CHRISTMAS SALE INFORMATION and POLICY

It's that time again!!

Our Christmas Sale (and our biggest source of fundraising for the Guild) will take place on November 25th at Centre Ice Plaza. A poster has been emailed separately. Please, please, circulate it around to your families, friends, co-workers, etc and ask them to share it as well.

The Sale Policy has clearly outlined the parameters for the event. To ensure another successful sale, we will need as many donated items as possible; plus, consignment orders! As noted in the Policy, members may sell up to 30 items provided they have donated an item for the Sale or made a monetary donation of \$30. The preference is that members donate so that we have lots of items for sale.

Like any successful event – we are dependent on volunteers.

Volunteers are needed for:

- 1) Pricing donated items;
- 2) Assisting with set up and intake of consignment items (Friday from 4-8);
- 3) Working the sale on the Saturday 2 hour stints. We will be open for business from 9-3; and of course
- 4) Tearing down the sale and checking out the unsold consignment items following the conclusion of the sale.

Cards, labels, consignment and volunteer sheets will be available at the next meeting, but electronic copies of the consignment sheet will also be sent out via email for those of you (like me) prefer to use the computer to complete them.

CHRISTMAS SALE POLICY

[Approved 27 Feb 2018]

DEFINITIONS

- Quilted means the item should have 3 layers, joined by stitching.
- ➤ **Members** means members of Yellowknife Quilters.

AUTHORITY

- > Prices for donated items are set by a committee of members.
- > The Executive appoints the coordinator of the sale.
- The coordinator may authorize an occasional exception to the guidelines below.

POLICY

- **Each** member is asked to donate one quilted item for the sale. If you cannot donate an item, a monetary donation of \$30 is also appreciated.
- Donated and consignment items must be priced in multiples of \$5.

CONSIGNMENT ITEMS

- Members may sell their own quilted items provided they have donated an item for
- the sale or made a monetary donation of \$30.
- All paperwork must be completed for these items before the sale.
- > Yellowknife Quilters will take a 15% commission on consignment items.
- Consignment items are limited to 30 per member.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2023/24is a Magazine Challenge!

Members wanting to participate in the Challenge are asked to bring a **NON-QUILTING** magazine to the **November** Guild meeting.

The magazines will be mixed up and placed into a box. Participants will be invited to select a magazine without looking.

Once all participants have a magazine, a number will be drawn from a hat. Participants will turn to that page number in their magazine and use that page for inspiration. It could be a word, phrase, colour, image etc. (on that page!) that sparks your inspiration – you decide!

The Rules Are:

- 1. You must use the magazine page for inspiration AND must present the magazine and give a brief statement regarding its inspiration when you reveal your challenge quilt at the June 2024 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 64" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will vote for each of the following three categories:

Categories: Members are eligible to win in <u>one</u> of the following categories:

Small Quilt	<u>Large Quilt</u>	<u>Viewer's Choice</u>
64" to 139" circumference (eg. no smaller than 13" x 19" and no bigger than 29.5" x 40")	140" circumference or larger (eg. 30" x 40" or larger	Most overall votes
Prizes: 1 st place \$75 2 nd place \$50	Prizes: 1 st place \$75 2 nd place \$50	Prize: \$100

In addition to our current projects, I will post a block pattern, color way and instructions on how to complete the block in the monthly newsletters. This will run from the November 2023 newsletter and continue through to the May 2024 newsletter. You are invited to make a block(s) using your fabric stash and bring the completed block to the following meeting or the next month's meeting. These blocks will then be used for future Sharing Gifts projects.

As we are trying to put together many quilts this year due to those affected by the wildfires, the executive may decide to use some of these blocks to meet the requirements for this year's project. Those that are not used will be kept and used for future projects.

November 2023 Quilt Block

Our block pattern for November 2023 is the Beginners Square Star Block.



To support the layout of the blocks in a quilt, I ask that you make two blocks this month (more if you like).

We will be using the Missouri Star Quilt Company's technique to make the block. You can watch the video on YouTube at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DqSW2HBSSes Block construction starts around 2:26 minutes into the video and goes to 16:40 minutes of the video.

Color Way: cream/beige, fall colors (orange, brown, burnt yellow, green, etc.)

What you need:

11 x 5" squares in cream/beige colors (referred to as background in the video)

11 x 5" squares in fall colors

Make a block using the cream/beige colors as the background, then a second block using the fall colors as the background.

Use a scant ¼" seam. Your stitch line should fall just inside the 1/4" line on ruler when measuring the seam allowance.

Step 1.

Lay out 8 cream/beige squares (background) and 1 fall color square (star) in the 9-patch shape - the fall color square goes in the centre of the 9-patch.



Step 2.

Take two of your fall color squares and sub cut into 8 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.



These will be used for the star points. These can be the same color as the centre square or different – your choice.

Step 3.



Draw the diagonal line or press the square Mark the diagonal through each 2 ½" square. diagonally. This will be your sewing line.

Sew the 2 ½" squares to the 5" squares marked with an *.





Place in the top corner and sew down, then trim off the your seam line and press open.



corner ¼" from



Sew a square to the opposite side,



trim and press open



Once all 4 squares are done, add them back into the 9-patch and sew your 9 squares together. Your block should measure 14" x 14".



Now, use the remaining squares to make another block using the fall colors as the background and the beige/cream squares for the star.

I hope you enjoyed making these blocks. Bring them to the November (or December) meeting and show them off! If you're unable to attend the meeting you can have a friend, bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than November 8th for the November meeting and I will pick up and bring to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.



Rhubarb Butter Tarts

Provided by Linda Whitford

Ingredients:

18 tart shells, homemade or commercial

1 ½ cups, rhubarb, cut into ½" (1.3 cm) pieces

3/4 cup brown sugar, lightly packed

½ cup corn syrup

1/4 cup melted butter

1 egg, slightly beaten

1 tsp. vanilla

½ tsp. salt

2 tbsp. rolled oats

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C).
- 2. Divide rhubarb evenly among tart shells.
- 3. Combine sugar, syrup, butter, egg, vanilla, salt and oats. Thoroughly beat the sugar mixture before spooning the sugar mixture over rhubarb, filling each tart 2/3 full.
- 4. Bake for 12-15 minutes. Cool on wire rack.
