everyday cooking.

Ingredients:

Vegetables:

Bell Peppers – cut into ¾-inch pieces

Zucchini – cut into 3/4-inch pieces

Sweet Potato – cut into ¾ -inch
pieces

Red Onion – cut into about 4 wedges

Broccoli – cut into small rectangular
pieces, and slice florets into pieces
that are about ½ to ¾ -inch thick and
1 ½ to 2-inches wide.

Olive Oil

Dijon Mustard

Italian Seasoning

Spices – a mix of salt, pepper, and garlic powder

Parmesan

Directions:

- 1. Add the oil, mustard, and spices to the cut vegetables.
- 2. Toss to coat.
- 3. Transfer the vegetables to two baking sheets.
- 4. Roast vegetables at 400 degrees F for 25 to 35 minutes, tossing and rotating them halfway through. Finish the Parmesan cheese.
